Military-Connected Student Welcome and Transition Plan

Eisenhower High School is committed to supporting the unique needs of military-connected students and ensuring that each new arrival experiences a smooth and welcoming transition into our school community. We understand that frequent moves can be challenging, and we intentionally structure our process to provide both immediate guidance and ongoing support.

Upon enrollment, every new military-connected student meets with their grade-level counselor. This meeting allows us to review prior coursework, discuss scheduling needs, and learn about the student's interests, strengths, and any areas where support may be needed. This initial conversation ensures accurate placement and establishes a trusted point of contact for the student from their first day on campus.

Following the counselor meeting, a member of our student leadership team is assigned to personally welcome the new student. The student leader provides a guided tour of the building, introducing them to key locations such as classrooms, administrative offices, the library, cafeteria, and extracurricular areas. During this tour, the student leader also explains school routines, expectations, and traditions, helping the newcomer develop confidence in navigating their day-to-day schedule.

In the days and weeks that follow, student leaders make an effort to check in with the new student to answer questions, offer peer support, and ensure they are adjusting well. These follow-up interactions are an important part of helping the student build connections and feel included in our school culture.
