
# Theatre Arts






## Excelling in T-4

In Vocational Education, students are allowed to specialize in areas of interest such as machine tool, carpentry, culinary arts and plumbing at the United Technologies Center.









# Groups Bound Together


Chorus gives singers the opportunity to train with others, to read and analyze music, and to see how working together can create a single beautiful product.


# National Honor Society


# Golf






# The Challenge of Cheering Met No. Bounds






# AIDS Prevention Targeted By: Peer AIDS Education


