- Student must have a GPA of at least a 3.6 or higher (weighted or unweighted).

Not every candidate who meets the above criteria is guaranteed membership into NHS. All candidates will be evaluated on the basis of service, leadership, and character. The selection of each member to the Wagoner High School Chapter of NHS shall be by majority vote of the faculty council (5 anonymous faculty members appointed by the principal).
