Another exciting moment was receiving our class rings, and telling the Seniors that our's were nicer than theirs."

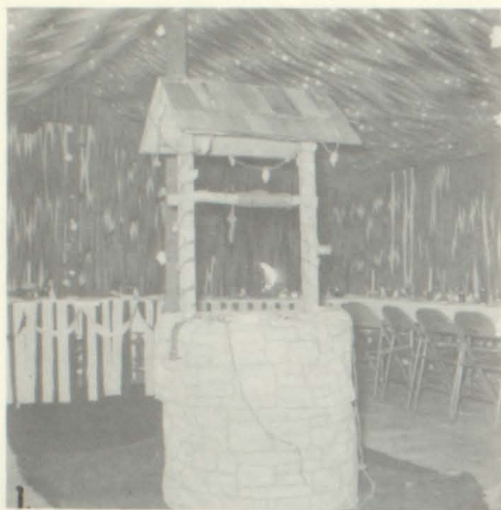
