Student Accolades

▲ Khrystina Warnstadt (Class of 2015) auditioned and was chosen to sing in the All-National Honor Choir in Nashville, TN. Each year Greenville sends students to All-County ensembles. If a student scores very well on their NYSSMA solo audition, they can attend the Area All-State ensembles, comprised of top student musicians in the Capital District. If a student consistently scores very highly they can be chosen to participate in All-State ensembles, held in Rochester. Khrystina was chosen for All-State last year and was invited to audition for the All-National Choir. The All-National honor ensembles were chosen from over 1,200 All-State applicants across the United States and Khrystina was one of only 49 student musicians in the country chosen for her voice part. This is an unprecedented honor for Greenville, or any other school in the area. Her Honor Choir concert will be on October 29th at the Grand Ole Opry House, the same stage where nearly every notable country music artist has played. During the week of August 11th, members of the Greenville FFA Chapter attended the New York State Fair in Syracuse, NY to participate in state level skills-based Career Development Events (CDEs). Members competed in Nursery Landscaping, Livestock Judging and Equine Judging CDEs.

In the Jr. Nursery Landscaping CDE Bergen Criswell placed 3rd, Aaron Smith placed 5th and Natalie Krasney placed 6th, leading to a 2nd place team finish.

In the Jr. Livestock Judging CDE Baillie Kappel placed 1st, Emily Connolly placed 9th and Willo Sutton placed 11th for a 1st place team finish.

In the Jr. Equine Judging CDE Natalie Krasney placed 2nd, Emily Connolly placed 3rd, Declan Black placed 4th and Willo Sutton placed 5th for a 1st place team finish.

In the Sr. Livestock Judging CDE Valerie Lewis placed 3rd and Carley Estep placed 7th. Seamus Kappel and Grace Chesbro rounded out the team with scores high enough to earn the team 2nd place in the state. The Sr. Livestock team moves on to compete against other states in the Northeastern Region at the Eastern States Exposition on September 12th.

Benches and Hay wagons—Erin DuBois

As a new school year is underway, it is an opportune time to highlight some of the happenings at the end of the 2013-2014 school year, where students enrolled in the Greenville Central High School Construction Technology and Management class, taught by Mr. Cunnan, participated in a number of community service projects.

Several class members worked on restoring two benches for the Potter Hollow school house.

The benches, which had originally been donated to the school house, had deteriorated badly. The students first cleaned and then painted the wrought iron ends. Since the slats comprising the bench seat were no longer useable, new ones were cut and attached. To provide additional support that was not part of the original design, three extra steel bars were added to strengthen the seat. The new slats were given several coats of protective water proofing.

The construction class also partnered with students in the Scott M. Ellis mentoring program to build three benches for the elementary playground. The high school students provided the know-how and the skills, while the elementary students offered extra hands when such assistance was needed. The mentoring students, who were supervised Mr. Volmar, volunteer, learned a great deal about construction engineering. Funds for the purchase of material were provided the Scott M. Ellis PTA.

Using their experience constructing benches, the construction class built four benches for the Scott M. Ellis Lunch Thyme Garden program which was in its second year. Funds for these benches were provided by an anonymous donor. These benches have already been used by the volunteers working in the garden.

Another project involved the hayride wagon which had been built by Friends of the Greenville FFA last year with money donated by the Friends of the FFA and Caring Kids, the elementary student council.

The wagon needed a bit of sprucing up, so Mr. Cunnan's students removed the old wheels, discarded the old tires and replaced them with newer ones. They also scraped the old layers of paint from the rims and re-painted them with the school colors - maroon and white.

The following students were actively involved in constructing the benches and painting the wagon wheels: Carl McQuade, Ryan Mulholland, Adrian McAneny, Liam Connors, William Lyman-Schreiweis and Vincent Schipano. Chris Stoddard, Nick Staley, Austin Muntz, and Cormac Tolan worked on constructing the benches as well.

On tap for the current school year are two additional projects. With funds provided by the Greenville Educational Foundation, the construction class will be building four more benches to be used by the elementary students. The physical education teachers at Scott M. Ellis had requested these benches be constructed for use by students when they are not able to participate in physical education class.
