Missing or Late Work:

High School - Zero Missing Work - report pulled on Wednesday mornings - No SRB for HS on Thursdays if no missing work – beginning second week of school (August 28). Junior High – Zero Missing work- incentive days for no missing work.

Late work or missing assignments beyond 5 school days will count for no more than 60%. **Assessments will not be docketed, however,** teachers will enforce strict completion dates – Teachers may use Admin for ISS or detention for completion if this is delayed.

Thank you for your interest in the Off the Fridge program at the Washington Pavilion. We look forward to displaying your students' artwork!

The Washington Pavilion will supply:

- 1) **Exhibition space:** 47-60 frames on the second floor lobby of the Washington Pavilion dedicated to Off the Fridge. *All frames stay at the Washington Pavilion.*
- 2) **Matting:** Artwork will be *mounted* to tag board and returned to the artist following the exhibition.
- 3) **Gallery text labels:** Card stock labels will be given to the artist at the end of the exhibition.
- 4) **Certificate for each student**
- 5) **Free Washington Pavilion admission ticket to each artist**

Your school will supply:

- 1) **Original, two-dimensional artwork:** The maximum number of pieces that can be submitted is 60. Each teacher must follow the size and orientation guidelines listed below to ensure accurate presentation of the artwork.
 - a. 23 pieces – horizontal orientation (pieces smaller than 12 x18 can fit in either vertical or horizontal frame)
 - b. 24 pieces – vertical orientation (pieces smaller than 12 x18 can fit in either vertical or horizontal frame)
 - c. (Optional) 13 pieces – either vertical OR horizontal orientation
 - d. 18" x 24" or smaller
 - e. Names must be listed on the artwork – Please use a note with the child's name (and title if child has more than one piece) and attach to back of the piece.

*Note: In an effort to highlight each artist, every child's artwork will be presented individually within the frame. In this spirit, we will not accept additional artwork above and beyond the numbers listed here. **The maximum number of pieces that are allowed to be submitted is 60.***

Artwork must be delivered to the Washington Pavilion box office desk no later than **five business days** before the exhibit start date to ensure there is time for installation. We will contact you at the end of your exhibition when the artwork is ready for pick up. The Washington Pavilion reserves the right to not exhibit works of art in the show that could be interpreted as inappropriate based on public school guidelines.

- 2) **Master label list.** Labels must be submitted electronically. We will format the labels, you just need to fill in the Excel document and email it back. Please make sure to double check the accuracy of your spelling to

ensure professionalism of the labels in your exhibition. Email label information to:

Tips for the labels:

- Use first name only. Please make sure each name is accurately spelled.
- Let the child title their own work.
- Let students write their own artist statements.
 - For pre-writers, meet with the child and let them tell you about their piece, and write it down just as they say.
 - The content of the artist's statement can be anything the child wants to say about the work. Let the artist talk/write in their own words. The writing is an extension of the project and of their innate creativity.
 - The statement reflects the artist and his/her art, not necessarily the project, teacher or school.
 - Edit spellings only if necessary. Avoid editing the child's choice of words or interpretation.
 - One of the appealing parts of the "Off the Fridge" exhibit is reading the unique things kids say about their art. Even if it is just a sentence or phrase, we hope you make the time to collect these statements from your artists!

Off the Fridge Reception

If you would like to have an artist reception for your students, please let our education staff know so a date can be set in advance.
