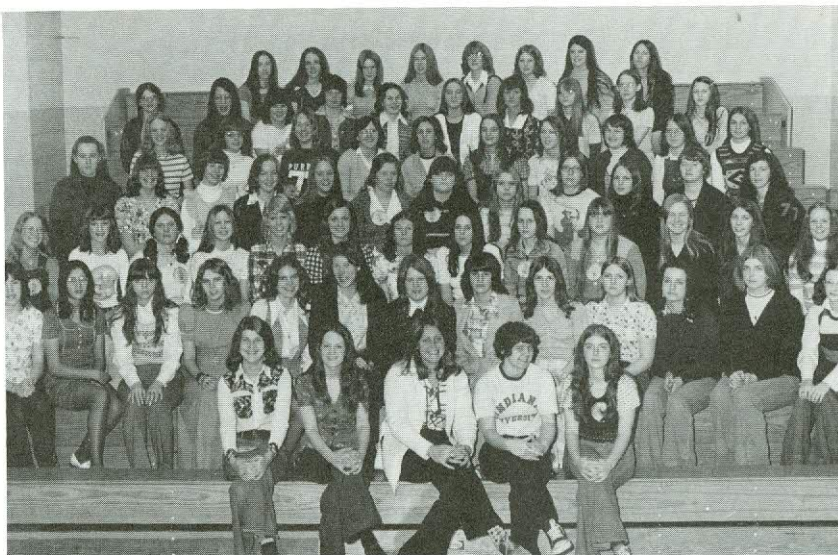

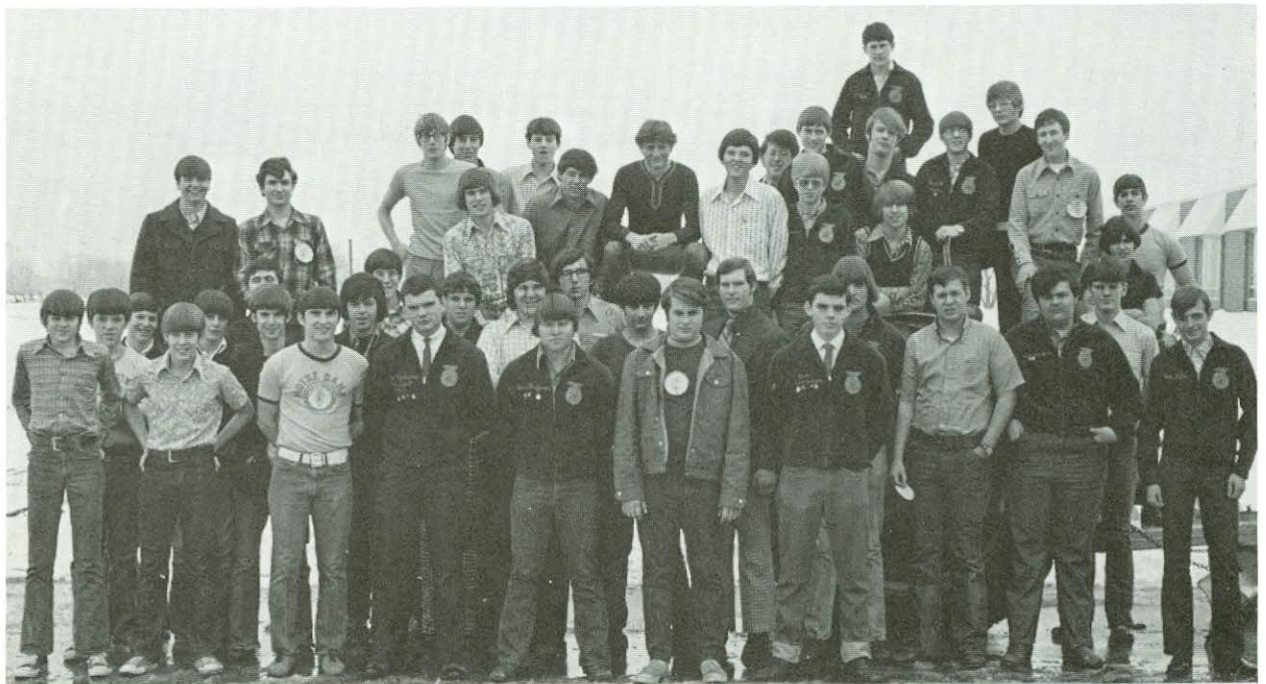
Auctioning themselves off at their October Slave Sale, the boys promoted FFA by doing community service projects. Then, to break away from their work schedule, the guys held their own hayride.

With the band the class floats and the court paraded before the fans on game night.

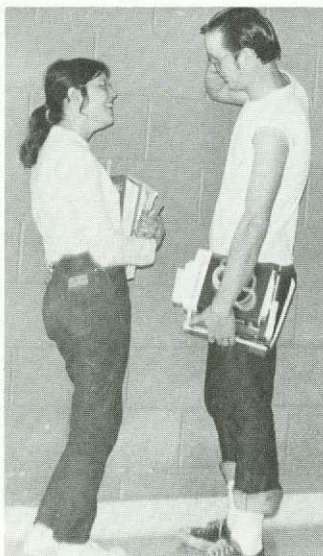
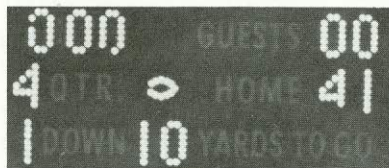

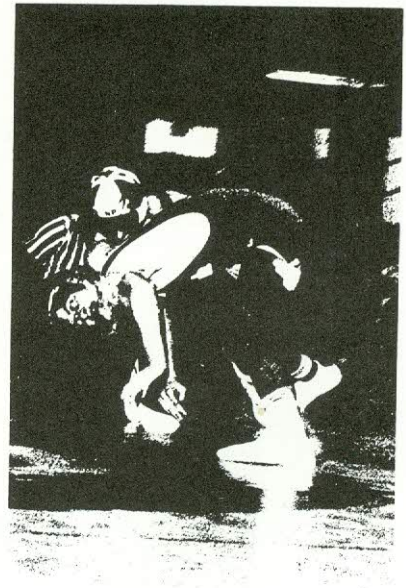
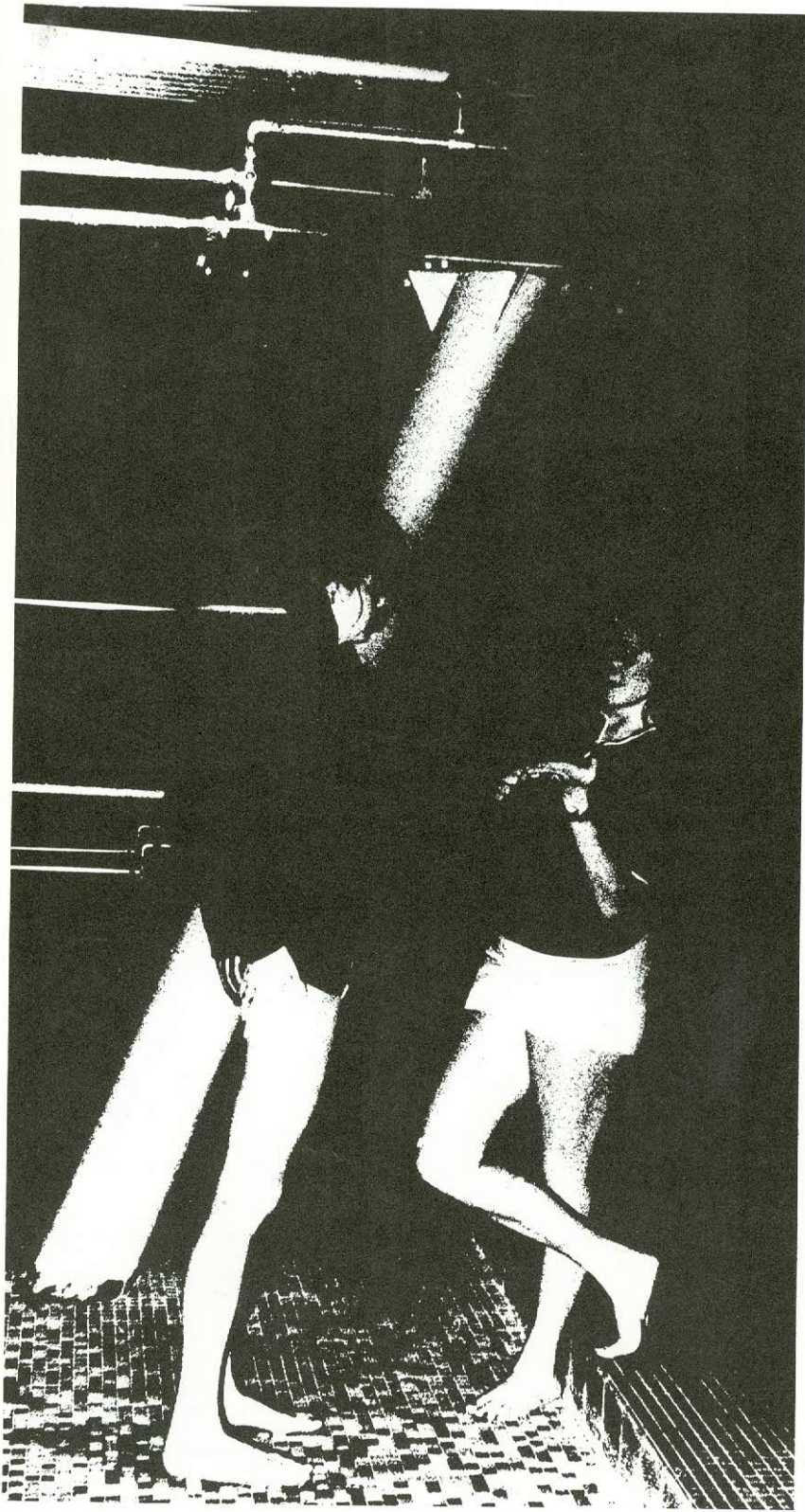
"I'VE GOT PIECES OF APRIL"

The 74-75 Cougars shared the honor of conference champions with Edgewood placing Mark Hess and Jim Brothers on the all-conference team. The Cougars started their long list of accomplishments by defeating Rockville 31 points, only to be beaten twice at the hands of Turkey Run and Lebanon. Coach Sharp's team entered the County Tourney with a 5-2 record. Included in the win column was a hard-fought, well-earned nipping of Crawfordsville, the first since the two teams have been competing.

North Putnam drew Cloverdale for the opening game of the County Tourney and handed the Clovers a 24 point loss. The championship games of both JV and Varsity were North vs South. South Putnam defeated North Put's JV, but the Varsity turned the tide clipping the Eagles 81-45, thus bringing home their first County Championship.

After a depressing defeat at Edgewood the Cougars vowed the three losses would not be raised. The Cougars proved their reliability, remaining undefeated right up to the sectional.

The Cougars gave the school a new record of 20 wins and 4 losses, plus a happy community of proud fans.

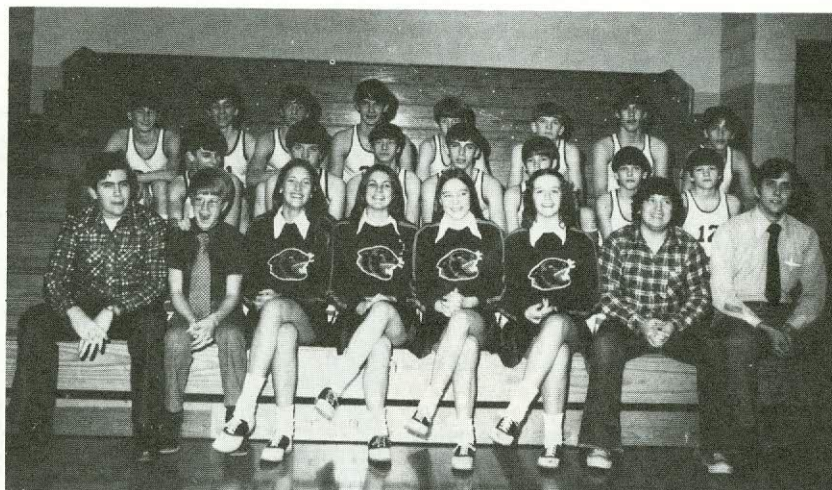

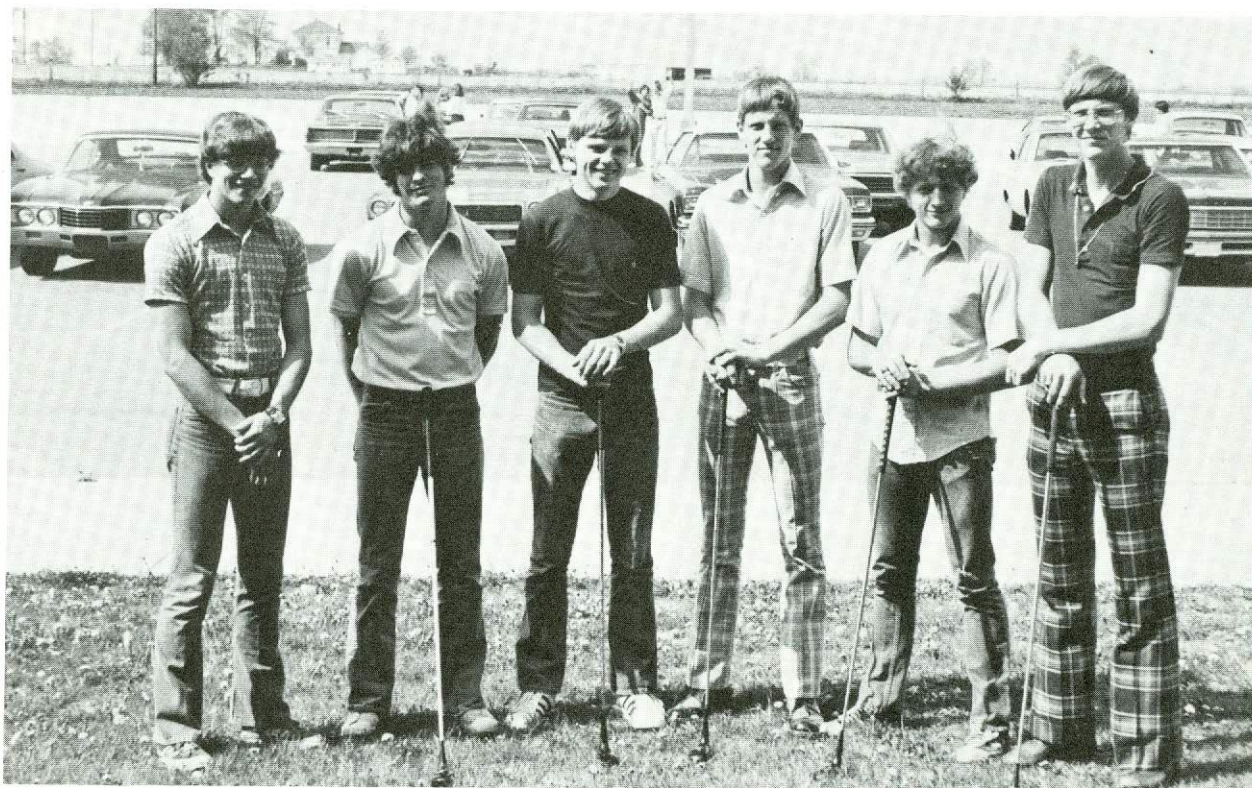

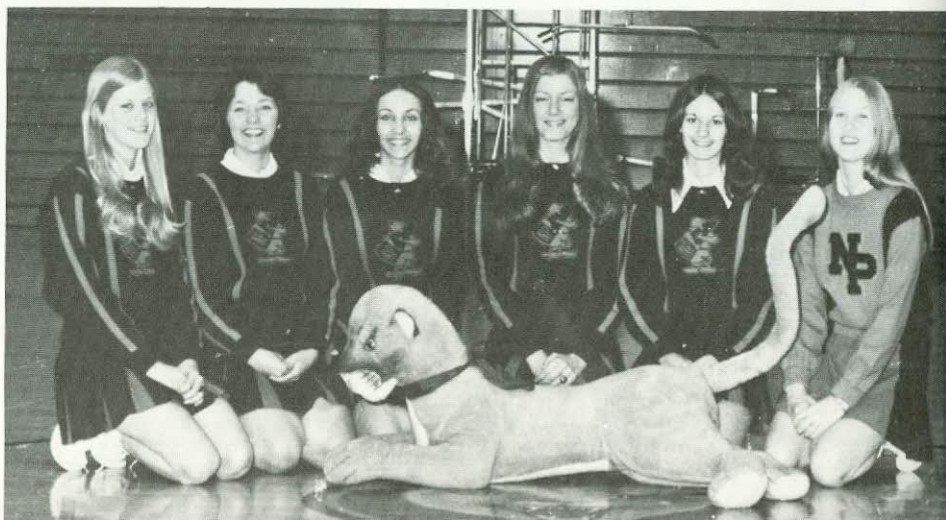
CHEERLEADERS IGNITE ENTHUSIASM IN SPORTS FANS

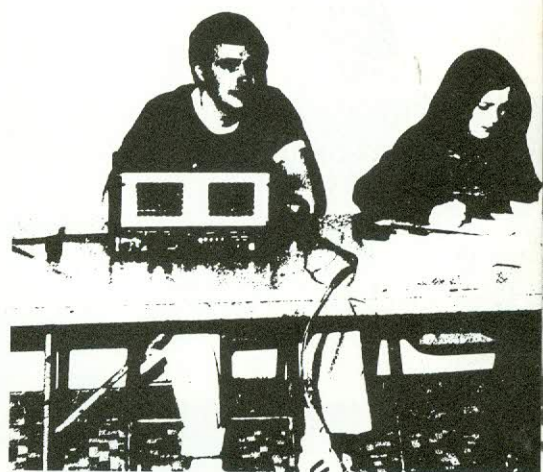

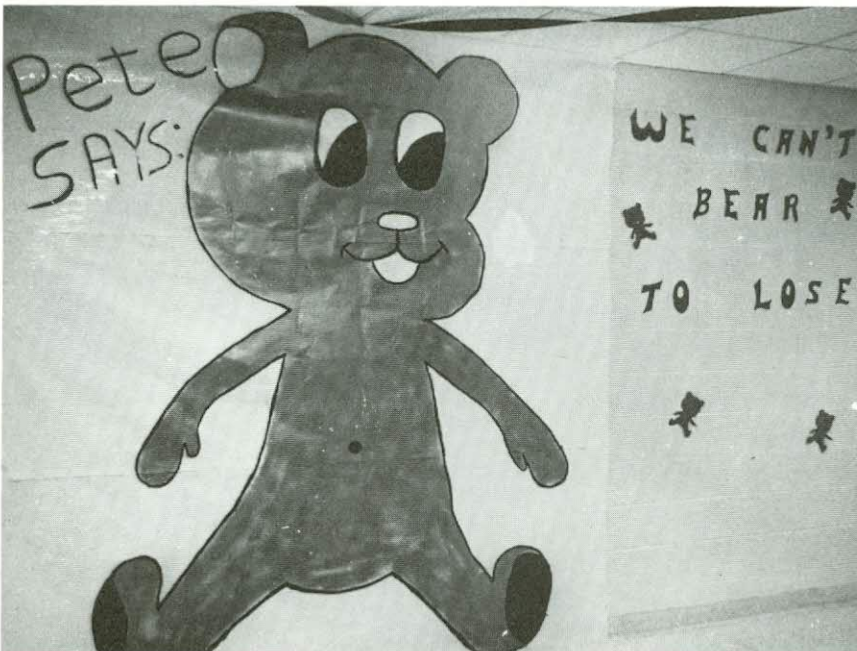
