The Selkirk Consolidated School District proudly serves the close-knit communities of Ione, Metaline, and Metaline Falls in northeast Washington.

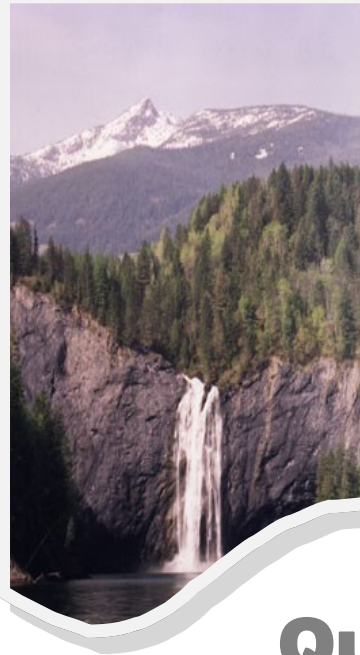

During the 2019–2020 school year, the district had an average K–12 enrollment of approximately 260 students, allowing for a personalized and community-focused educational experience.

Nestled in a picturesque valley of the Selkirk Mountains, the district is bordered by Canada to the north and Idaho to the east, with the scenic Pend Oreille River running through the region.
