Meet the Bus Drivers

Selkirk bus drivers have a long history of safe driving. We are grateful to have drivers who focus on safety. The five above also drive out-of-town trips and have transported students all around the region as well as across the state.

While this is a job that takes all day, often beginning at 6:00 a.m. and ending at 4:30 or 5:00 p.m. and even into the wee a.m. hours, their shifts are split in 1-3 hour driving chunks. Some drivers are able to fill in with other vocations (*anyone need a haircut from ChrisCuts or a meeting with Pastor Krabbenhoft?*) but others make do with split shifts and extra athletic or field trips as much as possible.

Why am I sharing this “not so rosy” vision of a bus driver’s job? Well, I am just hoping to convey why I have such a deep appreciation for people who are willing to transport our children safely to/from school

and to their fieldtrips and athletic events, often spending their entire day doing so. Parents go to away events to watch their children. Our drivers go, so the students can participate. The bottom line...our drivers like kids and want to help. They are not in this job for the great hours. So, next time you have a chance to talk to your child’s bus driver, please take a minute to thank them and remind your child to ride the bus just like they would ride in your car, with inside voices, appropriate language, and continually seated! 2017 MS/HS Water Test Results

The Washington State Department of Health requires all public water systems to perform periodic tests on their drinking water. In 2017, the drinking water at the high school was tested for Volatile Organic Chemicals (VOC’s), nitrate, lead and copper. The test for VOC’s checked sixty one chemical compounds. *All of the VOC test results were well below the trigger levels.* Below are the test results for nitrate, lead and copper. A mg/L is equivalent to a part per million.

2017 Annual Public Notice Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA)

In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Act (AHERA), Selkirk School District contracted with Educational Service District 101 of Spokane, Washington to conduct the Three-Year Asbestos Reinspection of all school buildings. During November 2015, an EPA accredited asbestos Inspector and Management Planner performed the required inspection, reassessed each category of asbestos containing building materials (ACBM) and noted any significant changes from the 1989, 1992, 1995, 1998, 2001, 2004, 2007, 2010 and 2013 inspections. Reinspection will assist the school district in the process of safely managing each ACBM within our district. A 2015 inspection was made to put us on the same schedule at the other two school districts in the county and forward inspections will continue to be every three years. As a result of the 2015 AHERA 2-year reinspection the following known or assumed asbestos containing building materials (ACBMs) have been identified in the following buildings. All ACBM listed below were found to be in good condition and are being continually maintained in accordance with all Washington State and Federal laws.

- Old Selkirk District Office: Linoleum (bathrooms, office, kitchen, closets, storage room)

Pesticide Notification, Posting, and Record Keeping

The Selkirk School District Board of Directors’ Policy # 6985 governs the use of pesticides on school grounds and in school facilities for the following pests: bees, wasps, hornets, ants, lice, weeds, and rodents.

Notification of use of pesticides will be posted for 24 hours after use of the application and 48 hours prior to the application. However, if the site is unoccupied by students and staff for two consecutive days after application, then pre-notification will not be made. All notifications will contain the following information:

- Product name
- Date & Time of application
- Location where applied
- Pest to be controlled
- Contact information

Notifications will be placed in the main office of each building where the application occurred. The district will also maintain a registry of interested persons wishing to be notified by email of pesticide applications. Please contact the district office at the number below if you wish to be included on the registry. A copy of the district’s policy or of the annual reporting of all pesticide applications can be accessed by contacting the district office at (509) 446-2951 or by emailing dmathews@selkirk.k12.wa.us and requesting a copy. Principal Intern's Report

At the elementary school both students and staff have been busy adjusting to the four-day school week. The new schedule has brought positive change in our district. One of the areas we hoped to see improvement in with the four-day week was attendance, and this has proven to be true. Both student and staff attendance has increased with the new schedule.

Another advantage to the four-day school week is that it gives all district staff the opportunity to meet as a whole group for professional development one Friday a month. At the elementary school we have devoted this time to aligning our curriculum with the Common Core State Standards as well as with our standards based report card and across grade levels in order to deliver the strongest content possible to our students. We also spent one Friday afternoon receiving whole district technology training and getting up-to-date on the latest in Google Classroom. Professional Development Fridays are quickly becoming yet another positive advantage to the new four-day schedule.

We are thankful to the Selkirk Community for supporting the new schedule and are also grateful to be part of a district that puts students first.

Amanda Burnett, our fourth grade teacher is working on a masters degree program in School Administration through Washington Statue University. She is completing internship activities this school year under the mentorship of Larry Reed and Nancy Lotze.

Lunch Room Makeover

Over the summer, new cafeteria tables and chairs were ordered. The tables seat 8 and are similar to the high school configuration, although 1st and 2nd grade tables are shorter with smaller chairs so students can put their feet on the ground. Lunchtime in an elementary school is a loud and chaotic event, generally filled with spills and students sliding along adult-size benches (or under them) in an effort to play with their friends. Two year ago, we moved kindergarten students to small rectangular tables and chairs. With their feet on the ground and fewer students at the table, we discovered that the kindergartners spilled less, ate more and were generally quieter in their conversation. We decided to extend that setting to all students in grades K-5. We have noticed fewer spills, more food eaten, and a quieter lunchroom....although quiet is a relative term with 120 children in one room!

Spokane Symphony

On October 25th the 4th grade went on their annual field trip to the Spokane Symphony thanks to funding from Selkirk Humanities Foundation. The concert is made available to all fourth grade students in the Inland Northwest. While in Spokane they also took in the Mobius Science Center.
