Big Picture



Why have a Truth in Taxation Meeting?

- **Truth in Taxation Law, passed in 1989**
- **Two major requirements:**
 - 1. Tax Statements**

Counties must send out proposed property tax statements in November based on preliminary tax levies set by all taxing jurisdictions (counties, cities, townships, school districts, etc.)
 - 2. Public Hearing**

Most taxing jurisdictions must hold a public hearing prior to certifying the final levy and discuss:

 - Payable 2021 levy
 - Fiscal year 2021 budget
 - Public comments

**This is the school district's
annual required hearing**



Who sets the School Levy?

Components of a District Tax Levy are either:

- **Set By State Formula By Legislature**
 - General Education Formula, Operating Capital, Career & Technical, Reemployment, etc.
- **Voter Approved as Authorized by the State**
 - Operating Referendum or Building Bonds



How is my property tax determined?

- County Assessor determines market value for each parcel of property.
- MN Legislature sets formulas for Tax Capacity. These formulas determine how the tax burden is split on different types of property (residential, commercial, ag, etc.).
- County Auditor calculates the tax capacity for each parcel based on the above.
- County Auditor divides the total levy by total tax capacity of the District to determine tax rate needed. Tax rate is multiplied by each property's tax capacity*.

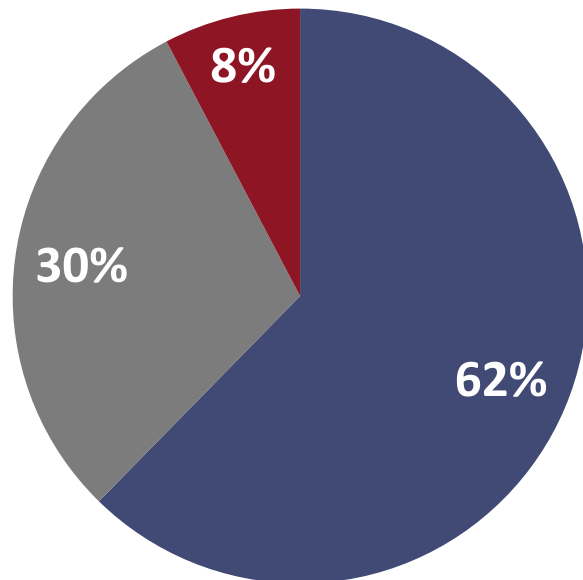
*Certain levies are spread based on Market Value rather than tax capacity.



State Aid Impact

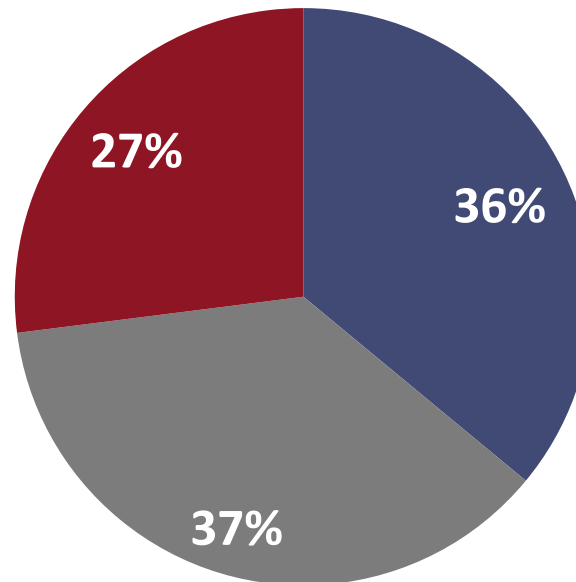

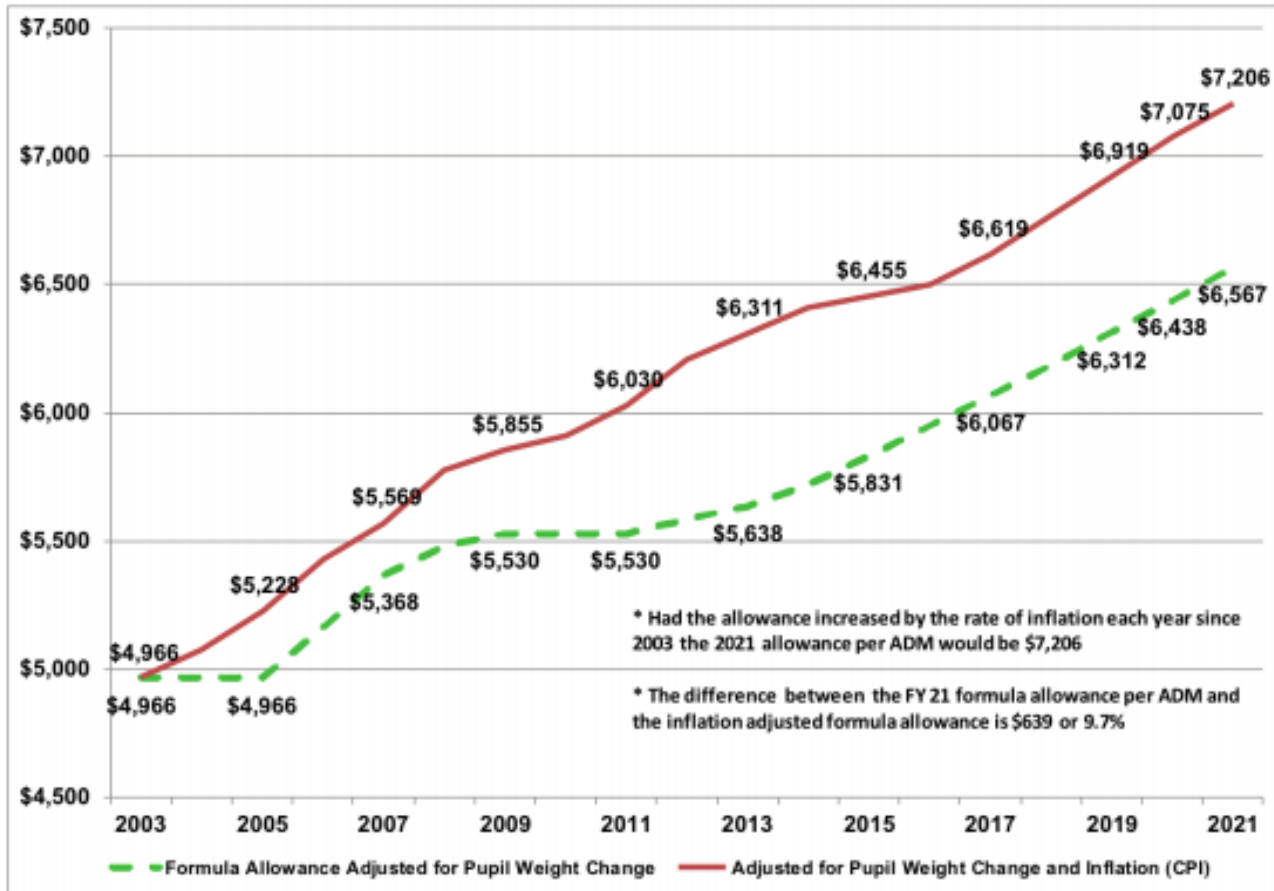

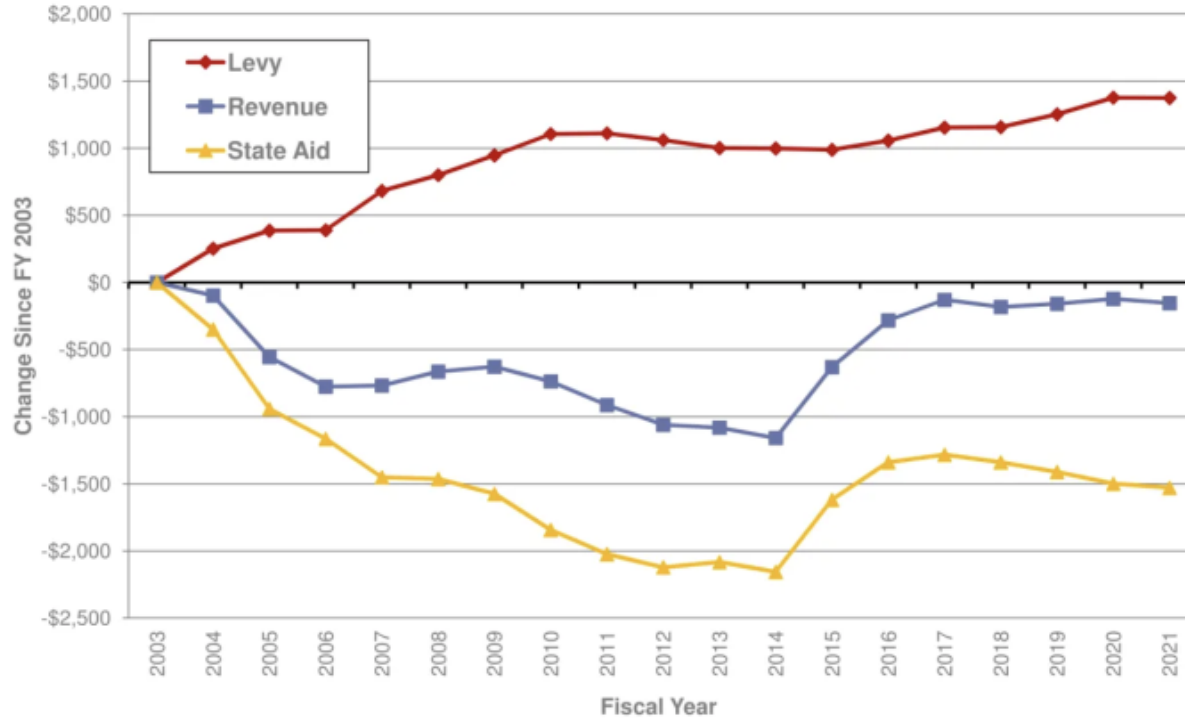

Constant FY 2020 Dollars Per Pupil



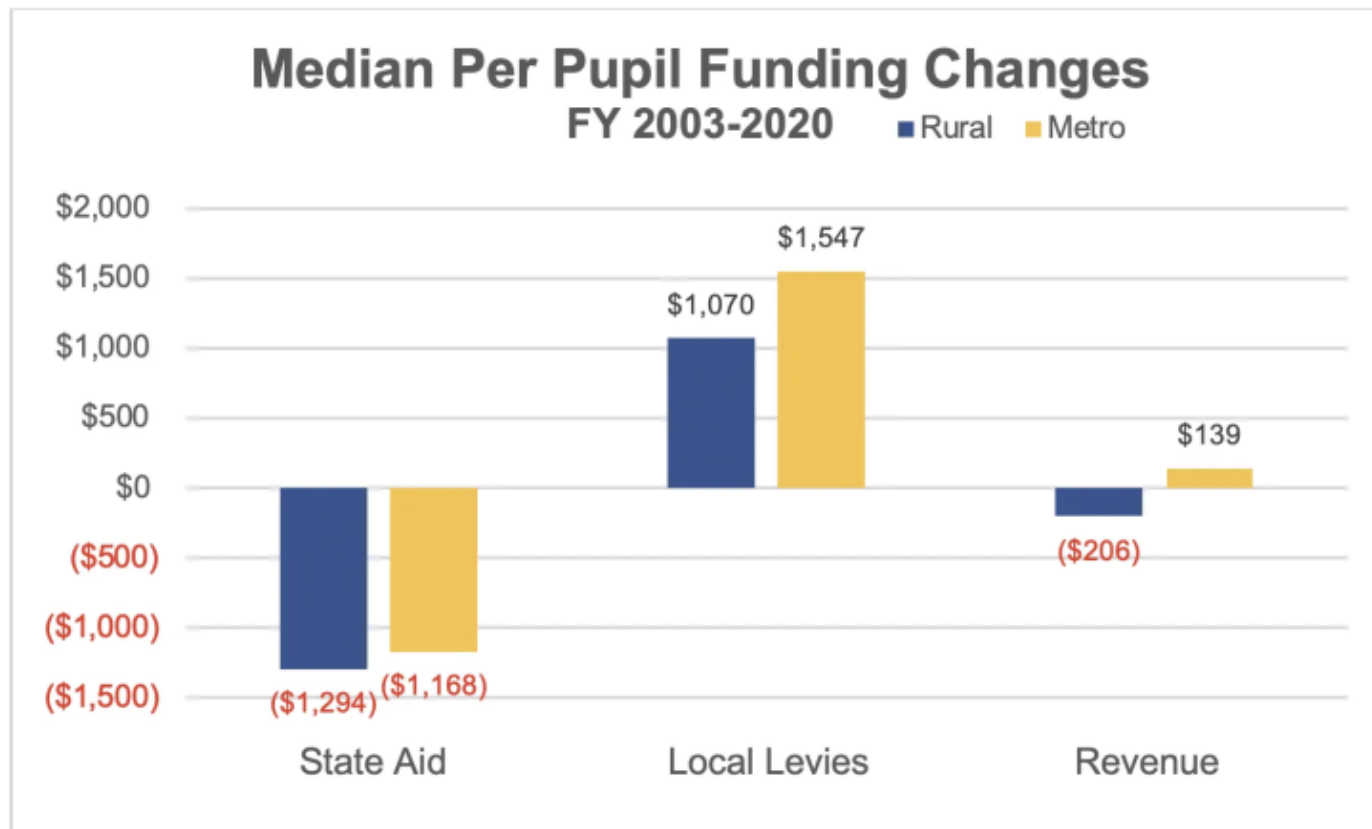

More metro districts were able to **replace lost formula aid** than rural school districts in Minnesota.

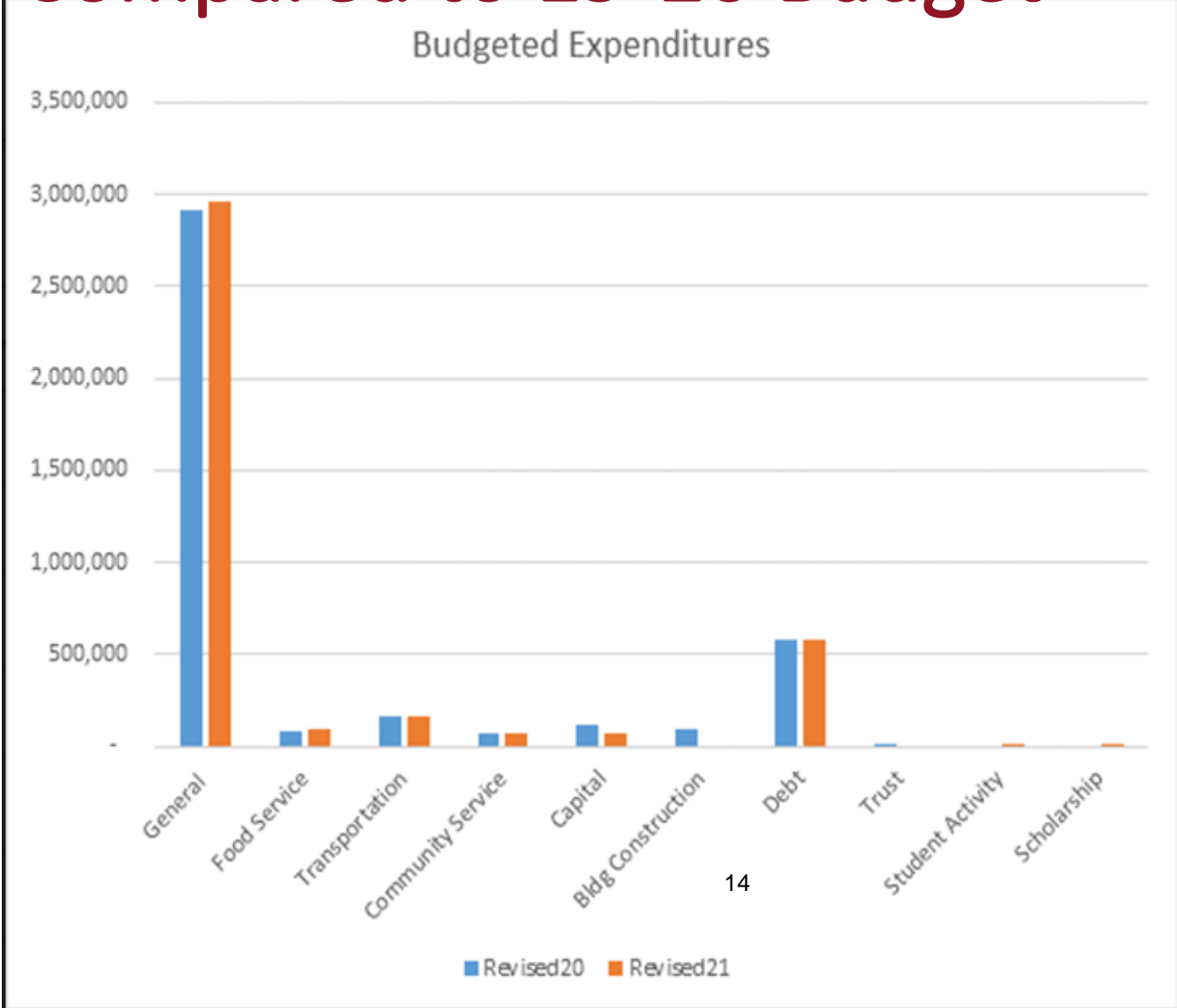

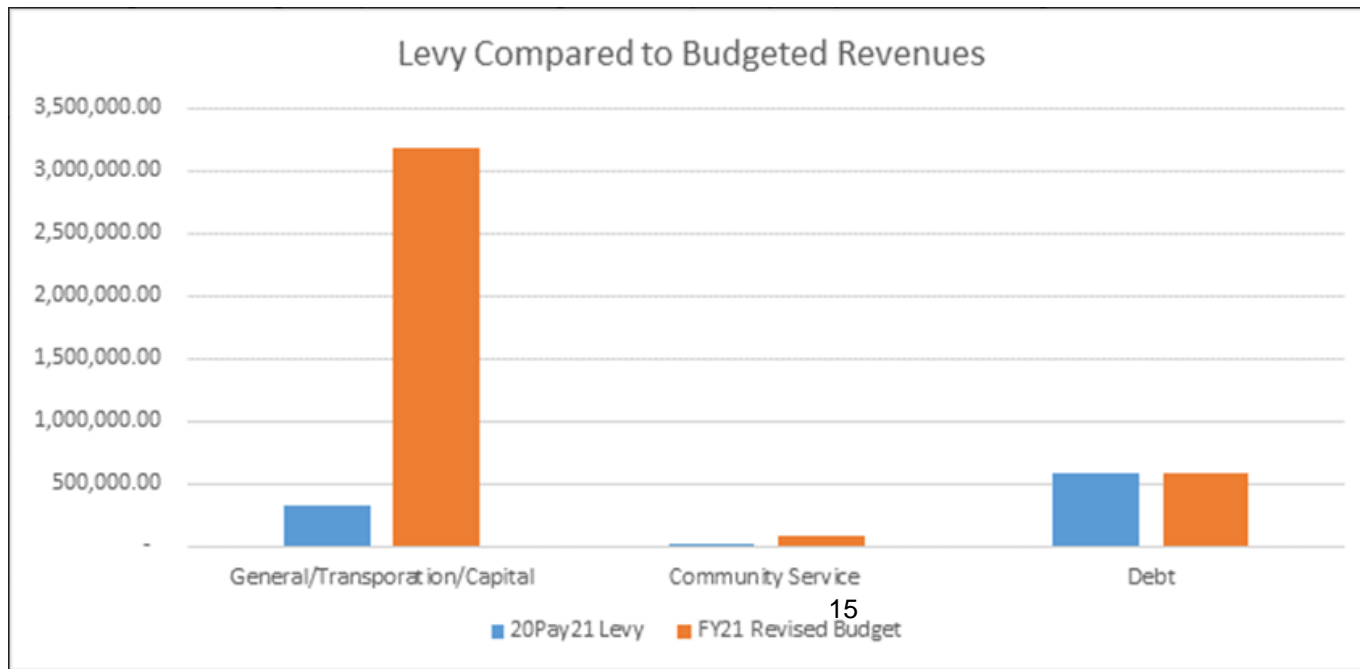


20-21 School Year Budget Compared to 19-20 Budget

Ag2School Tax Credit

- Permanent law enacted in 2017
- Affects all existing Fund 7 debt levies, except OPEB bonds
- Reductions for farmers and timber owners
- Scheduled to scale to 70% in 2023
- The revenue for Ag2School comes from state income, sales and other tax revenue

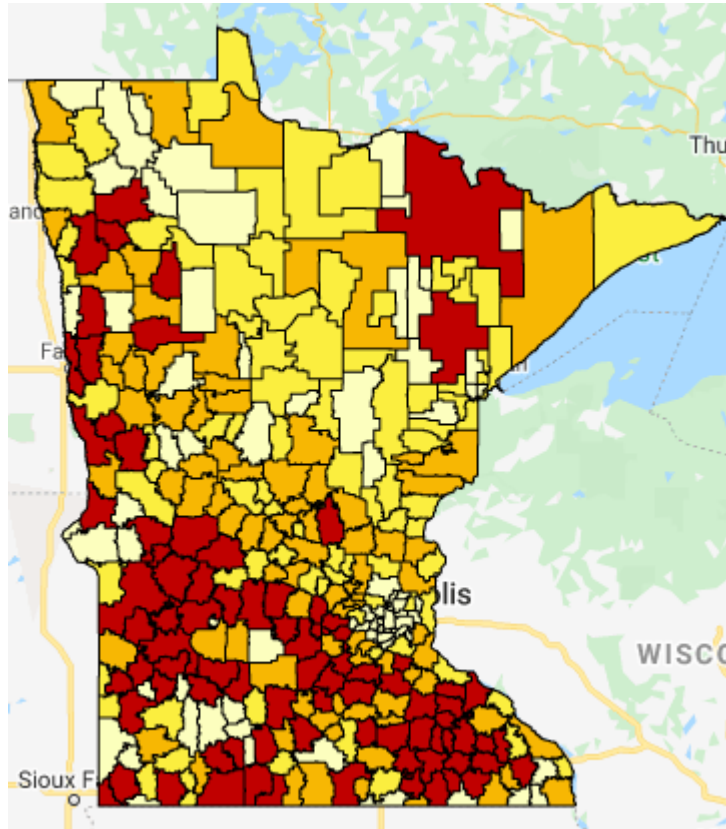


Ag2School in 2021

School Factors Affecting Pay '21 Levies

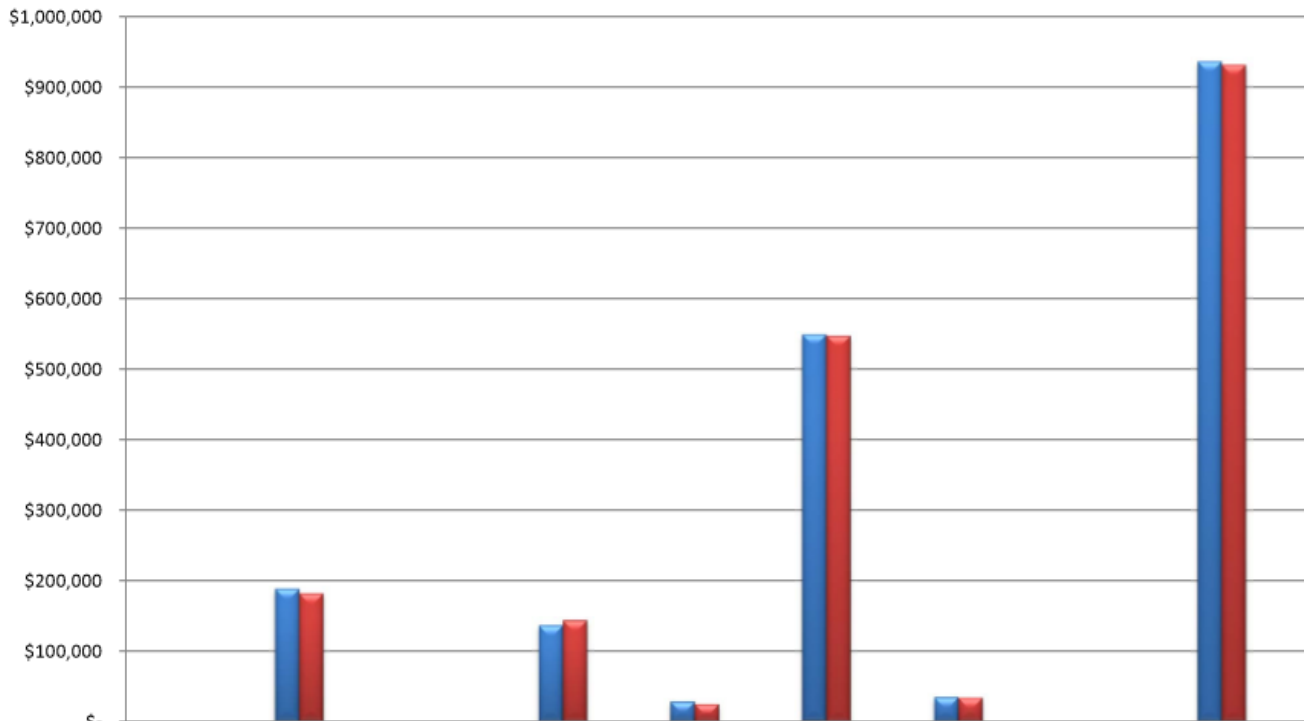

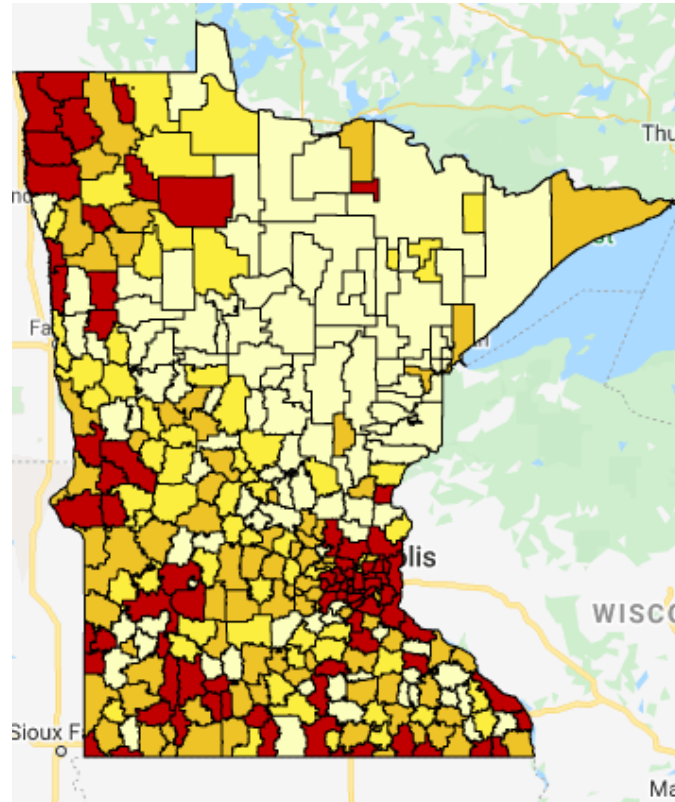

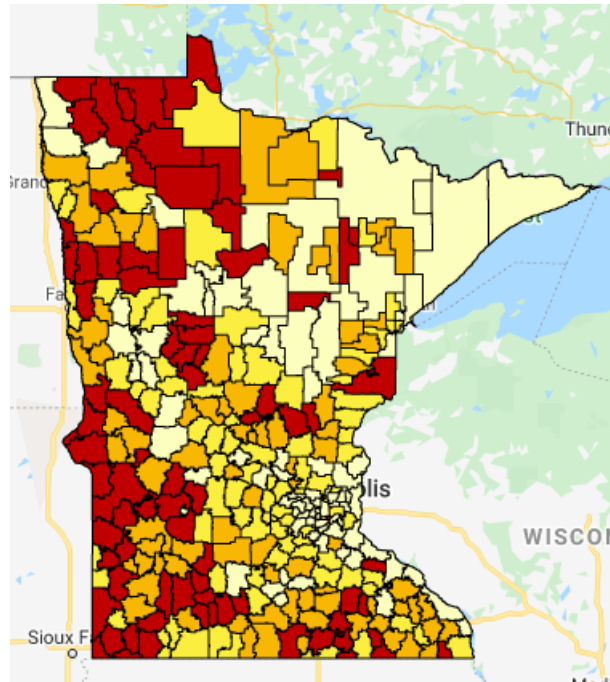

The Board of Education of Independent School District No. 698 met in regular session on Monday, November 30, 2020 in the media center. Google Meet option was also available for the public. Member Myles served as Acting Clerk. Chair Hall called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

Board members present at roll call were: Jaimen Davis, Steve Hall, Tracy Hutchinson, Tim Myles, and Justin Ruzynski. Also present: Superintendent/Principal Dr. Rae Villebrun, Business Manager Teresa Hart, and Administrative Assistant Lois Persons.

Motion by Hutchinson, seconded by Davis, to approve the agenda. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

The in-person and virtual audience members were recognized.

The FY20 audit report was presented by Mary Reedy, CPA, CGFM of CliftonLarsonAllen LLP showing no findings (“clean opinion”) in all areas. Motion by Hutchinson, seconded by Myles, to approve the audit report as presented, all of which may be found in the district office. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Motion by Myles, seconded by Hutchinson, to approve the Consent Agenda including the following agenda items: Minutes of the 10/26/20 regular meeting and 11/12/20 special meeting; acknowledgment of certificate regarding no contest of regular and special elections held on 11/3/20; approval of Teacher and Local 70 Seniority Lists as presented; .2FTE contract for Justin Sundquist, ECSE teacher paid on an hourly rate as needed; FMLA leave request for Donald Olesiak, effective when a long-term substitute is available and ends the start of the FY22 school year; FY21 Schedule C contracts for the following basketball coaches: Adam Schminski, Head Girls and Jarred Heggedahl, Asst. Girls; final reading and adoption of changes to Policy 522-Student Sex Nondiscrimination; annual review of policies (with no changes): 410-Family and Medical Leave, 413-Harassment and Violence, 415-Mandated Reporting of Maltreatment of Vulnerable Adults, 514-Bullying Prohibition.. Motion carried with unanimous voice vote with Hall abstaining due to relationship of coach contract.

Amanda Fjeld’s Instructional/Behavioral Coach, Frank Bartsch’s Activities Director, and Jaimen Davis’ Community Education/Communications Director reports were reviewed.

Dr. Villebrun’s Superintendent report included an update on VIBE boards purchased for the elementary and Smart TVs for the high school to replace outdated equipment with COVID grants; production of the new solar panels; a new Gifted and Talented Program for qualifying 5th grade students; virtual meetings attended; upcoming school board training, etc.

Members were asked to choose their top 2021 committee membership preferences by December 7th. The January 2021 Leadership Conference details were reviewed.

Motion by Davis, seconded by Myles, to adopt the updates to the Restart Plan as presented. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Motion by Myles, seconded by Davis, to approve the monthly claims and accounts for October 2020 (payroll totaling \$176,387.87, AP totaling \$207,915.37, Cash Flow dated October 31, 2020) all of which may be found in the official district minute book. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

The long term vision of the district was discussed in regards to the third failed referendum and how to get information to the outer edges of the district. The voter response within the City of Floodwood was significantly more supportive than the surrounding areas. The 2021 special election timeline was reviewed. Calling for another special election will be delayed in order for SitelogiQ to have time to organize community conversations to see what the community wants and what they will support. The district has entered into an agreement with SitelogiQ to facilitate the long-term facility maintenance plan and to update the expiring Strategic Plan. In the meantime, Superintendent Villebrun will be having conversations with the area schools to see what consolidation would look like should it come to that.

Discussion took place on the process to fill the vacant seat unfilled by Deb Torvick. Torvick received the third highest number of votes for the three positions with four year terms on the ballot in the November 2020 election. Torvick withdrew after ballots were printed and distributed. Applications for school board appointment will be taken until December 8th and an appointment is expected to be made at the next regular school board meeting on December 14th.

Motion by Ruzynski, seconded by Myles, to approve the FY20 assignment sheet for Jaimen Davis, Community Ed/Communications Director. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote with Davis abstaining.

Motion by Ruzynski, seconded by Hutchinson, to approve the FY21 assignment sheet for Molli Heggedahl, Van Driver. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Motion by Ruzynski, seconded by Davis, to approve the FY21 assignment sheet for Dakoda Durovec, Snow/Ice Removal Operator. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Motion by Davis, seconded by Hutchinson, to acknowledge and commend the recent retirees for their service and dedication to Floodwood School: Sherilee Prusi, Pam Rahja, Shannon Ralidak, Sue Vance, and Deb Torvick. Board Members Tim Myles and Justin Ruzynski were also acknowledged for their years of service. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Upcoming meetings were announced.

OUT OF FIELD PERMISSIONS CONTRACT FOR MINNESOTA PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS

The School Board of Independent School District No. 698 of the State of Minnesota, Floodwood, Minnesota, enters into this Contract with **Misty Waldron**, a legally qualified Academic and Behavioral Strategist Teacher via Out of Field Permission pursuant to M.S. 122A.182 who agrees to teach in the public schools of said District as a **Special Education Teacher** for the school year **FY21 to FY22**.

The following provisions shall apply and are a part of this Contract:

1. **Basic Services:** Said teacher shall faithfully perform the services prescribed by the School Board, or its designated representative(s), whether or not such services are specifically described in this Contract, abide by the rules and regulations as established by the School Board and the State of Minnesota, and any additions or amendments thereto, for the annual salary indicated below, and agrees to teach for the School District as assigned in such grades or subjects for which the teacher has the necessary license.
2. **Duration:** The duration of this contract shall be from **July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2022**. This Contract is subject to the provisions of M.S. 122A.182 and to all laws, rules, and regulations of the State of Minnesota relevant to qualification, licensure, employment, termination, and discharge of teachers for cause. This Contract may be terminated by the School Board, ended by written resignation by the teacher, or modified by mutual consent of the School Board and the teacher.
3. **Duty Year:** The teacher's duty year shall be as adopted by the School Board, and the teacher agrees to teach on those legal holidays on which the School Board is authorized to conduct school if the School Board so determines. In the event a duty day is lost due to any emergency, the teacher agrees to perform duties on such other day in lieu thereof as determined by the School Board.
4. **Additional Services:** The School Board, or its designated representative(s), may assign the teacher to extra-curricular, co-curricular, or other assignments, subject to established compensation for such services that exceed the services authorized in paragraph 1. Said extra-curricular, co-curricular, or other assignments may be described in paragraph 5. of this Contract or by letter of assignment, together with a recitation of the compensation, if any, to be paid for said assignment. The School Board, or its designated representative(s), may make any additions or amendments during the duty year as shall be necessary. These assignments shall not extend beyond the duration of this Contract.
5. **Reference:** This Contract may be subject to the agreement between the School District and the exclusive representative, to the extent it is applicable to Tier 2 teachers, and the provisions of the Public Employment Labor Relations Act, as amended.
6. **Special Provisions:** **This Contract is contingent upon ability to obtain an Out of Field Permissions License for complete duration of the terms in this contract.**

Crisis Intervention

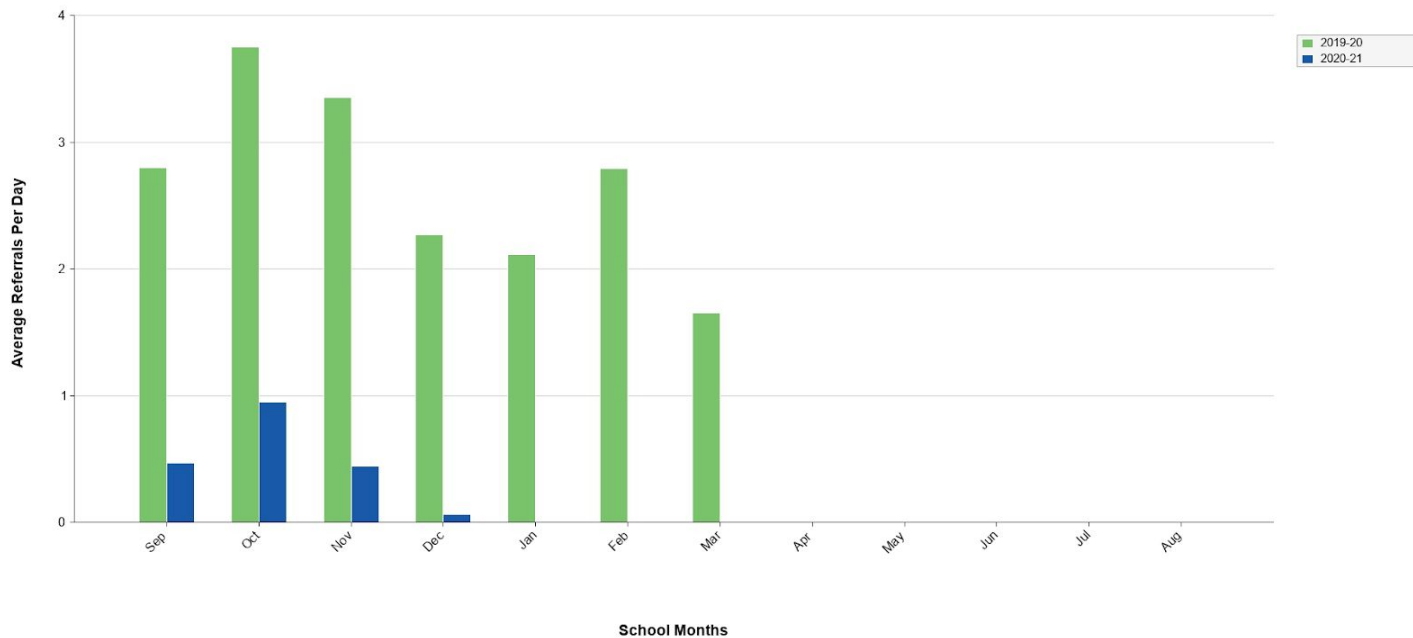
- Officer Brandon Olson is working on the Risk Assessment for our building and grounds.

- CEM update - completing the checklist 12/10/20 with Ms. Rachel. Monthly meeting held 12/9/2020.

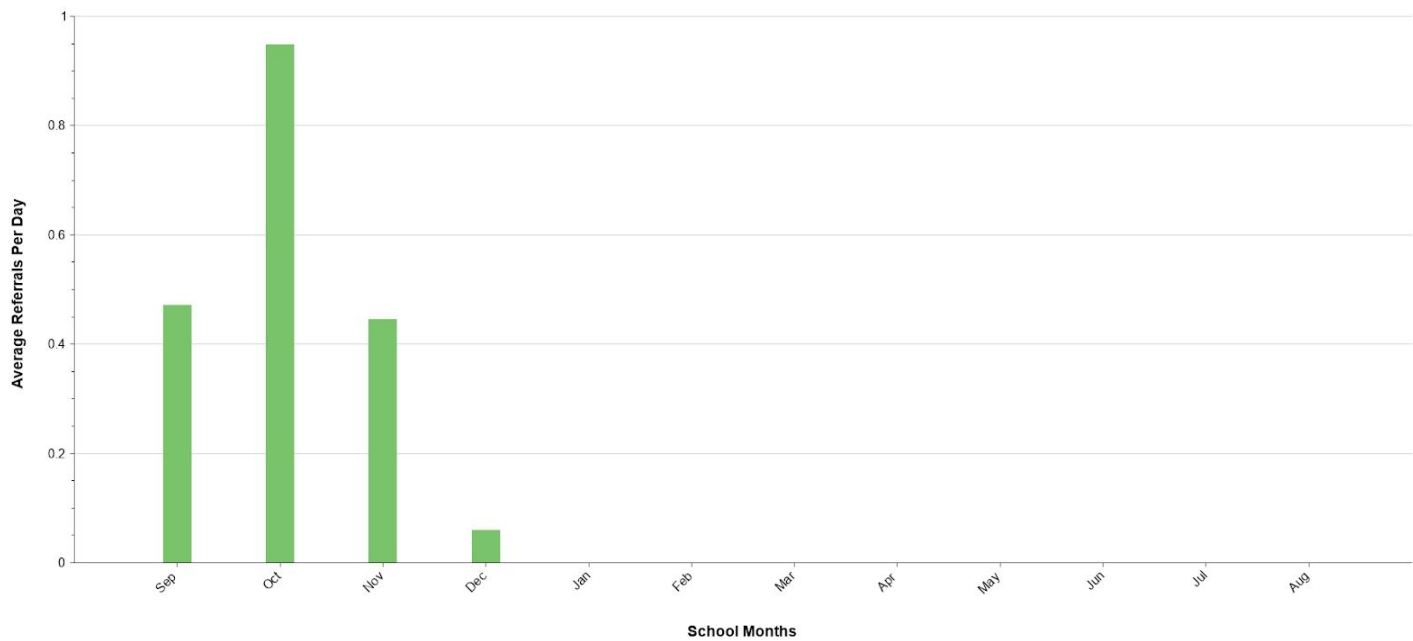
Average Referrals Per Day Per Month - Multi-Year

The district's leadership and MTSS teams look at data every three weeks. We use a process developed by Marzano to ensure that best practices are used when developing and teaching lessons. We use classroom data as well as STAR reading and math data. Special Education teachers, classroom, teachers, an instruction coach, a mental health provider are part of the MTSS team. Teachers use data to develop intervention plans for students who are struggling. The instructional coach works with teachers to ensure effective teaching strategies are being used.

What strategies has the district initiated to improve student equitable access to experienced, in-field, and effective teachers?

What goal(s) do you have to reduce and eventually eliminate equitable access gaps?

Most of our populations are too small to gauge. The populations that are large enough are our Special Education and Free and Reduced Lunch. There is a gap between students who are in special education and receive free and reduced lunch. The root cause comes from the need to educate parents on how to support their students as well as the need for teachers to be more intentional in their teaching strategies when working with students in this population.

WBWF Requirement: WBWF requires districts and charters to examine student access to licensed teachers who reflect the racial and ethnic diversity of students. A growing body of research has demonstrated that all students benefit when they are taught by racially and ethnically diverse staff throughout their career, and students of color and indigenous students benefit even more. The district's largest population with 87.2% of our students are White. The remaining percentage of students is small with 7% being two or more races, 3% American Indian students, 1% Hispanic students, and 3% Black students. We have 24 (87%) licensed staff members. We have three (13%) certified staff members, including the administrator, who are persons of color.

Floodwood is a small town 45 miles from bigger towns like Grand Rapids, Cloquet, Hibbing, and Duluth. Since hired in 2015 as the Superintendent/Principal, the first time I interviewed and hired teachers of color was in 2019. We have collaborated with Fond du Lac Tribal Community College/Winona State Teacher program with hopes to bring more diversity into our teaching staff.

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 698, State of Minnesota, **on December 14, 2020**, the following:

1. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the precincts and polling places for school district elections are those precincts or parts of precincts located within the boundaries of the school district which have been established by the cities or towns located in whole or in part within the school district. The board hereby confirms those precincts and polling places so established by those municipalities.

2. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the board may establish a combined polling place for several precincts for school district elections not held on the day of a statewide election. Each combined polling place must be a polling place that has been designated for use as a polling place by a county or municipality. The following combined polling places are established to serve the precincts specified for all school district special and general elections not held on the same day as a statewide election **in the calendar year following the adoption of this resolution:**

Combined Polling Place: City of Floodwood, 111 West 8th Avenue, Floodwood, Minnesota
(name and address of combined polling place)

This combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No. 698 located in **St. Louis County**: St. Louis County Unorganized 1 (51-21); Floodwood Precinct 1 – City of Floodwood; Arrowhead Township (N); Cedar Valley Township (S); Fine Lakes Township; Floodwood Township Precinct 2; Halden Township; Prairie Lake Township; Van Buren Township; and

this combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No. 698 located in **Aitkin County**: Northeast Unorganized Township (52-22)

3. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.09, the polling places will remain open for voting for school district elections not held on the same day as a statewide election between the hours of four o'clock p.m. and eight o'clock p.m.

4. The clerk is directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the county auditors of each of the counties in which the school district is located, in whole or in part, within thirty (30) days after its adoption.

5. As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 204B.16, Subdivision 1a, the clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give written notice of new polling place locations to each affected household with at least one registered voter in the school district whose school district polling place location has been changed. The notice must be a nonforwardable notice mailed at least twenty-five (25) days before the date of the first election to which it will apply. A notice that is returned as undeliverable must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate county auditor, who shall change the registrant's status to "challenged" in the statewide registration system.

TEACHER CONTRACT FOR MINNESOTA PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS

The School Board of Independent School District No. 0698 of the State of Minnesota, Floodwood, Minnesota, enters into this Contract, pursuant to M.S. 122A.40, as amended, with **NICOLAS VALTINSON** a legally qualified licensed teacher who agrees to teach in the public schools of said District **as Long Term Social Studies Substitute Teacher** for the school year **2020 to 2021**.

The following provisions shall apply and are a part of this Contract:

1. **Basic Services:** Said teacher shall faithfully perform the services prescribed by the School Board, or its designated representative(s), whether or not such services are specifically described in this Contract, abide by the rules and regulations as established by the School Board and the State of Minnesota, and any additions or amendments thereto, for the annual salary indicated below, and agrees to teach for the School District as assigned in such grades or subjects for which the teacher has the necessary license.
2. **Duration:** This Contract is subject to the provisions of M.S. 122A.40, as amended, and to all laws, rules, and regulations of the State of Minnesota relevant to qualification, licensure, employment, termination, and discharge of teachers for cause. Thereafter, this Contract shall remain in full force and effect except if modified by mutual consent of the School Board and the teacher or unless terminated as provided by law, or by written resignation pursuant to M.S. 122A.40.
3. **Duty Year:** The teacher's duty year and vacation days shall be as adopted by the School Board, and the teacher agrees to teach on those legal holidays on which the School Board is authorized to conduct school if the School Board so determines. In the event a duty day is lost due to any emergency, the teacher agrees to perform duties on such other day in lieu thereof as determined by the School Board.
4. **Additional Services:** The School Board, or its designated representative(s), may assign the teacher to extra-curricular, co-curricular, or other assignments, subject to established compensation for such services which exceed the services authorized in paragraph 1. Said extra-curricular, co-curricular, or other assignments may be described in paragraph 6. of this Contract or by letter of assignment, together with a recitation of the compensation, if any, to be paid for said assignment. The School Board, or its designated representative(s), may make any additions or amendments during the duty year as shall be necessary. Said extra-curricular, co-curricular, or other assignments and compensation, if any, for such assignment shall not become a part of the teacher's continuing contract rights unless the words, "continuing contract," are recorded immediately following the assignment.
5. **Reference:** This Contract shall be subject to the agreement between the School District and the exclusive representative, if any, and the provisions of the Public Employment Labor Relations Act, as amended.
