

Health Requirements

*****Early reminder of health requirements for students entering their first year of preschool, kindergarten, 2nd grade, 6th grade, 9th grade, or 12th grade*****

1st year pre-K: Physical Exam and Vaccines (see attachment)

K: Physical Exam, Vaccines (see attachment), Dental Exam, Eye Exam

2nd: Dental Exam

6th: Dental Exam, Physical Exam and Vaccines (Meningococcal and TDAP)

9th: Dental Exam and Physical Exam

12th: Meningococcal Vaccine

Specific Sections

- Under **Dr. Office Forms** you will find **school and sports physicals** as well as different diagnoses that will have a packet to be filled out. (**Asthma, Allergies, Migraines, Seizures, Diabetes, Cardiac, VP Shunt**, etc) Some papers will need to be filled out by the parent, and some forms will need to be filled out by the physician. You will also find **Medication Forms** here.
- Under **Dental Forms** you will find the form that needs filled out by your dentist.
- Under **Eye Dr. Forms** you will find the form that needs filled out by your eye dr.
- Under **Nurse Forms** you will find **Health History Forms** as well as diagnosis forms (These are the forms to be filled out by the parent that is also found in the packets under Dr. Office Forms)

Enrolling Your Child in School

Getting Their Certificate of Health Examination

The Certificate of Child Health Examination is a required form for students entering or transferring to Illinois schools and at the below critical grade levels. It is not the same as a Sports Physical form, and must be signed by a physician (MD or DO), physician assistant (PA), or nurse practitioner (APRN). Full, printed vaccine records may be turned in with the Certificate of Child Health Examination.

Child Care Facility, Preschool, Early Childhood, & Pre-Kindergarten Programs

Parents or caregivers must submit a complete medical file, including the following immunizations by the first day.

DTP/DTaP (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis)	4 doses, with 3 doses by their 1st birthday, and 1 additional dose by their 2nd birthday.
Hepatitis B (Hep B)*	3 doses, with the 3rd dose administered on or after 24 weeks of age.
Haemophilus Influenzae Type B (Hib)*†	3–4 doses, given at 2 months, 4 months, 6 months (depending on brand of vaccine), and 12–15 months.
Pneumococcal (PCV)*†	4 doses, given at 2 months, 4 months, 6 months, and 12–15 months.
Polio (IPV)	3 doses, 2 by the child's 1st birthday and 1 by their 2nd birthday.
Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)	1 dose, no earlier than their 1st birthday. Earlier doses will not be counted for school requirements.
Varicella (Chickenpox)	1 dose, on or after 1st birthday.



Kindergarten (Entry to School)

Students must provide proof of having received these immunizations, in addition to those required for Pre-K.

DTP/DTaP (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis)	4 or more doses, the last booster must be given on or after the child's 4th birthday.
Polio (IPV)	4 doses, the 4th dose must be given on or after the child's 4th birthday.
Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)	2 doses, the 1st dose on or after their 1st birthday and the 2nd dose no less than 4 weeks (28 days) later.
Varicella (Chickenpox)	2 doses, the 1st dose on or after their 1st birthday and the 2nd dose no less than 4 weeks (28 days) later.



6th Grade (Middle School)

Students must provide proof of having received these immunizations, in addition to those required for kindergarten.

Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis)	1 dose, on or after their 11th birthday.
Hepatitis B (Hep B)	3 doses
Meningococcal (MCV4)	1 dose, on or after their 11th birthday.



12th Grade (High School Senior)

Students must provide proof of having received these immunizations. In addition to those required for 6th grade.

Meningococcal (MCV4)	1 dose on or after their 16th birthday.

Recommended But Not Required Immunizations

These are vaccines that can also help keep your children, your school system, and your family healthy.

Influenza (Flu)	1 dose, every year for everyone aged 6 months and older.
COVID-19	1 dose, every year for everyone aged 6 months and older.
Human papillomavirus (HPV)	Recommended for everyone between ages 9 and 26, ideally at age 9–12 years. Depending on the timing of their 1st dose, they may need 2 or 3 doses.
Hepatitis A (Hep A)	Recommended as a 2 dose series, beginning at 12 months of age.
Meningococcal B (MenB)	Required for some college programs.

Together, we can help all children enroll, grow, and thrive!

If you're unsure of your child's vaccine status, ask their pediatrician!



* Indicates the immunization is not required for kindergarten entry.

† The total number of doses may differ and must be verified by your doctor if on a catch-up schedule.
