INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Our school has adopted The "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol (SRP). Students and staff will be training, practicing, and drilling the protocol.

COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on an all-hazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. When communicating these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Art" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is performed by active participants, including students, staff, teachers and first responders. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and

HOLD

SECURE

'Get Inside, Lock outside doors'

- · Lock the outside doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

- Students are trained to:
- · Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- . Do not open the door

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Recover students from hallway if possible
- · Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- · Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- . Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

EVACUATE

Students are trained to:

- · Leave stuff behind if required to . If possible, bring their phone
- · Follow instructions

Adults and staff are trained to:

- . Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to bring anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation.)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- · Account for students and adults
- · Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.


