A 10-day drop policy will apply after 10 days of NO CONTACT with the school, teachers, or principal.

As we begin a new year, I want to invite our students and families to think about **intentions**, not resolutions. Intentions are gentle goals we can practice every day, even when things feel hard.

At school, we will be focusing on **mindfulness and kindness**. Mindfulness means noticing what is happening right now in our bodies, thoughts, and feelings. It helps students pause, breathe, and make thoughtful choices. Kindness is how we use our words and actions to help ourselves and others feel safe, seen, and supported.

You might practice this at home by:

- Taking three slow breaths together before school or bedtime
- Naming one kind thing you did or noticed each day
- Reminding your child that mistakes are part of learning and growing

When children feel calm and connected, they learn better and treat others with more care. Thank you for partnering with us as we help students build strong habits of **awareness, compassion, and resilience** in the year ahead.



Welcome back, students! As we begin the second half of the 2025–2026 school year, this is a perfect moment to pause, breathe, and reset. No matter how the first half went –whether it was full of wins, challenges, or a mix of both–today brings a clean slate and new possibilities.

This half of the year is about hope: believing in your ability to grow, to learn from mistakes, and to try again with confidence. It's also about new goals–big or small–that give you something to work toward each day. Progress doesn't require perfection; it starts with showing up and taking the next step.



Welcome JANUARY 2026

Dear Parents:

We are starting Unit 2 of the Connect4Learning® program. This unit explores environments: those close to home and others less familiar, such as a coral reef. We will learn about the following topics and skills:

- Science:
 - » Resources that come from an environment and ways to protect them
 - » Animals, plants, and earth features in different environments
 - » Comparing and contrasting
 - » Predicting and observing
 - » Recording through drawing and beginning writing
- Math:
 - » Counting aloud
 - » Counting objects
 - » Comparing and contrasting two-dimensional (2-D) and three-dimensional (3-D) shapes
- Literacy:
 - » Words that rhyme
 - » Beginning sounds in words.
- Social and Emotional Skills:
 - » Identifying problems
 - » Choosing good solutions

By the end of this unit, we will have made a beautiful coral reef! Watch for an invitation, written by our children, to come for a scavenger hunt. We hope to see you there!

What you can do:

- Ask your child what he or she is learning about environments, animals, plants, habitats, recycling, and the coral reef.
- Play fun rhyming games and read books with rhymes.
- Find 2-D and 3-D shapes at home and in the community; ask your child to observe and talk about their features. For example: Rectangles have 4 sides, 4 angles, and 4 vertices (the points on the corners), and the opposite sides are the same lengths.
- With family and friends, encourage your child to address problems with solutions learned at school; encourage him or her to create new solutions.
