1. Staff and scholars are overwhelmingly pleased to be attending in-person learning. Compliance with masking is very high . . . near 100%! We are working to increase hand hygiene and physical distancing.
2. Protocol for if someone exhibits symptoms of COVID-19:

For students in a classroom...

- a. A Staff Member discreetly escorts the student into the hall, while still maintaining adequate distance.
 - b. A Staff Member directs another Staff Member to provide the escort to the Group Counseling Room and then alerts a Front Office staff member. If another Staff Member is not present, call the Front Office and calmly request: "I need an escort". A Front Office staff member escorts the student to the Group Counseling Room while another Front Office staff member contacts a parent/guardian to come pick-up the student.
 - c. During escort, all parties need to be wearing masks and keeping an appropriate distance.
 - d. After the student is out of the classroom, the teacher verifies student attendance, especially those who were in close proximity to the student with symptoms and sends this information to administration.
 - e. A counselor/administrator will check-in with the student as they wait in the Group Counseling Room. Once the parent/guardian arrives, the counselor/administrator will escort the student out to the ride, through the exit by the Counseling Offices.
 - f. A custodian is then alerted by the Front Office to sanitize the Group Counseling Room.
 - g. UDOH Point of Contact (Principal) completes necessary action.

 5. Title I budget is set-up according to parent input last spring:
 - Two QTIP Teachers: ~\$10,000
 - Substitutes for Instructional Rounds: ~\$5000
 - Extension of Liaison Time: ~\$10,000
 - Summer School & Summer Transitions: ~\$8000
 - Teacher Retention Bonuses: ~\$10,000
 - Guest Speakers: ~\$4000
 - Parent Engagement: ~\$9000
 - Scholar Supplies: ~\$53,000
 - After School (later, when Navajo Nation is yellow/green): ~\$15,000
 6. Trustlands plan is about \$53,000, going to pay 2.5 paraeducators to help scholars pass all classes the first time.

SJSD River Region Protocols for Sports and Activities

Out of respect for the Navajo Nation leaders and the health of all people on the Navajo Nation, we ask all individuals to wear a mask properly. Properly wearing a mask includes wearing the mask over both the nose and mouth continuously, as outlined in the CDC guidelines.

Masks will be provided to individuals as needed.

1. Masks are to be worn properly at all times, by all individuals, including coaches, at the practice and competition venue when the individuals are not engaged in strenuous physical exertion (sports) or not actively performing (activities). Participants who are actively exerting themselves and officials actively exerting themselves in physical activity shall be exempt.
2. Participants shall be required to store their masks in a pre-assigned place where they can be easily accessed when exiting the game/activity, near their labelled water bottle and/or gear.
3. Schools will use signage in playing/competition venues to encourage 3-6 feet physical distancing.
4. Schools will provide ongoing training for all coaches, advisors, and game personnel on COVID19 risk mitigation strategies and protocols, including a reminder of protocols before competitions.
5. It is recommended that all student-athletes who test positive for COVID19 follow the guidelines provided by the local Health Board.
6. Spectator capacities at venues are determined by individual schools in conjunction with the local Health Department, the Navajo Nation Health Department, and according to venue size. Visiting teams will be given a number of allowable fans. Home fans will be allotted through the student participants. As space allows, additional tickets may be sold. Once capacity is reached, no further tickets will be sold and non-ticketed spectators will need to leave campus.
 - According to the UHSAA guidelines, proactive measures may include a delay on games for non-compliance.
 - These guidelines apply to all Sports & Activities in the San Juan School District River Region.

NOTE: We care about our student-athletes and want them to stay safe. We also value sports because they are an important part of student well-being. We encourage athletes to:

* Continue to wear a mask in off-campus locations,
