The search is for children birth to 21 years of age who are in need of early intervention, preschool, or school age services.

Community Eligibility Provision

We are pleased to announce we will once again be able to serve meals to children under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program for the 2022-2023 school year. We will operate the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). Schools that participate in the CEP are able to provide a healthy breakfast and lunch each day at **no charge** for all students enrolled in a CEP school.

What does this mean?

Each student will be provided with a standard meal – breakfast and lunch - either the daily menu offering or the alternate meal is covered. Additional meals or “a la carte” items such as additional milk, bottled water, chips, etc., will still be available for purchase.

Transportation News

Brocton's Transportation Department takes great pride in transporting our students to and from school safely. We need your help with the following items:

- Brocton is excited to announce the new Traversa Ride 360 website. You may access this through the URL <https://nybroctoncsd.traversaride360.com> or on the ride 360 app on your mobile device. Instructions on how to set up your account will be on the district website and sent to parents in a separate mailing.
- Please obey the school speed zones.
- Stop for the flashing red lights of the school bus.
- Be ready for the bus five-minutes prior to normal bus time. Don't make the bus late for the next stop.
- Follow all the bus safety rules.
- Stay seated on the bus, bus seats are designed to keep students safe.
- Changes in student transportation should be made in writing or on the Traversa 360 messaging system. Any change must be received on Friday of the previous week. Changes to student transportation may take up to three (3) days to be effective.
- If a child does not take advantage of morning transportation for five days in a row, with no phone call from his/her parent, it is the district's practice to suspend the morning pick up until we are contacted.

Health News

2022-2023 NEW YORK STATE IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOL ENTRANCE/ATTENDANCE

New York State requires the following immunizations be completed prior to attending school. Please notice requirements change for children based on age and grade levels.

- Pre-K
 - Four (4) doses of DTaP
 - Three to Four (3-4) doses of Polio
 - One (1) dose of MMR
 - Three (3) doses of Hepatitis B
 - Three (3) doses of HIB (if given before 15 months of age, otherwise one (1) dose)
 - One (1) dose of Varicella
 - One to Four (1-4) doses of Prevnar
- Kindergarten
 - Two (2) doses of Varicella
 - Two (2) doses of MMR
 - Four to Five (4-5) doses of DTaP (last dose must be after age of four (4))
 - The remaining PreK listed vaccines also
- 6th Grade
 - Booster of TDaP
- 7th Grade and 12th Grade
 - Menactra (before entering each grade)

Your child's immunization record should be brought to the nurse at time of registration. Please submit any medical exemptions to the nurse **every year**. New students are required to have a physical completed within the 12 months prior to enrollment date. Please submit a physical no later than 30-days after enrollment. If no physical is received your child will be scheduled to see the school doctor. Effective July of 2018 all students in PreK, Kindergarten, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 11th grade will also be required to have a physical. If you do not want the school to complete the physical, please notify the Health Office **every year**.

Curriculum and Assessment Updates

New York State continues to make the shift to implementing the Next Generation Learning Standards across content areas. You can find the standards and other resources at <http://www.nysed.gov/curriculum-instruction>.

New York State will be making Computer Based Testing (CBT) for students taking 3-8 assessments in ELA, math, and science. Our students are ready! We have been successfully using CBT for 3-8 assessments in math and ELA for over five years. Classes taking these assessments practice using the online platform in the winter, prior to when the actual tests occur in the spring. Classroom teachers, our Instructional Coach, Mrs. Huber, and Mrs. Zappie, Media Teacher, have helped to reinforce the skills needed to test on the computer.
