### COMMUNITY

Mayville is a rural community with a population of 4,895 people. The city serves as a gateway to the Horicon Marsh. The community's schools include Mayville Early Learning Center (4K), Mayville Elementary School (K-6) and Mayville Jr./Sr. High School (7-12). The Mayville School District serves approximately 1,033 students.

### CURRICULUM and INSTRUCTION

Students may choose coursework from a comprehensive curriculum that embraces courses of study for college bound students, technical college bound students, and vocational courses for students entering the workforce immediately following graduation. Advanced placement (AP) courses are available in Youth apprenticeships, cooperative education, employment release, and Early College Credit/Start College Now programs are also available to students. All students are encouraged to pursue an academic rigorous selection of courses.

Transcripted Credit (TC) courses are available through Moraine Park Technical College and Mayville High School, and CAPP courses through UW-Oshkosh. Visit the following link for the current course catalog:

### ACADEMIC CREDIT

A one-half (.50) Carnegie unit of credit is granted for successful completion of a full semester course. Students are required to be enrolled in a minimum of six (6) courses per semester.

### MARKING SYSTEM

The traditional A,B,C,D,F system is used (A-excellent, B-above average, C-average, D-below average, F-fail) A 4.0 for an "A", 3.0 for a "B", 2.0 for a "C", 1.0 for a "D", 0 for a "F." An "E" grade (.30) can be given to a student who attempted, but failed a course, and credit was given. The "E" grade is only used in unusual circumstances. Students may also earn credits in a postsecondary institution under Early College Credit Program and/or Start College Now. Students participating in these programs earn  $\frac{1}{4}$  high school credit per 1 college credit.

## THE SCHOOL TERM

The school term is divided into two semesters, each 18 weeks in length. We run on a modified block schedule with each course meeting for 90 minutes per day, 2-3 days per week (alternating), 36 weeks per year. There are 4 class periods per day, with students able to take up to 8 courses (4.0 credits) per semester.
