### **Accomplishments in 2024-2025**

Each spring our students participate in Reading and Math Assessments to help our school learn where we need to focus our effort in the coming school year. For the fourth year in a row Parkside Elementary far exceeds the Washington State average. Our students outperformed other Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade students on the iReady Assessments. In Math our students scored 30% higher and in Reading they outperformed their counterparts by 27%. The amazing work our students, their families and our staff did last year and the years leading up to this assessment is proof that through hard work and doing our best, great things can happen. Our students know that some things are easy, and some things are hard, but we never ever give up on ourselves. We keep working hard and improving.

#### HIGHLY CAPABLE PROGRAM

Tenino School District recognizes that students have unique academic needs and for some of our students, they need structured, advanced, academic learning opportunities. Tenino is committed to providing students these advanced academic opportunities in all grades. Nominations are accepted throughout the school year and are reviewed twice a year for Highly Capable services.

Parents, teachers, staff, students, or community members may nominate any Tenino School District student in grades K-12 to participate in evaluation for Highly Capable services. If you wish to nominate a student, please contact our K-12 Administrator, Tani Houk.

### WHAT IS TITLE 1, PART A?

Title I, Part A is a federally-funded program designed to provide supplemental educational services for children who are most at risk of failing to meet the state's student academic achievement standards in English Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics.

Students in kindergarten through 5th-grade at both Parkside Primary and Tenino Elementary School benefit from the supplemental education services (SES) provided by Title I funds in Tenino School District. These opportunities allow schools to provide needed interventions to ensure students meet academic standards. Program support is given in a variety of ways such as Kindergarten readiness, differentiated instruction, small group interventions, and tutoring.

Parents can influence the success of their child more than any teacher or federal program. Parents of students that are Title I qualified enter into a School-Parent Compact. This compact includes the school, parent and student role in regards to student success, communication about student progress and how families and schools can develop a partnership to assist in student growth.
