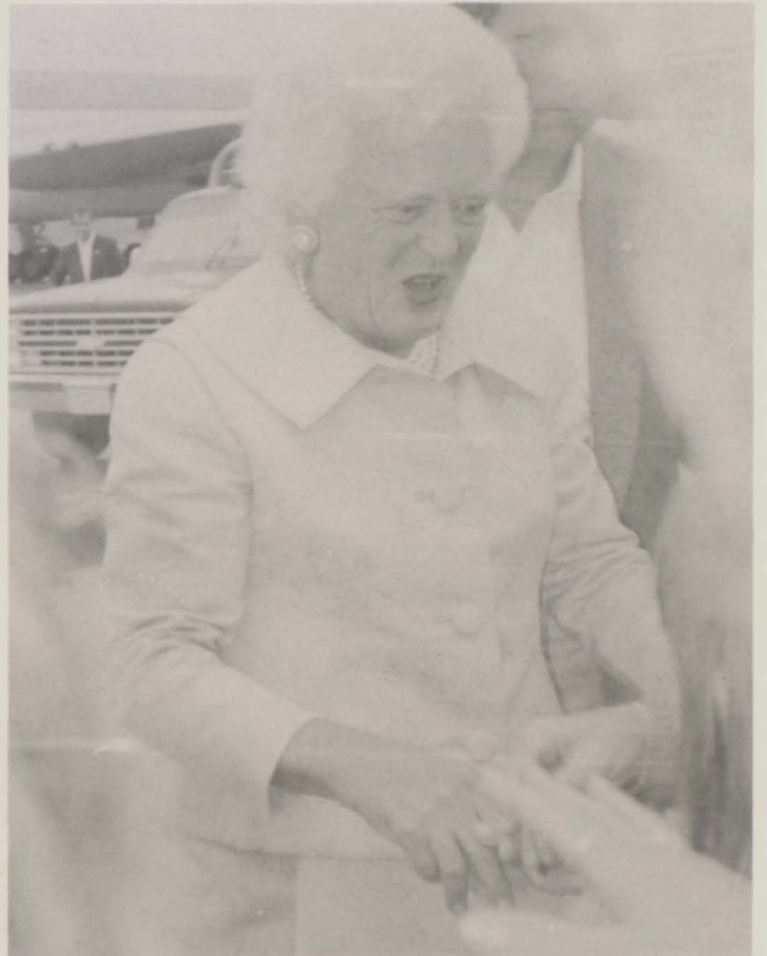

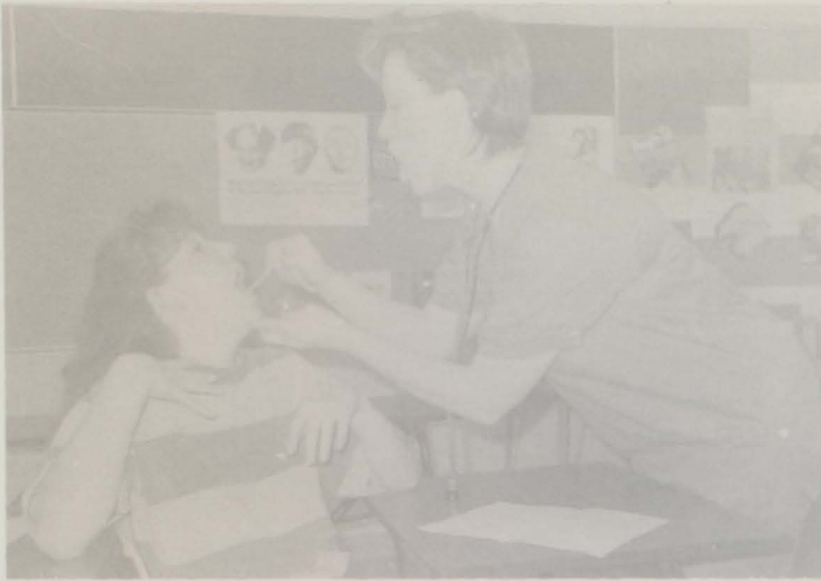
Students at Work

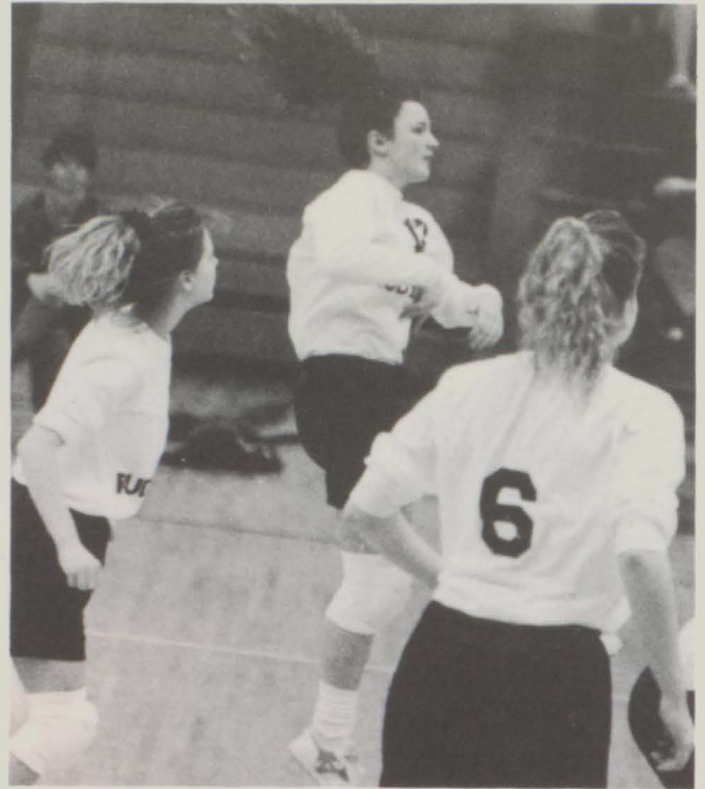


Eying the Prize

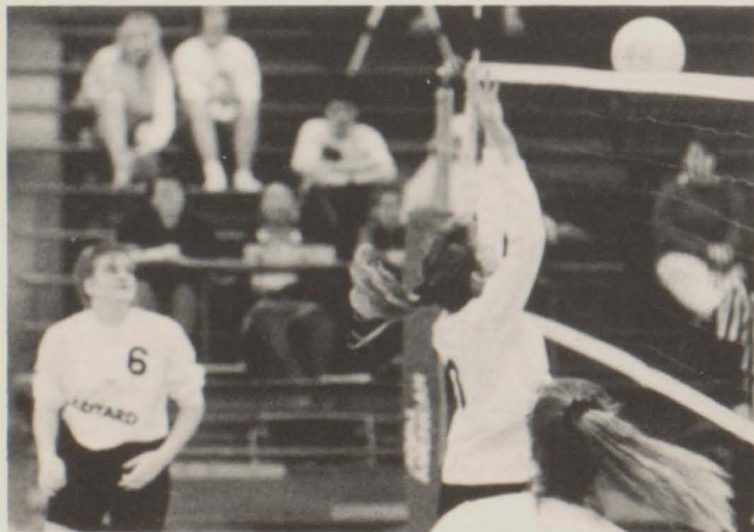

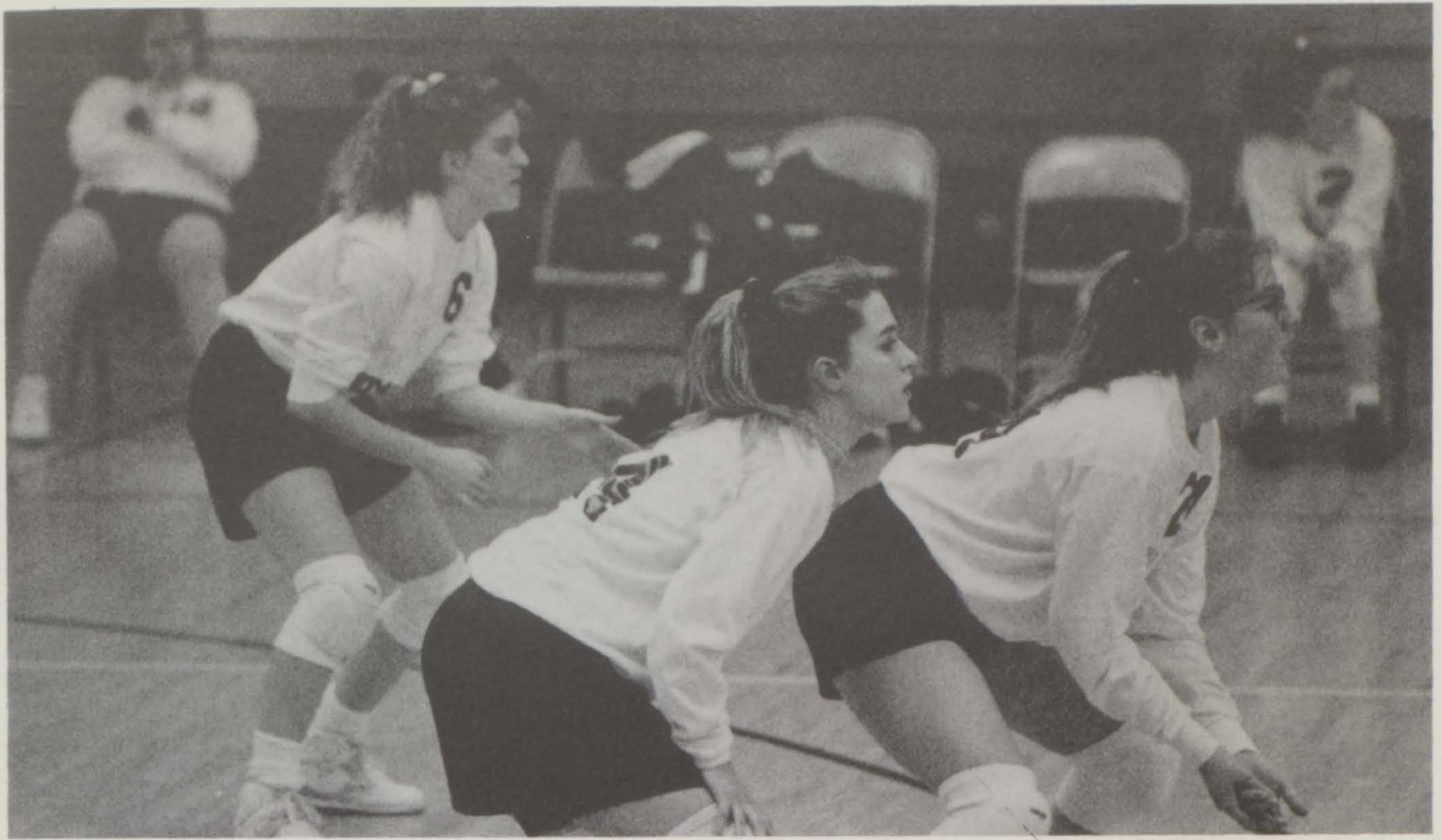

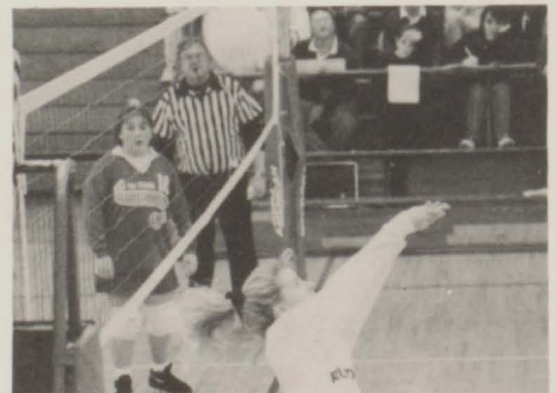

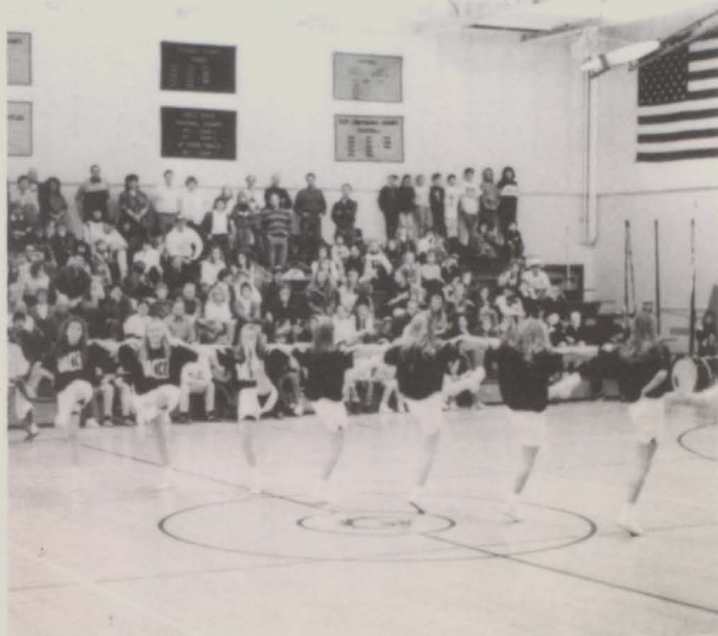

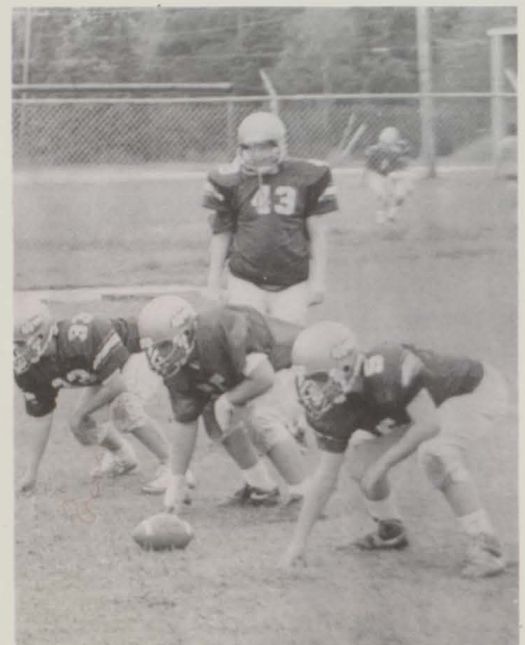

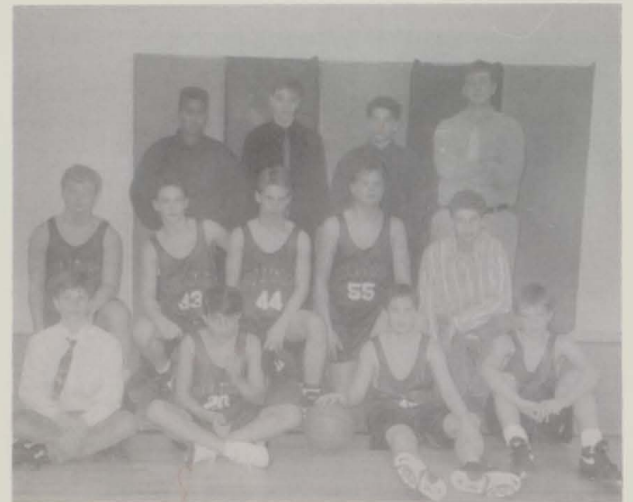

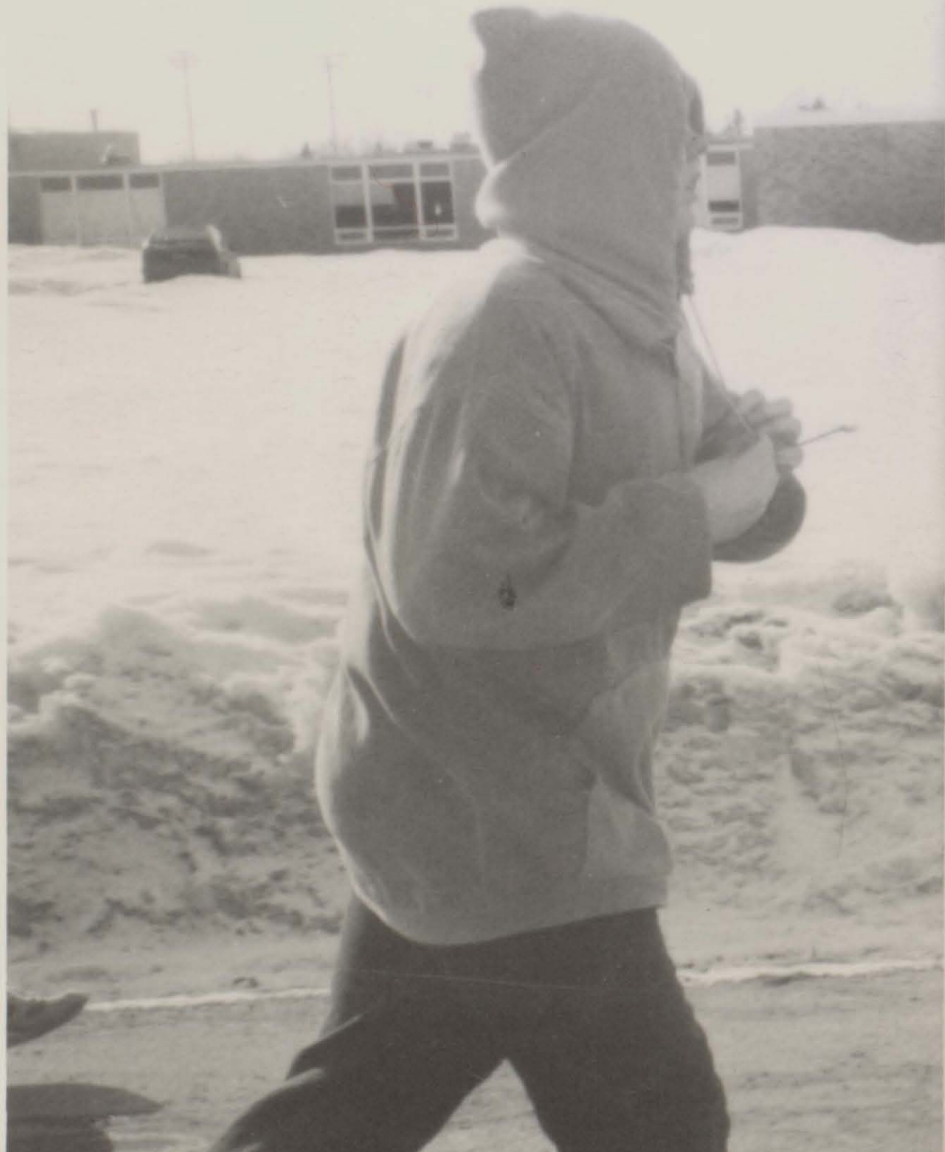
