
Dreams for Tomorrow




For others, it was another year of excitement and activities; another year of renewing old friendships and making new ones, another year of dreaming of the future.









Spare Time and Studies

Moments in a Day at R.H.S.



Life goes on; tests are given, friends are made, and the students keep studying knowing the time ahead will come before they realize it.












Two girls made the team, Joy Afman and Mary Radecki. They ran good times and even beat a couple of guys. Next year the girls will have their own team.


The J.V. Football did quite well this year. The team lacked experience. It lost most of its Sophomores to the Varsity, leaving mostly Freshmen who played very well.


At the beginning of the season there were 11 girls on the team, but due to various reasons the number of players dropped to six. Even though this happened, the teams' spirit to win was always intact.


Next year the team hopes that they will again have a great season and that there will be a continued interest by more girls and the fans.




The Varsity Cheerleading squad accomplished many things this year, but the most important would have to be a closer unified feeling between the J.V. and Varsity squads.





This group also competed in two music festivals this year where they kept the tradition of bringing back a one rating.



