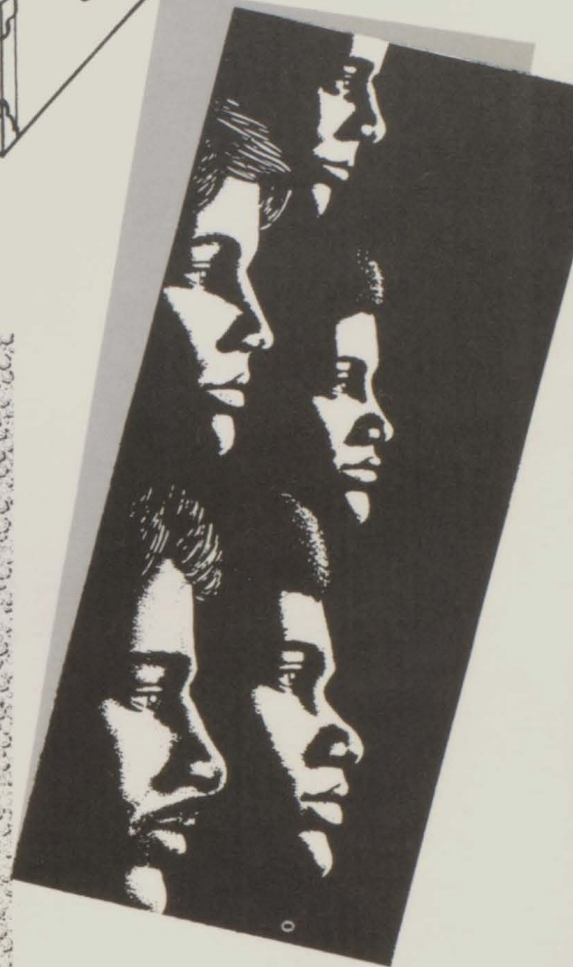
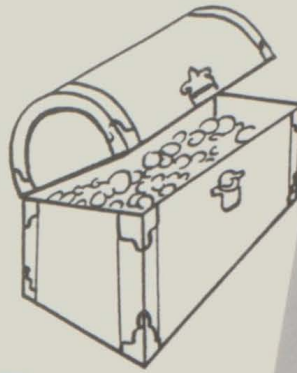




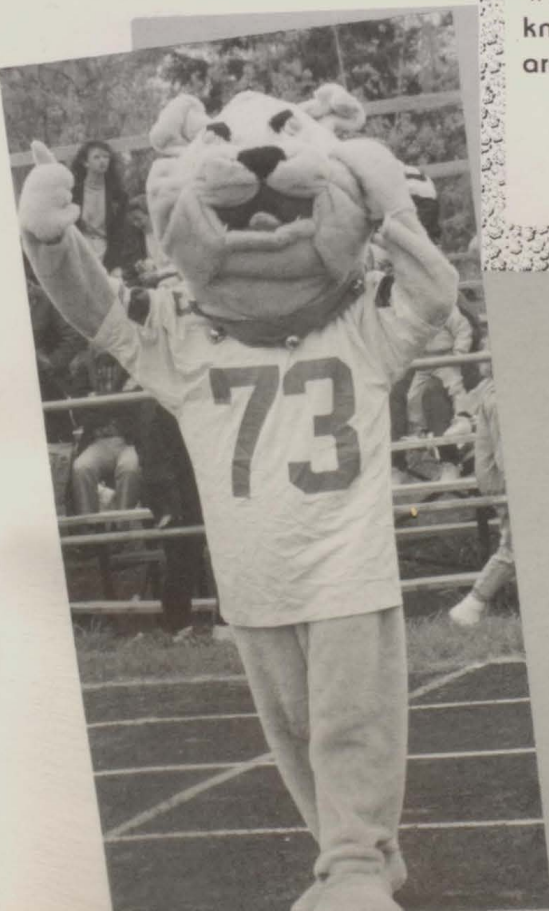




# Treasures ? UNKNOWN

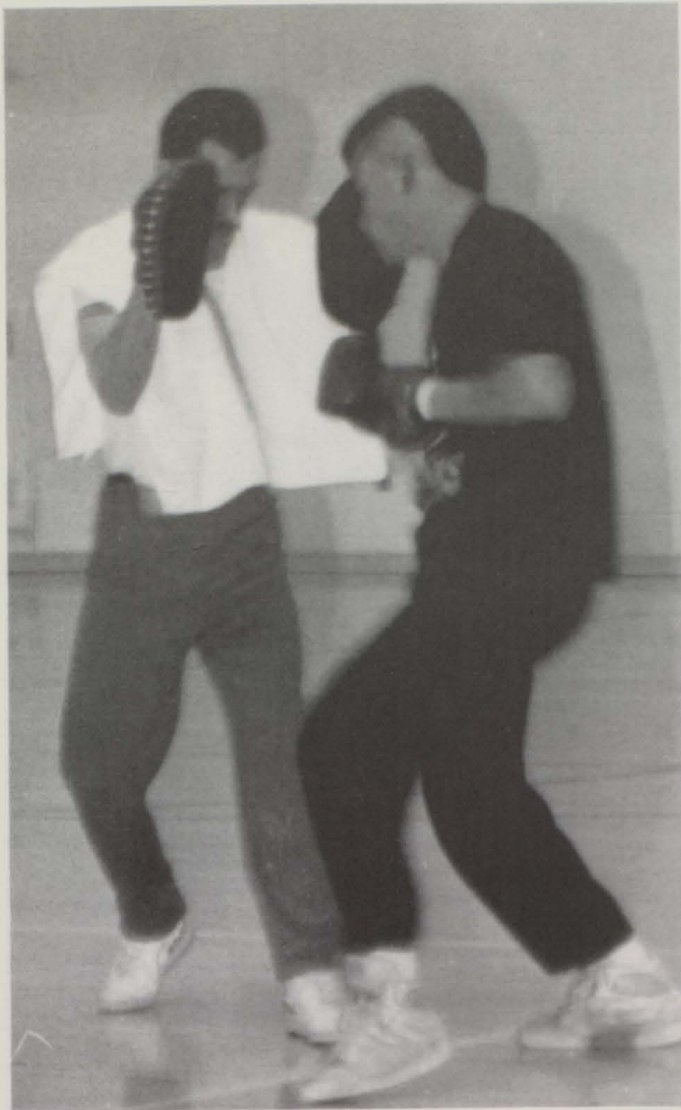

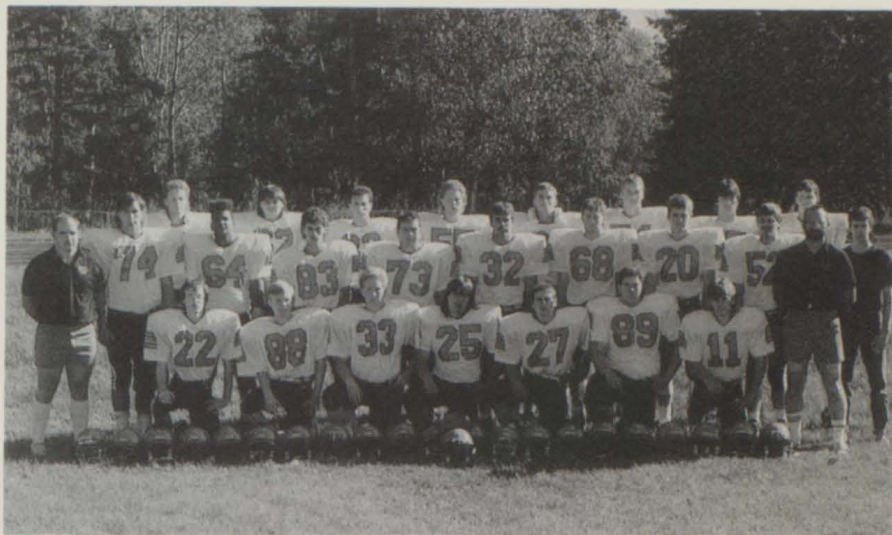
The Bulldogs struggles through one of their poor seasons of the last few years. Their five wins and 4 losses did not gain them many post season honors nor did it send them to the playoffs.

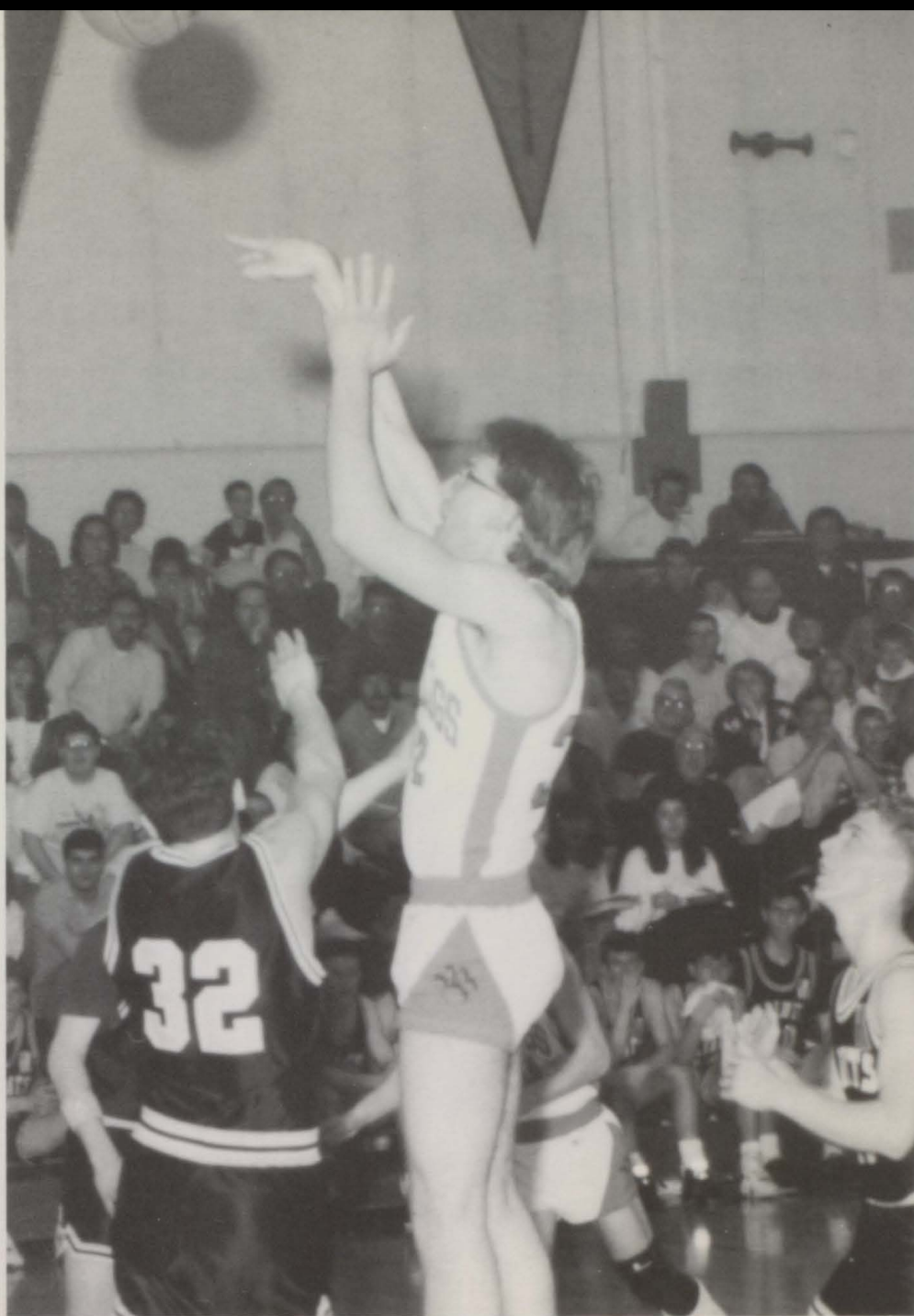

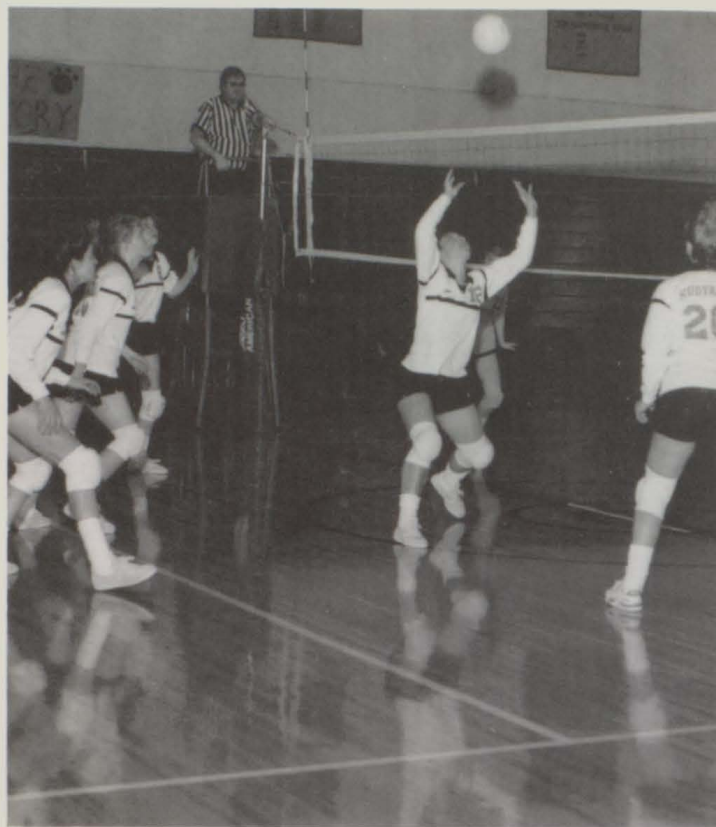
## What a Difference a Year Makes!

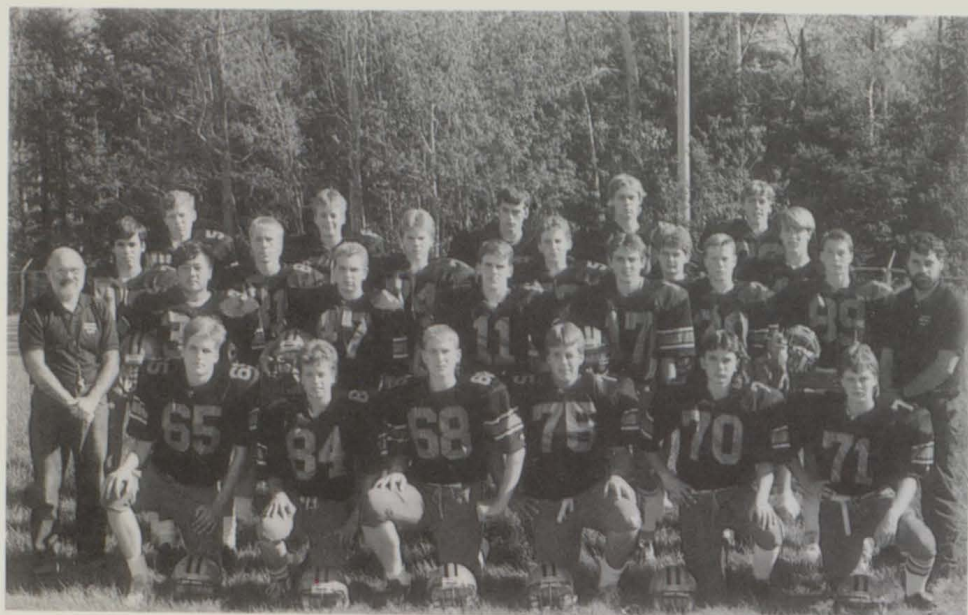

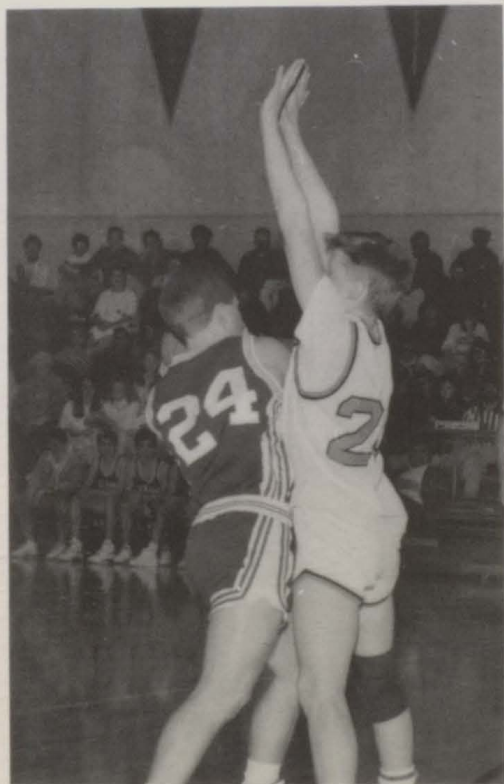

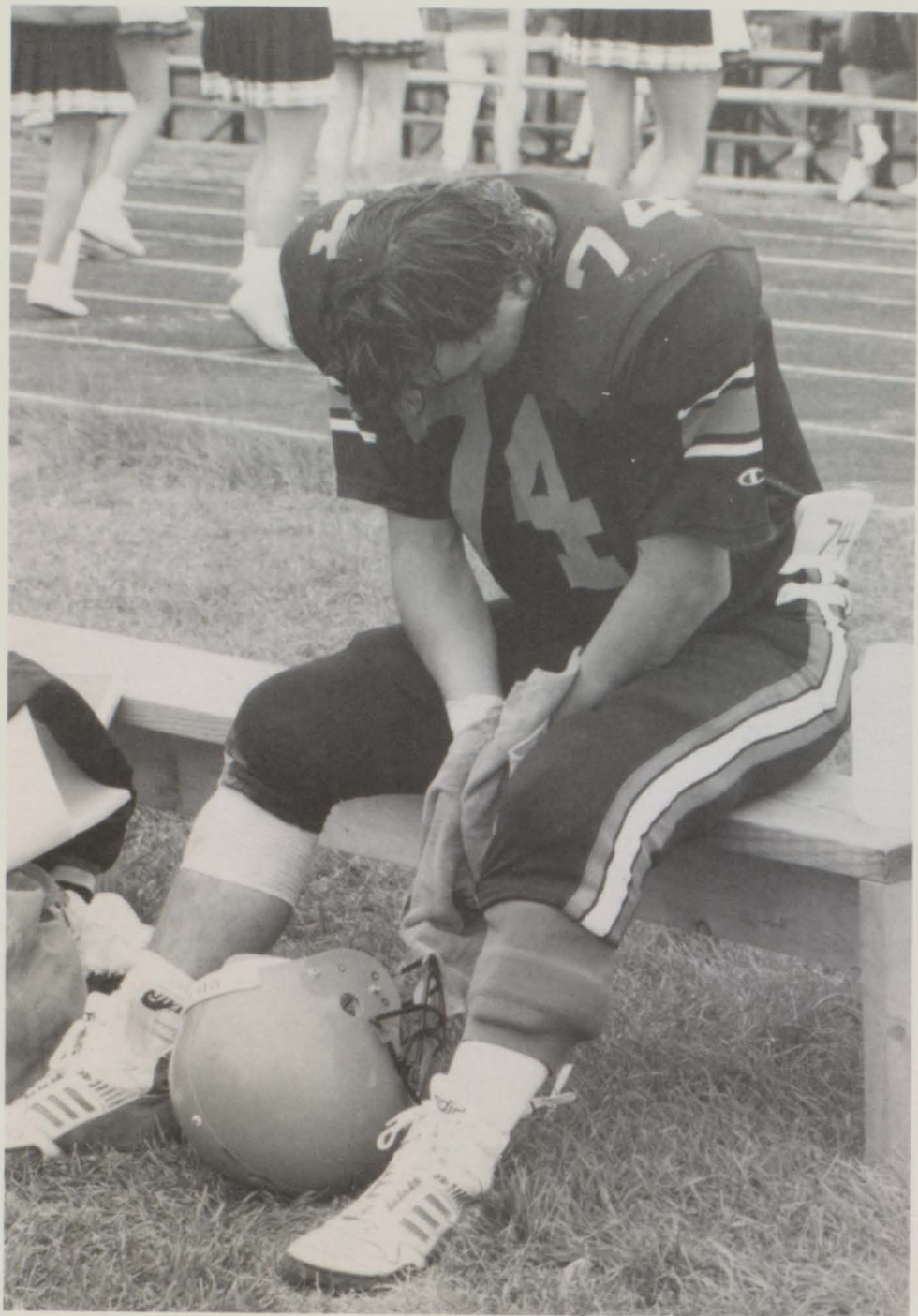

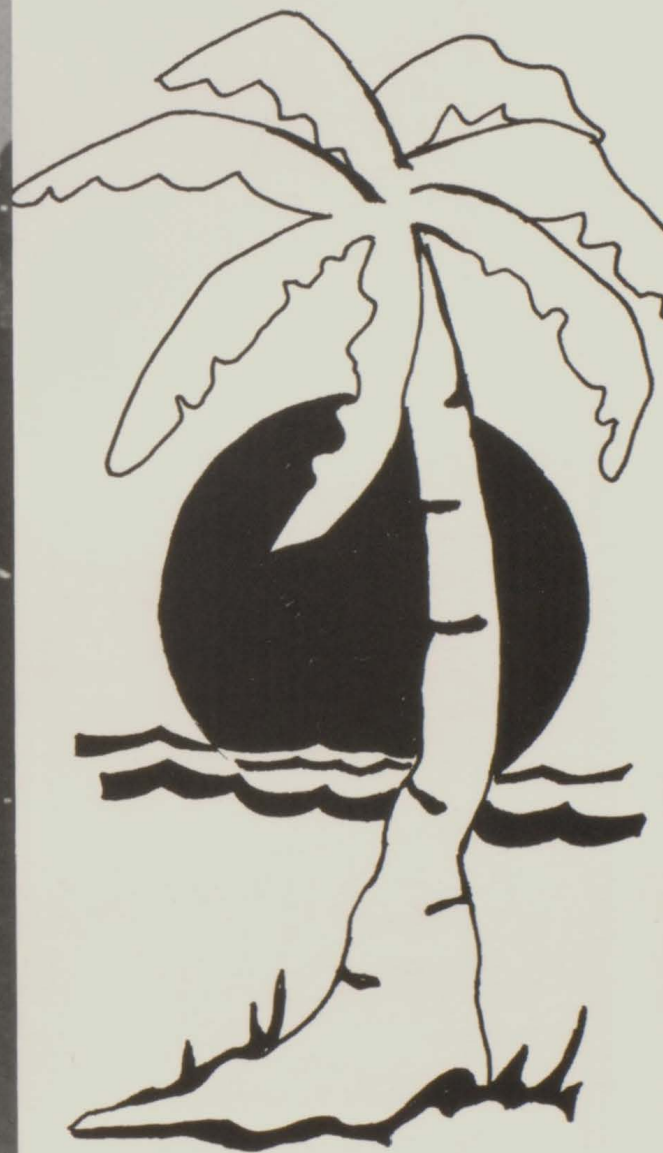
