




The chords and the music are all on file.






## Theme Puts New Life into Parade

The afternoon activities were capped with a Homecoming Dinner at the 4-Seasons Restaurant, followed by the Homecoming Dance.






## *Victorious Homecoming*







Half time entertainment was given by the Band with highlights of the Pom-Pom girls performing to "Up, Up and Away."








The librarians, Mr. Zussman (lower center), and Mrs. Hopkins (far left), help the students in their studying while they're at school.







RHS's physical education department successfully launched a revised plan for the students this year, allowing them to choose what sport or activity he or she would take part in.

# *Industrial Arts Drills Today for Tomorrow*


Industrial Art courses look toward the future in teaching subjects vital to our changing world.




Mr. Davis (upper far left) is the only new business teacher at Rudyard this year. He teaches in Mr. Stelzels place for General Business and Economics.



The Social Studies department at RHS has many goals. The most important of these being to give the student an educated look at the world around him by using Geography, History, and Government.






Math and sciences are an important feature at RHS.

Replacing Mr. Schank in the Art Room is Mr. Corey (top center). He shows pride in his students by displaying their art in the library.


In the language lab we have Mr. Erno and Miss Wright.

Miss Wright (lower middle right) is the French teacher for the Junior High as well as the High School.






English at RHS contributed greatly to the education of all this year by using a varied means of communication.

## Bulldogs on Right Track




This year's Track Team was small but very successful. With 8 returning lettermen they won the title of U.P. champs for Class C.


## *Student Unity*


# Pride on Our Side



## Planning Ahead for the Future


