

Jane Rissler of Kabletown, WV, graduated from Charles Town High School and Shepherd College (now University). She held a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) in Agriculture from Cornell University. She worked for nearly 30 years in Washington, D.C., on science and public policy issues related to sustainable agriculture at the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the National Wildlife Federation and Union of Concerned Scientists. In 2011, Dr. Rissler returned to Jefferson County and served as the director of the Jefferson County Museum in Charles Town until her death in 2023. She was an avid booster of the Jefferson Arts Council, and a bequest to JAC from her estate helped to establish and fund this scholarship.

Scholarship awards are based on charges for tuition, room and board*, books and supplies. The annual amount of the awards will vary based on charges imposed by the West Virginia college or university attended with a maximum limit of \$10,000.00 per semester.

Recipients shall be eligible for awards covering four (4) years of undergraduate study. Annual renewal of the award shall be based on the recipient's maintaining full-time enrollment, a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher and good citizenship.

Recipients are required to provide the Trustees with written confirmation of full-time enrollment, grade transcripts and documentation of other scholarships/grants to be considered for annual renewal of the award.

Citizenship status is confirmed directly by the Trustees. Certain scholarship allowances may be considered taxable income.

**Amount:**

If the McCormick recipient also receives a Federal PELL Grant and/or West Virginia PROMISE Scholarship, the value of the PELL or PROMISE award will be subtracted from the specific tuition and room and board charges.

*If “commuter status” is indicated by the applicant, the scholarship award will not include room and board allowances throughout the duration of the scholarship. Deadline:

February 20th – Scholarship application and all required supporting documentation must be submitted to the Guidance Department during the applicant's senior year.

Application Process:

The applicant must submit:

1. Scholarship Application Form
2. Two letters of recommendation.
3. Provide letter of acceptance to a post-secondary accredited school on a full-time basis.
4. Copy of grade transcripts through the first semester of senior year, attendance records and discipline records.
5. Essay on reasons the applicant feels they should be awarded this scholarship.
6. Provide proof of financial need.
7. Provide all supporting documentation listed on scholarship application form.

Selection Process:

Selection of award recipients is vested in the Trustees and is based solely on the eligibility criteria as defined in the scholarship trust.

The criteria for the selection of scholarship recipients is based on financial need, academic records, citizenship and other subjective factors.

Applications are reviewed without regard to race, creed, color or gender.

The number of awards to be granted each year shall be determined by the Trustees.

THE SCHOLARSHIP IS GRANTED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ROBERT W. MCCORMICK SCHOLARSHIP FUND WHICH PROVIDES SPECIFIC CRITERIA FOR THE SCHOLARSHIPS.

I. ELIGIBILITY: In order to be eligible for the Robert W. McCormick Scholarship, recipients must:

- a) Graduate from "a high school located in Jefferson County, West Virginia",
- b) Graduate from such high school with a "B" average,
- c) Demonstrate financial need and good citizenship, and
- d) Attend a West Virginia public college or university on a full-time basis.
- e) Apply for PROMISE, PELL, WVHE Grant and additional scholarships that are available to the student.
- f) Provide documentation of other scholarships applied for whether or not received and accepted.

II. SCHOLARSHIP TERM: The scholarship may be renewed on an annual basis with a maximum term of four (4) years, or eight (8) semesters, of undergraduate study. In order for the scholarship to be renewed each academic year, the recipient must:

- a) Be enrolled on a full-time status,
- b) Maintain a "B" cumulative grade point average, and
- c) Must demonstrate good college citizenship.
- d) Attend a West Virginia public college or university on a full-time basis.
- e) Apply for PROMISE, PELL, WVHE Grant and additional scholarships that are available to the student.
- f) Provide documentation of other scholarships applied for whether or not received and accepted.

III. RECORDS AND DOCUMENTATION: The recipient is required to deliver the following records and invoices to the Trustees:

• By July 31st prior to the start of each academic year:

- a) Documentation of continued full-time enrollment;
- b) Documentation of cumulative grade point average;
- c) Documentation of other scholarships or grants accepted by the recipient;
- d) Original (or copy) invoice(s) for the first semester tuition, room and board;
- e) Documentation of other scholarships applied for whether or not received and accepted.
- f) If living off-campus, documentation that the landlord is not a relative and a copy of his/her lease agreement.

• By December 10th (or within 10 days of issuance by the college):

- a) Documentation of continued full-time enrollment;
- b) Documentation of cumulative grade point average;
- c) Original (or copy) invoice(s) for second semester tuition, room and board;
- d) Documentation of other scholarships or grants accepted by the recipient.
- e) Documentation of other scholarships applied for whether or not received and accepted.

IV. SCHOLARSHIP COVERAGE and VALUE:

- **THE SCHOLARSHIP PROVIDES COVERAGE FOR THE FOLLOWING:**

- a) An amount not exceeding the actual cost of **TUITION**;
- b) An amount not exceeding actual **ROOM AND BOARD** charges; and
- c) A **BOOKS AND SUPPLIES ALLOWANCE** based on the **average costs** for books and supplies as reported by West Virginia public colleges or universities.

*****Beginning in 2021 all new recipients will have a cap value of \$20,000.00 (or \$10,000 per semester) each school year for the term of their scholarship.***

- **CHARGES NOT COVERED BY THE SCHOLARSHIP, include, but are not limited to :**

- b) Charges for dormitory linen-service, parking fees, and other miscellaneous fees;
- c) Additional supplies or charges for science, music, art, or other course-related "lab" fees, unless billed as tuition or lab fees;
- d) Any charges imposed by the institution not invoiced as specific tuition/lab-fees, room & board; or housing charges significantly higher than average; or
- e) Any other charges deemed by the Trustees to be extraordinary.

V. ROOM AND BOARD ALLOWANCE:

The "Room and Board Allowance" shall be based on standard "double-occupancy" or other customary accommodation status as defined by the institution. If the scholarship is awarded under **"COMMUTER"** status, (as elected by the recipient in the filing of the scholarship application) the room and board allowance will **not** be paid through the duration of the scholarship, even if the recipient later desires dormitory or resident status. The Trustees will consider a change from "commuter-status" to "dormitory-status" (for students initially electing commuter-status) only for situations and conditions which are beyond the student's control. Payment for **OFF-CAMPUS LODGING** may be granted, in an amount determined by the Trustees, if college or university accommodations are limited or the Trustees deem such off- campus housing appropriate (on a case by case basis). No allowance will be granted for off-campus accommodations provided by a relative. The room and board allowance may be taxable to the recipient.

VI. BOOKS AND SUPPLIES:

The "Books and Supplies Allowance" will be an amount equal to a value determined by the Trustees to represent an average books & supplies allocation as documented by respective West Virginia public colleges and universities. The cost of the items noted at Section IV (d & e) are considered a part of the books and supplies allowance.

If, at any time, the recipient elects to **TRANSFER** to another West Virginia public institution, the amount or percentage of the (1) tuition, (2) room and board, and (3) books and supplies allowances may be modified. The Trustees may modify and/or provide additional requirements governing the value of the scholarship allowances, and the payment thereof.

If the **McCormick** recipient also receives a Federal **PELL GRANT**, West Virginia **PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP** or **WEST VIRGINIA HIGHER EDUCATION AWARD OR ANY ADDITIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS** the value of the PELL or PROMISE or West Virginia Higher Education or Additional awards will be: Subtracted from the specific tuition and room and board provided by the **McCormick** scholarship. Award values will be adjusted for **PROMISE** awards beginning in the 2003-04 academic year, and for **PELL** awards beginning in the 2004-05 academic year, and for the **WV Higher Education Award** beginning in the 2008-2009 academic year and for the **additional Scholarships** beginning in the 2021-2022 academic year. The **McCormick** scholarship shall not be obligated for, and does not guarantee, replacement of the value of any terminated **PROMISE** or **PELL** or **WV HIGHER EDUCATION or any additional Scholarship awards**.

***All recipients are required to apply for as many scholarships that are available to them. By doing so, you are helping to ensure the McCormick Scholarship is available for students for years to come.*

VII. PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP ALLOWANCES:

The Trustees will issue checks each semester directly to the recipient's WV college/university upon receipt of the required documentation. Individual checks will be issued for 1) the books and supplies allowance (payable to the student), 2) tuition (payable to the recipient's WV college/university for the benefit of the recipient) and 3) room and board (payable to the recipient's WV college/university for benefit of the recipient). The student should allow 3 days for the processing of the allowance and delivery of the checks to the recipient and/or recipient's WV college/university. If granted, payment of off-campus lodging and board will be made each semester, in a single sum, directly to the recipient. Scholarship award payments for the first semester will be delivered in August, with the second semester award payments being provided in December or January.

VIII. TERMINATION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP:

The scholarship will lapse upon the earliest of:

- a) The recipient's failure to hold a cumulative grade point average of "B" (***minimum of 3.0 on a 4.0 system***) at the start of each academic semester. Provided that:***
 - If the recipient's GPA is less than 3.0 at the end of an academic semester, the recipient may elect to work toward the minimum 3.0 GPA:***
 - 1) By holding a GPA of 3.0 or greater at the end of the next academic semester.***
- b) The receipt of 4 academic years (8 semesters) of undergraduate scholarship awards.***
- c) The determination by the Trustees that:***
 - The recipient's failure to be enrolled full-time for a period longer than one semester is not for extraordinary reasons.***
 - The recipient's failure to provide GPA records, invoices, schedules, and completed renewal applications by the required dates was not for extraordinary reasons.***
 - The recipient has violated the intended tenets of citizenship.***
 - The recipient's failure to apply for and disclose to the Trust all their scholarships, awards, grants and funds available to the student.***
 - Failure to turn over refunds to the Trust.***

8. Any applicant receiving a full, paid scholarship from another source will become ineligible for this scholarship.



Amount

Tuition, books, and other direct school expenses up to \$1,000 per semester (\$2,000 maximum per year) will be paid to the school in the student's name. The student must maintain a full-time (12 hour) schedule. The scholarship is renewable annually up to three additional years with letters of application, transcripts, 2.5 GPA or higher maintained, and approval of the Jefferson County Farm Bureau Board of Directors. The total amount of the scholarship is not to exceed \$8,000 or be given for more than four years to one recipient.
