Students needing tech service on a school-issued device at Nacogdoches High School will likely have the Chromebook repaired by... a fellow student. Six NHS seniors in Practicum of IT, taught by Anna-Lisa Wanack, are spending a couple hours a week working on the Chromebooks of fellow students, servicing both software and hardware problems in a help desk set up in the school's library. The students launched their program a couple months ago after undergoing training provided by Jayce Park, David Gilcrease and Ben Harris from NISD's Technology Department. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, the Practicum students arrive in the NHS library and grab a stack of the laptop computers waiting on them. They begin matching up the devices with work orders already entered into the district's online ticketing system that assigns computer and technology repairs to staff. And beginning next month, Ms. Wanack is going to expand the program with more IT students. I should also mention that NacSpace donated individual tool kits for the students to use: five of the kits are going to the Practicum of IT class and three are going to robotics. This is a great program... and thanks to NacSpace for the generous donation of tool kits!

Fourteen projects involving 21 Nacogdoches High School seniors and members of the Stephen F. Austin State University STEM Academy displayed their work yesterday during the Science and Engineering Fair held in the Malcolm Rector Center for Advanced Careers & Innovation. Projects exhibited by students involved fields related to Animal Science, Plant Science, Microbiology, Materials Science, Sustainable Materials and Design, Engineering Technology: Statics and Dynamics, Systems Software, and Mathematics. The projects represent the culmination of two years of work and are the students' final assignment as graduating members of the STEM Academy. Let me say this... these projects were accomplished and represent well thought-out reasoning and research conducted by... high school students. It's impressive work, and represents the level of talent and ability we have in Nacogdoches ISD. Our students do great work...

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And along those same lines, we've had a number of fine arts performances this month, obviously Christmas-themed. The same thoughts apply here... our students are so talented. Last week, we saw the Raguet choir perform in this building – and at Rotary, keeping alive a tradition that dates back to 1944 – during our ribbon cutting for this facility, the choir from McMichael performed, and on Monday, the combined bands from Nacogdoches High School and McMichael Middle School held their annual Christmas concert. These are just a few of the events that have taken place, but the performances are so well done. All of this reminds me that, like I've said before, everything we need is in place – talented students and staff – for Nacogdoches ISD to be the flagship school district in East Texas. I know we can do it!

And, finally, here's some more good news for students and staff: Nacogdoches ISD will begin the Christmas break with an early release for students on Friday, Dec. 19. NISD will be closed for Christmas break Monday, Dec. 22, through Friday, Jan. 2. Teachers and staff return on Monday, Jan. 5, for a work day and professional development while students will return to classes on Tuesday, Jan. 6.
