Milford, Connecticut is a beautiful shoreline community with 22 sq. miles of land area and 17 miles of New England coastline. With a population of just over 52,000 (2016) and located midway between New Haven and Bridgeport, residents enjoy the convenience of major thoroughfares located within our city: I-95, the Merritt Parkway (U.S. Rte. 15), and Metro North. Milford is in the midst of an economic renaissance and was named one of only 2 cities in Connecticut to show a growth in population, year over year (2017). The city has a strong, educated work force, specifically in the areas of energy, manufacturing and technology. Education is a primary focus of residents here with 8 elementary schools (PK-5), 3 middle schools (6-8), 2 high schools and 1 alternative high school (9-12) in operation.



Jonathan Law High School is a vibrant, comprehensive high school, serving students in grades 9-12. The school has 849 students with 101 faculty members. Along with a deep cadre of academic courses available, students at Jonathan Law also enjoy a wide offering of athletics, clubs, and leadership opportunities.

All levels offer a rigorous curriculum aligned to core standards.

- 0.3 credits in performance-based standards (in writing, mathematics and reading)

### GRADUATION HONORS

At Jonathan Law, a valedictorian and a salutatorian are named each year, based on class rank.

Students achieving academic excellence receive special notation in the graduation program (Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, Summa Cum Laude). A total of 52 students received this academic distinction in June 2020.

In addition to academic achievement, students may earn a special Graduation With Distinction designation for giving a minimum of 200 hours of volunteer service to the community. In June 2020, a total of 45 students fulfilled or exceeded the 200 hour requirement.

### PROGRAMMING

#### COLLEGE & CAREER PATHWAYS

Jonathan Law High School offers three powerful *College & Career Pathways*; one in *Computer Science*, another in *Business Management/Entrepreneurship*, and the most recent addition, *Civic and Global Engagement*. A *Pathway* is a collection of related courses, across the disciplines, which are connected to a specific career path. Students with an interest in these fields are able to delve deeper into content and emerge with strong, college and career-ready skills. A student-driven cumulative presentation is required at the completion of the pathway.

#### UCONN Early College Experience Courses

In addition to the 26 Advanced Placement® courses offered at Law, students may also choose to take courses for UCONN ECE credit. These challenging courses allow students to preview college work, build confidence and earn college credits, providing an academic and a financial head start for post-secondary work. UCONN ECE instructors are high school teachers certified as adjunct professors by the University. The ECE courses are offered in mathematics, science, and social studies.

#### CAPSTONE PROJECTS

Students are encouraged to synthesize their learning in a final Capstone project. This culminating piece of work requires students to propose a project of their choice to their teacher, complete with a timeline of content to be achieved, and a final presentation of project learning. Currently, all three Pathways incorporate the delivery of a Capstone project.

#### SENIOR INTERNSHIPS

To encourage inquiry into future occupations at a deep level, seniors are able to participate in the Senior Internship Program. Interns are given the opportunity to work in a professional capacity at a wide variety of local supporting businesses while receiving high school credit. The program is in its 7<sup>th</sup> year.

## STANDARDIZED TEST PERFORMANCE (COVID-19 STATEMENT)

On March 16, 2020, the Milford Public School district pivoted to a distance learning format for education delivery due to the national COVID-19 pandemic. Classes continued to meet using a combination of asynchronous/synchronous scheduling that enabled greater flexibility, fluidity, and individualized pacing, while using a variety of web-based learning systems and discussion platforms. MPS students were able to complete Q1-Q3 prior to transitioning to distance learning. Grading for Q4 was changed to pass/incomplete, with grade notations supplemented by extensive teacher comments during distance learning. The 2020-21 academic year began on 9/8/2020 using our Tier 1, hybrid format. In-person instruction will occur in our school buildings M/T/Th/F, with a shortened day (5 hours). High school class periods will be 1-hour in duration, with brief Advisory breaks in-between. The schedule will follow

an AB/AB format with regard to the classes running each day. On Wednesdays, all Milford Public School students will participate in online synchronous learning. All 8 class periods will run remotely on Wednesdays at the high school level in 30-minute blocks.

#### SAT Data Not Available

Due to the unusual circumstances connected to the COVID-19 environment, our normally-scheduled SAT Day for students in Grade 11 did not take place in the spring of 2020. The CT State Dept. of Education received formal approval from the U.S. Dept. of Education (3/27/20) to waive all summative testing for the 2019-20 school year. As a result, **schoolwide SAT data is not available in this year's High School Profile.**

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT®

In an effort to encourage and afford access and opportunity to all students, enrollment in an Advanced Placement® course is non-restrictive. In Milford, we are fortunate to offer 26 AP® courses for our students, beginning in Grade 10. The district encourages students to take at least one AP® course during their high school careers. We believe students who take an AP level course not only can gain accelerated status (or financial advantage) at a post-secondary institution, but also will improve their overall study skills/habits – translating to improvement in academic performance in *all* courses taken, (whether AP® or not).

Educational Center for the Arts: Students who are talented and gifted in the Performing and Visual Arts (theater, music, dance, visual arts and creative writing) may attend classes at the Audubon Street Arts Center, located in New Haven.
