Community & School

New Rochelle is an economically diverse, suburban city of 79,726, located along the shores of the Long Island Sound in southern Westchester County, just miles north of New York City. Neighbored by the villages and towns of Eastchester, Larchmont/ Mamaroneck, the Pelhams, and Scarsdale, New Rochelle ranks as the seventh largest city in New York.

New Rochelle High School is dedicated to developing responsible, respectful, welcoming citizens who value cultural diversity and possess the intellectual, social and emotional resilience to become lifelong learners and contributing members of a global society. New Rochelle High School seeks to leverage, engage, and enrich the multiple perspectives and interests of its broad student demographic of approximately Hispanic or Latino 54.9%, Black or African American 20.7%, White 18.9%, Asian 3.9%, Two or more races 1.5%, Native American or Alaska Native .2%, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander .03%. New Rochelle's only public high school stands as one of the largest and most comprehensive in the state, offering an extensive array of academic and athletic programs across its two campuses and fostering a diverse range of educational opportunities within the community.

NRHS HIGHLIGHTS & PROGRAMS

- State-of-the-art facilities include a planetarium, a robotics lab, two combined soccer/football fields, a softball/baseball field, tennis courts, an outdoor track, two theaters, and the Museum of Arts and Culture (the only Regents-chartered museum in a NYS school).
- 31 College Board Advanced Placement courses offered across all subject areas including AP Capstone in ELA. In 2024, NRHS had 234 National AP Scholars.
- Comprehensive business program introduces marketing, accounting, business law, and sports management. Enrolled students have the potential to earn dual enrollment college course credit(s) and those who complete the Marketing program may earn a Career and Technical Endorsement on their diploma.
- Course sequence in architecture utilizes the latest technology to provide authentic, hands-on experiences. Students potentially earn dual enrollment college course credit(s) and are eligible for a Career and Technical Endorsement on their diploma.
- Science Research is an intensive, four-year program offering aspiring scientists the opportunity to conduct authentic independent research, work in the laboratory setting, and present findings at various annual symposia.
- The Performing and Visual Arts Education (PAVE) Program offers six areas of concentration in band, choir, dance, orchestra, theater, or visual arts to interested/ talented students to allow for deeper study. Upon completion of designated course work, students earn a special Performing Arts endorsement on their diploma.
- Students may complete special projects to apply for the NYS Seal of Biliteracy and/or NYS Seal of Civic Readiness diploma awards.
- Over 30 co-curricular and extra curricular clubs and activities including: Debate, Math Honor Society, Model Congress, Robotics, S.A.D.D., Ignite (peer-student mentoring and leadership development program), Robotics, The Huguenot Herald, academic honor societies, etc.
- The annual Latinx Youth Conference is an empowerment program run entirely by students for their peers to explore culture, leadership, self-growth, and professional opportunities. Inaugural Black Student Leadership Conference is in development for spring 2025.
- Approximately 20% of upperclassmen take advantage of Southern Westchester BOCES Career and Technical Education programs such as audio tech, cosmetology, nursing, etc. each year.
