# **ENROLLMENT POLICIES**

## **Graduation Credit Requirements**

El Dorado High School requires 26 credits to graduate. The specific requirements are outlined below.

## **Course Offerings**

Courses listed in this enrollment booklet may be canceled at anytime by the administration or if enrollment is not sufficient to merit a class. Course fees may be required and will be listed in the PowerSchool Enrollment Packet, or available from a counselor.

## **Kansas State High School Activities Association Eligibility**

Any student who wishes to participate in any KSHSAA activity (sports, music, cheerleading, etc.) must pass 5 new classes in the semester prior to the one they plan to participate in the activity. In addition, during the semester in which they are participating student must be enrolled in at least 5 classes. See your counselor if you need more information.

## **Senior Release**

*All seniors must enroll in a full schedule during the fall semester.* Seniors who are on track for graduation may enroll in senior release during the spring semester. If a student takes college classes during senior release time only those classes that have *prior concurrent credit approval and are listed on the student's class schedule will earn high school credit.*

## **Schedule Changes (Drop/Add Policy)**

There should be few requests to make a schedule change after the pre-enrollment process is completed. During pre-enrollment, students are requested to give careful consideration to course offerings. Students are encouraged to discuss their proposed schedule with their parents and parents must sign the pre-enrollment form. Please refer to the student handbook for more specifics on this topic.

## **Repeat Classes**

A student can earn credit only once for any high school class. Classes should not be repeated. Continued interest in a field of study should be reflected in a move to a higher-level class in the curriculum. Exceptions to this policy include performance, service, independent study or special projects classes such as: instrumental music, vocal music, upper level physical education, teacher assistant, and expanded learning.

## EL DORADO HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To be awarded a diploma signifying graduation from El Dorado High School, a student must have satisfactorily completed the appropriate number of credits according to the student's graduation year. To qualify for December completion, a student must be enrolled as a full-time student during the fall semester and submit a letter of request for early graduation along with a career plan to the Superintendent

## Qualified Admissions

The six state universities in Kansas--Emporia State University, Fort Hays State University, Kansas State University, Pittsburg State University, The University of Kansas, and Wichita State University--use the standards below, set by the Kansas Board of Regents, to review applicants for undergraduate admission.

### ACCREDITED HIGH SCHOOL

Freshmen applicants, aged 21 & younger, who graduate from an accredited high school, will be guaranteed admission to six state universities by meeting the Qualified Admissions requirements designated by each university, as follows:

#### ESU, PSU, FHSU, & WSU:

- ACT 21+ (SAT 1060) or Cumulative GPA 2.25+\*
- Cumulative GPA 2.0+ for College Credit earned in High School

#### K-State:

- ACT 21+ (SAT 1060) or GPA 3.25+\*
- Cumulative GPA 2.0+ for College Credit earned in High School

#### KU:

- ACT 21+ (SAT 1060) and Cumulative GPA 3.25+  
or ACT 24+ (SAT 1160) and Cumulative GPA 3.0+\*
- Cumulative GPA 2.0+ for College Credit earned in High School

### HOMESCHOOL & UNACCREDITED HIGH SCHOOL

Freshman applicants, aged 21 and younger, who are homeschooled or graduate from an unaccredited high school will be guaranteed admission to the six state universities by achieving an ACT score equivalent with those outlined above, per each university. If you enroll in college courses while in high school, it is also required that you achieve a 2.0 GPA or higher in those courses.

*\*If you do not meet the qualified admission requirements, you are still encouraged to apply. Your application will be reviewed individually. Contact the university admissions office for more information.*



# KANSAS BOARD OF REGENTS

## Kansas Scholars Curriculum & State Scholar Quick Facts

Completion of the Kansas Scholars Curriculum is one of the requirements Kansas residents must meet in order to receive State Scholar designation. This occurs during the senior year of high school.

### What are the other requirements to become a State Scholar?

- Students must have taken the ACT between April of the sophomore year and December of the senior year.
- Students must be a Kansas resident.
- Students must have their curriculum and 7th semester GPA certified on the official roster by the high school counselor, registrar, or similar official.

## KANSAS SCHOLARS CURRICULUM

### English - 4 years

One unit to be taken each year. Must include substantial recurrent practice in writing extensive and structured papers, extensive reading of significant literature, and significant experience in speaking and listening.

### Mathematics - 4 years

Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, and one unit of advanced mathematics-- suggested courses include: Analytic Geometry, Trigonometry, Advanced Algebra, Probability and Statistics, Functions or Calculus. Completion of Algebra I in 8th grade is acceptable for the Kansas Scholars Curriculum.

### Science - 3 years

One year each in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics, each of which include an average of one laboratory period a week. Applied/technical courses may not substitute for a unit of natural science credit.

### Social Studies - 3 years

One unit of U.S. History; minimum of one-half unit of U.S. Government and minimum of one-half unit selected from: World History, World Geography or International Relations; and one unit selected from: Psychology, Economics, U.S. Government, U.S. History, Current Social Issues, Sociology, Anthropology, and Race and Ethnic Group Relations. Half unit courses may be combined to make this a whole unit.

### Foreign Language - 2 years

Two years of one language. Latin and Sign Language are accepted.

### What is the benefit of completing the Kansas Scholars Curriculum?

Students that complete this curriculum and meet the other requirements, may be designated as State Scholars, which makes one eligible to receive the Kansas State Scholarship as provided by the Kansas Legislature. The academic profile of recent scholars include an average ACT of 30 and an average GPA of 3.91. State Scholars may receive up to \$1,000 annually for up to four undergraduate years (five, if enrolled in a designated five-year program), based on financial need and the availability of State funds. Financial need is measured by federal methodology using data submitted on the FAFSA.

## ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

To play sports at a Division I or II school, you must graduate from high school, complete 16 NCAA-approved core courses, earn a minimum GPA and earn an SAT or ACT score that matches your core-course GPA.

## CORE COURSES

Only courses that appear on your high school's list of NCAA core courses will count toward the 16 core-course requirement; visit [eligibilitycenter.org/courselist](https://eligibilitycenter.org/courselist) for a full list of your high school's approved core courses. Complete 16 core courses in the following areas:

## GRADE-POINT AVERAGE

The NCAA Eligibility Center calculates your **grade-point average** based only on the grades you earn in NCAA-approved core courses.

- DI requires a minimum 2.3 GPA.
- DII requires a minimum 2.2 GPA.

## SLIDING SCALE

Divisions I and II use sliding scales to match test scores and GPAs to determine eligibility. The sliding scale balances your test score with your GPA. If you have a low test score, you need a higher GPA to be eligible. Find more information about sliding scales at [ncaa.org/test-scores](https://ncaa.org/test-scores).

## TEST SCORES

You may take the SAT or ACT an unlimited number of times before you enroll full time in college. Every time you register for the SAT or ACT, use the NCAA Eligibility Center code **9999** to send your scores directly to us from the testing agency. We accept official scores only from the SAT or ACT, and cannot use scores shown on your high school transcript. If you take either test more than once, the best subscore from different tests are used to give you the best possible score. - Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track to complete the required number of NCAA-approved courses and graduate on time with your class.

- Take the SAT/ACT and submit your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code **9999**.
- Ensure your sports participation information is correct in your Eligibility Center account.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your Eligibility Center account.

## 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE



- Complete your final NCAA-approved core courses as you prepare for graduation.

- Take the SAT/ACT again, if necessary, and submit your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code **9999**.
- Request your final amateurism certification beginning April 1 (fall enrollees) or Oct. 1 (winter/spring enrollees) in your Eligibility Center account at [eligibilitycenter.org](http://eligibilitycenter.org).
- After you graduate, ask your counselor to upload your final official transcript with proof of graduation to your Eligibility Center account.
- *Reminder:* Only students on an NCAA Division I or II school's institutional request list will receive a certification.

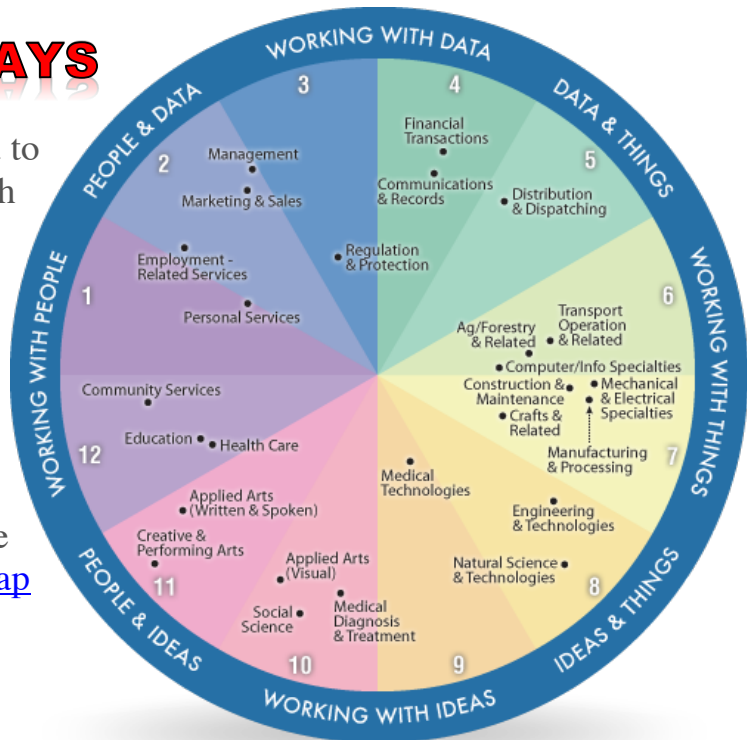

## BUTLER COMMUNITY COLLEGE COURSES

Concurrent classes, dual enrollment, and articulated credit courses are available at BCC. In addition, in 2012, the Kansas State Senate passed Senate Bill 155 (Excel in CTE), which authorizes Butler Community College to waive the cost of tuition for high school juniors and seniors who meet residency requirements for enrollment in any tiered career technical course. Textbooks, program fees and any other additional fees may apply. For more information, review the information below and contact a high school counselor.

### CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

*Concurrent enrollment courses are college-level courses taught by your high school teacher at your high school during the high school day. You can earn both high school and Butler credit upon successful completion of the course(s). You receive a letter grade on your official Butler transcript in addition to high school credit.*

### DUAL ENROLLMENT

*Dual enrollment courses are college-level courses taught by a Butler instructor. They may be taught at your high school, at a Butler site, or online. Dual enrollment may allow you to earn both high school and Butler credit upon successful completion of the course(s). You receive a letter grade on your official Butler transcript. You should work with your high school counselor regarding high school credit.*

*Enrollment in any Butler Community College dual credit course that is NOT offered at El Dorado High School (off-site) requires application and administrative approval. Students will need to visit with their counselor to discuss this option. All applications must be completed and submitted to the counseling office by the designated deadline.*

***Fall semester:*** Students must submit applications by the first Friday in May

***Spring semester:*** Students must submit applications by the first Friday in December

### ARTICULATED CREDIT

*Articulation Agreements between Butler and high schools allows you the opportunity to get college credit for information and skills learned in high school. For a list of the articulated programs see your high school counselor.*

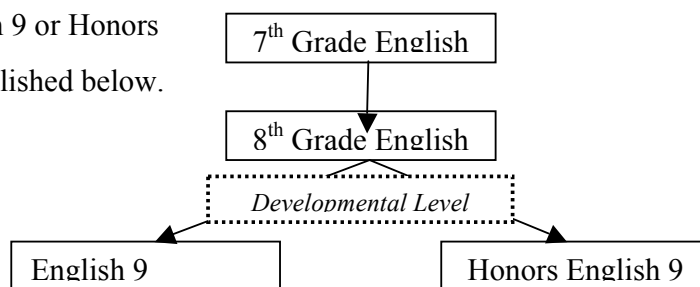

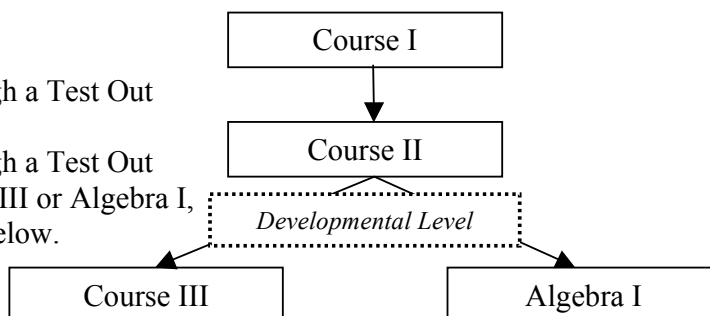

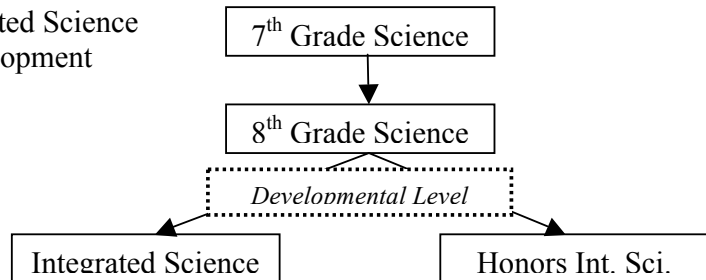
