ACT Prep Course

Our Juniors will take the ACT - American College Test, on Tuesday, April 21, 2026. This test is FREE of charge and will allow students to test in the subjects of Reading, English, Math and Science. This important test is a GREAT way to help students show off their academic skills and get more financial support - scholarships.

To prepare for the ACT, Juniors took the Practice ACT on Wednesday, February 11, 2026. The students' Practice ACT was scored and students will have an idea which areas they should focus on during the month of March. Juniors will also be working through a program called John Baylor's On to College which helps review academic and test taking skills before the assessment. On average, students who take this course will increase their ACT by 2-3 points. This could mean thousands of dollars in savings for parents and students and more opportunities for your student. Please encourage your Junior to keep practicing and preparing for the ACT.

Drivers Education

The Driver's Education Course started on February 24. The class will mostly be held after school for a duration of three weeks ending on March 12th. The class is a total of 30 hours of coursework and will be taught by instructor Paula Lammert.

Standardized Spring Testing Coming Up

MCA tests are also coming up in mid-April. Students will be practicing with some test taking strategies in the classroom leading up to the exam. Students in grades 6th (reading & math), 7th (reading and math), 8 (reading, math & science), 10 (reading & science) and 11th (math) will be taking the MCA Assessments. Canton Middle Level Festival Band






Wyett, Jayden, RG and Michael competed in the SW/WC welding competition held at MN West Jackson campus.

THE ABSOLUTE TRUE DIARY OF A PART-TIME INDIAN, BY SHERMAN ALEXIE

Growing up, there can be things that you never expect because you have to discover yourself in ways that you could never imagine. In “The Absolute True Diary of a Part-Time Indian” by Sherman Alexie, I found some connections because I never imagined myself where I am now. I didn’t know I’d move to America and go to school here, I thought I was going to be on the islands until I’m dead. The main character in the book, Arnold, grew up in an American Indian tribe and he went to school on the reservation most of his life but transferred to Reardan high-school. We both also came from broke families where the main difference is I’m Micronesian he’s Indian.

I like this book a lot because it has all kinds of emotions and I recommend only juniors and seniors to read this. It’s hilarious, sad, and it could also make you angry just by reading it. This “part-time Indian” kid was born with a “cerebral spinal fluid inside his skull” and the way he say it, is just funny. This kid is different for real, but with current technology he might just make it. The sad thing though is that they were very poor and they live on a reservation and he was the one that’s willing to take it as far as he can and that’s all because of his teacher Mr.P. I can relate to him because I also want to do whatever I can to give my family a great life. The way Arnold Spirit talks about his childhood is very raw and detailed and I think that’s what’s great about it. The way he talks about his junior year is real, some kids may not be able to handle it.

The author’s purpose shows that no matter where you are from you can still do things if you really put your mind to it. It also shows that things are not always easy, but in the long run it will get better, and putting yourself out there will be scary at first but once you tell yourself that you can do it, it will easily be up to you from that point on. The way I see it, it’s true: when I first came into America and went to school, I was nervous, scared, and the social anxiety was kicking in like crazy. The hardest thing was to learn English because that was not my first language. The first day of school nobody talked to me. The teacher tried. I was just nodding because I had no idea what to say back even though I did understand her. After that day, I forgot what my bus number was so I prayed. I walked up to the teacher and said, “Where...is...the...bus?” but it didn’t even sound like a question and yes there were long pauses after each word. Through all that though, I am here now and I think that’s just what this book is about. The more you put yourself out there the more you’ll know what’s going on and what’s to do. “Be comfortable with uncomfortable”.

This book is amazing and I highly recommend students in eleventh and twelfth grade read it because some people may find connection in it and some might just have a good laugh from it. An important quote from this book: “I forgive you. It doesn’t matter how much I don’t want to forgive you but I have to forgive you.”. God always forgives and it’s a sin to not forgive people when they do something wrong. Everyone makes mistakes and some people say “forgive and forget” Which is a good thing but forgetting things is not easy.

YOU LIKE IT DARKER, STEPHEN KING




