THE SCHOOL

Jensen Beach High School (JBHS) was founded in 2004 and graduated its first senior class in 2006. Jensen Beach High School is a comprehensive four-year high school with a current enrollment of 1,734 students. The school demographics are approximately 53% Caucasian, 30% Hispanic, 12% African American, and 5% varying races and ethnicities.

ACCREDITATION

JBHS is accredited by Cognia, the accredited organization for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI). JBHS was named 2020 U.S. News & World Report Best High Schools and 2018 & 2019 Florida Department of Education School of Excellence.

THE COMMUNITY

Spanning 543 square miles and 162,000 residents, Martin County is one of the nation's fastest growing suburban areas. Currently, the Martin County School District consists of three comprehensive high schools. Jensen Beach High School serves the northeastern area of Martin County to include Jensen Beach, Sewall's Point, and parts of the town of Stuart.

THE CURRICULUM

The academic program is currently organized on a seven 50-minute period schedule. In previous years, students took two 100-minute classes and three 50-minute classes daily. Seven credits per year is the maximum course load with credits being earned by semester. The academic year is divided into two semesters, each approximately 18 weeks in length. Grades are accessible on-line via FOCUS (parent and student portals).

ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

Academic courses are offered at a level of rigor appropriate for preparing students for the level of post-secondary education that best fits their needs, abilities, and career goals. Our levels of rigor range from Honors in all core subjects to dual enrollment opportunities through Indian River State College (IRSC) with three IRSC/dual enrollment courses offered on the JBHS campus to 26 Advanced Placement (AP) courses. JBHS is the only high school in Martin County School District to offer the AP Capstone Diploma and offers AP courses both in core and elective subject areas. All sciences offered are laboratory sciences. World Language includes Spanish and American Sign Language (ASL). All JBHS students are encouraged to complete a career technical program of study to allow every student to graduate from high school with skills that can provide further post-secondary education and employment opportunities. Career technical programs include Civil & Structural Drafting, Digital Video Technology, Engineering, Entrepreneurship, Hospitality & Tourism, Medical – Nursing Assistant, and Medical – Exercise Science.
