About Southwest High School & Our Community

Washburn is a small rural town with a population of approximately 414 people, located in Barry County, Missouri, about 30 minutes north of the Arkansas border. It is one of the oldest towns in the county. The Southwest R-V School District, which is fully accredited, serves the community and operates on a single campus in Washburn. This campus educates around 700 students from kindergarten through 12th grade across four buildings: Lower Elementary, Upper Elementary, Middle School, and High School. Students from neighboring towns such as Washburn, Seligman, Cassville, Exeter, and Pineville often travel 30 to 45 minutes to attend school in the district.

Dual Credit and Dual Enrollment at SWHS

Our students have the opportunity to take one in-person Dual Credit class during their senior year, taught by our Communication Arts teacher, Mr. Voyak. Additionally, students can enroll in Dual Enrollment courses through Crowder College at a cost of approximately \$186 per 3-credit course. This year, students were also able to take dual enrollment courses through Ozark Technical College, Missouri Southern State University (MSSU), and Missouri State University (MSU). Students can begin taking Dual Enrollment courses as early as the summer after their freshman year.

Although the cost of these courses can be a barrier for some students, approximately 19% of our 10th-12th grade students are still able to take dual credit courses.

We Partner with Scott Regional Technology Center

Thirty of our junior and senior students have the opportunity to travel to Monett, MO, to attend the Scott Regional Technology Center. While there, they can earn technical certifications, dual credit, and articulated credit.
