We need Bus Drivers & Cafeteria Supervisors!




Making 'Room' For Improved Communication!

Medication Reminders:

All medication must be dropped off in the main office by an adult.

Medication must have a doctor's note or medication authorization form in order to be given at school.

Medical forms needed for the 2025-26 School Year

All incoming Kindergarteners need:

- 1. Dental exam on State of IL school form
- 2. Eve exam on State of IL school form
- 3. Physical exam on State of IL school form
- 4. Kindergarten immunizations

All incoming 2nd graders need:

1. Dental exam - on State of IL school form

All incoming 6th graders need:

- 1. Dental exam on State of IL school form
- 2. Physical exam on State of IL school form
- **A sports physical does not meet the state requirement for the 6th grade physical exam. However, the 6th grade physical can be used for a sports physical if needed.
- 3. Tdap and Meningococcal vaccines (on or after 11th birthday)

All exams must be conducted within one year prior to the start of the incoming school year. Forms can be submitted at any time but should be turned in no later than the first week of school in August.

Food Allergy Precautions

All student classroom snacks, party treats or other class-wide treats must be nut-free. Per teacher approval, students may be permitted to bring a nut-free snack for themselves to eat in the classroom. Food containing nuts may only be brought in student lunches and consumed in the cafeteria during lunchtime only. Designated nut-free

tables are available in the cafeteria for all grade levels. Students are not to share food at any time.

Party treats or birthday treats must be store bought and pre-approved by the teacher. See below for a list of ideas. Other treats may be approved only if clearly labeled as "peanut/tree nut free" or "made in peanut/tree nut free facility."

*NO FRESH BAKERY ITEMS (cupcakes, donuts, cookies, muffins, etc) unless specifically labeled by the manufacturer as nut free or manufactured in a nut free facility.

*Please check labels as manufacturing processes and ingredients can change

*Parents and teachers should communicate with each other about the child's food allergy and any special treats that may be distributed.




Program Overview


Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is the flagship program of The Dollywood Foundation, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit Tennessee organization. The Imagination Library is dedicated to inspiring a love of reading by gifting FREE books to children from birth to age five. The program is made possible through funding shared by Dolly Parton herself, and local Program Partners in the United States, Canada, United Kingdom, Australia, and the Republic of Ireland.

Inspired by her father's inability to read and write, Dolly started the Imagination Library in 1995 to serve the children of her hometown in Sevier County, Tennessee. Today, her program spans five countries and gifts over 3 million free, high-quality, age-appropriate books each month to children around the world. There is never a charge to families who participate in the program and it is open to all children under the age of five in geographic areas with operating programs.





These books are customized with the child's name and sent directly to their home from Dolly, creating a special gifting experience that makes reading exciting and lets the child know they are cherished.

Each year, our esteemed Blue Ribbon Book Selection Committee, a specially selected panel of early childhood literacy experts, is responsible for reviewing hundreds of potential titles for inclusion in Dolly Parton's Imagination Library.





Inspire children to love books and reading

Since 1995. Dolly Parton's Imagination Library has delivered millions of books to children in thousands of local communities in five countries. With the support of local funders, coordination by partners, and encouragement from community leaders and organizations, parents and educators spread the love of reading and engage children in the most fundamental skill necessary to succeed in life.



Why Invest in Early Literacy?

- Ninety percent of physical brain development occurs in the first three years of life, when a baby forms over 1 million new neural connections per second.
- When a young child enters kindergarten ready for school, there is an 82% chance that the child will master basic skills by age 11, compared with a 45% chance for children who are not school-ready.
- Later in life, at-risk children who do not receive high- quality early childhood experiences are 25% more likely to drop out of school. 40% more likely to become teen parents and 60% less likely to attend college.
- Investment in high-quality early childhood programs for at-risk children from birth to age five delivers a 7-10% annual return on investment through improved education, health, social and economic outcomes; increased productivity and the reduced need for social spending.

Having books in the home is crucial for a child's academic, social, and emotional development. Reading together fosters a unique bond between children and their parents or caregivers. The Imagination Library extends this impact globally by providing books to children worldwide, free of charge, nurturing their minds and hearts.




