Student Achievement

The Illinois School Report Card website has now been updated reflecting the new IAR cut scores for the test back in spring. They've added some really good sortable charts to compare achievement. You can see MGS's information linked here.

Overall for achievement:

- 71% of our students were proficient in Science
- 68% of our students were proficient in ELA
- 57% of our students were proficient in Math

Student growth percentile:

- 53rd percentile for Math (compared to 46th percentile last year)
- 45th percentile for ELA (compared to 47th percentile last year)

Summative Designation

ISBE also released their new summative designations for each school district. The good news is that MGS does not have any subcategories of students who fall into the bottom 10th percentile. The bad news is that we weren't in the top 10% of schools. Therefore, our summative rating remains "Commendable." The aggregate performance was similar to last year, but individual growth year over year wasn't as high. For a complete list of summative scoring metrics, click here.

Medication Reminders:

All medication must be dropped off in the main office by an adult.

Medication must have a doctor's note or medication authorization form in order to be given at school.

Medical forms needed for the 2025-26 School Year

All incoming Kindergarteners need:

- 1. Dental exam on State of IL school form
- 2. Eve exam on State of IL school form
- 3. Physical exam on State of IL school form
- 4. Kindergarten immunizations

All incoming 2nd graders need:

1. Dental exam - on State of IL school form

All incoming 6th graders need:

- 1. Dental exam on State of IL school form
- 2. Physical exam on State of IL school form
- **A sports physical does not meet the state requirement for the 6th grade physical exam. However, the 6th grade physical can be used for a sports physical if needed.
- 3. Tdap and Meningococcal vaccines (on or after 11th birthday)

All exams must be conducted within one year prior to the start of the incoming school year. Forms can be submitted at any time but should be turned in no later than the first week of school in August.

- 3. Give to the secretaries in main office



Food Allergy Precautions

All student classroom snacks, party treats or other class-wide treats must be nut-free. Per teacher approval, students may be permitted to bring a nut-free snack for themselves to eat in the classroom. Food containing nuts may only be brought in student lunches and consumed in the cafeteria during lunchtime only. Designated nut-free

tables are available in the cafeteria for all grade levels. Students are not to share food at any time.

Party treats or birthday treats must be store bought and pre-approved by the teacher. See below for a list of ideas. Other treats may be approved only if clearly labeled as "peanut/tree nut free" or "made in peanut/tree nut free facility."

*NO FRESH BAKERY ITEMS (cupcakes, donuts, cookies, muffins, etc) unless specifically labeled by the manufacturer as nut free or manufactured in a nut free facility.

*Please check labels as manufacturing processes and ingredients can change

*Parents and teachers should communicate with each other about the child's food allergy and any special treats that may be distributed.


