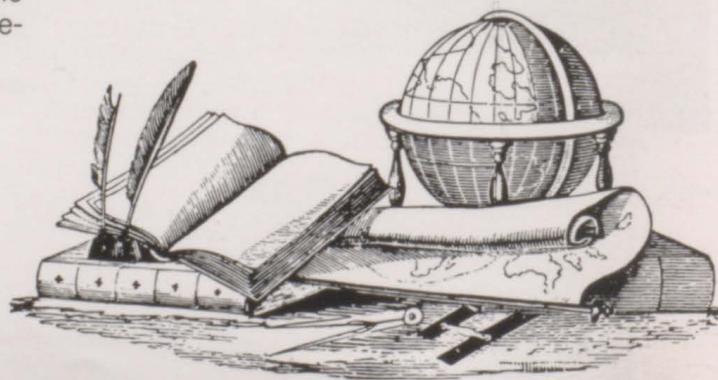
BADGER STATE AND

JEFF AND THE GIRLS



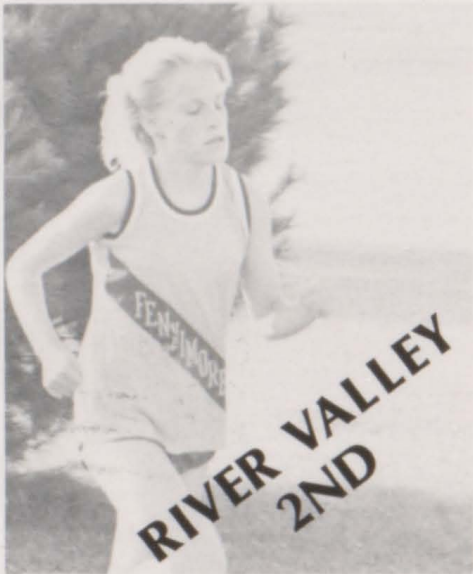
