2. PUBLIC FORUM

Mr. Tim McMurray shared with the Board that he is requesting letters of support for the parks program. There are four pocket parks in the village; Carosol, Lafayette, St. Joseph's and Veterans Parks. They are working to convert St. Joseph's Park to an ADA compliant, all inclusive with a senior focus, wheelchair access and exercise equipment. A feasibility study has been conducted and a good share of the population is sixty-five years of age or older. There is a large demand for movement. It is his hope that they will be able to eventually make all of the parks ADA compliant. They've started with St. Joseph's because of the walking distance and parking available. He inquired about the possibility of obtaining a letter of support from the Board for this parks program. They are reaching out to multiple agencies including AARP, Fit Lot, etc. It is hoped that the Village of Albion Parks Program will be the crown project. He indicated additional information, including photos, can be provided to the Board for their review. Mr. McMurray welcomed any suggestions and expressed appreciation for the Board's consideration.

5. **PRESENTATIONS**

- A. Academic Focus - Elementary School -
Eagles Nest News Crew - Mrs. Katie Reith,
Mrs. Shani Faraci and
Student News Crews

Mrs. Katie Reith, shared with the Board that she and Mrs. Shani Faraci are co-advisors for the Eagles Nest News Crew. The students' video news presentation would provide the Board with a glimpse behind the scenes. Mrs. Reith shared how proud she is of the creativity of these students and their willingness to step out of their comfort zone.

Student members of the news crew introduced themselves and shared that the first step in creating the Eagles Nest News was in selected a name. A list of names was created and narrowed to the best four selections. The fifth-grade students voted and the Eagles Nest News won by a landslide! The next step was learning to run the equipment. There were some mis-steps like hitting the wrong button; deleting the green screen; changing backgrounds; adding videos. Eventually, they figured it out and started making videos.

Student members from the News 1, News 2 and News 3 crews each spoke about something they enjoyed about being a part of the news crew. Members of the News 1 crew expressed how they enjoyed making videos and thanked their advisors for starting ENN; another student shared how difficult it is to say some names and learned it was okay to mess up because it helped him to help others and how he enjoyed the computer and changing backgrounds; another student shared the horrors of the green gap shirt that blended in with the background.

Student members from the News 2 crew shared that they check emails; teachers send pictures; news is reported on the announcements; things are scheduled on the calendar; emails are sent with anything to be shared. They write a script with their own ideas; one student member shares a Spanish word of the week and he shared the Russian word for "thank you." One student member enjoys using the teleprompter; another member shared that you need to stay focused and listen; one member was scared about memorizing; another found the hardest part was running the computer and learning how to down-

load images, jpegs and ping images; it's hard work and sometimes hard to do; and one member enjoyed training the new crew; another member shared that mistakes make you stronger; another shared to smile and be brave; and another found that it's important not to wear green. It's very busy in the newsroom.

Student members from the News 3 crew are new to the process and have just started. One member talked about announcing important dates to students such as birthdays; one member shared that practice is important and to just keep reading. Another student member shared that it's a lot of fun and there are special days like announcing tips for taking state tests and May 4th Star Wars day when he had to talk like Yoda. It wasn't an easy thing to do. One member shared that the news crew members received breakfast passes that enable them to skip the line. I-pads and microphones are used to record and upload videos and to interview students. One student member talked about Wellness Wednesday and the importance of being the Executive Producer which enabled him to learn maturity and responsibility. Another student member shared it's okay to make mistakes, to keep trying; another shared that teamwork gets the work done; one shared to always speak up; and another member shared enjoying the ability to take charge when needed, seeing kids and helping out.

Mrs. Faraci thanked the Board and shared how proud she is of the growth she has seen in the students.

B. Facilities and Safety Committee

Mr. Kast reported that the Facilities Committee met last week with Superintendent Edwards, Mr. Recckio and representatives from CPL and the Campus crew to discuss the Building Condition Survey. The state requires this survey to be done every five years to look at the condition of the roofs, drainage, plumbing, etc. This determines the areas to be included in the next capital project and the immediate needs.

Superintendent Edwards added that subcommittees will be formed comprised of teachers, parents, staff, students and community members. Priority is ranked on a scale of one to five with one being the highest. The subcommittee narrows down these priority items and provides input that is taken back to the Facilities Committee for consideration. It is anticipated that this information will be brought to the entire Board in August.

- E. Resolution Regarding Emergency Capital Project - High School Elevator - SEQRA

A RESOLUTION, DATED MAY 11, 2026, OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ALBION CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, ORLEANS AND GENESEE COUNTIES, NEW YORK (THE "DISTRICT") DECLARING THE DISTRICT'S PROPOSED EMERGENCY CAPITAL PROJECT INVOLVING NECESSARY AND IMMEDIATE MEASURES TO ADDRESS THE SIGNIFICANT AND UNEXPECTED FAILURE OF THE HIGH SCHOOL BUILDING ELEVATOR TO BE A TYPE II ACTION UNDER SEQRA

WHEREAS, the Albion Central School District, in Orleans and Genesee Counties, New York (the "District") is in the process of responding to the significant failure of the High School Building (the "Facility") elevator, with the work involved being anticipated to include, but not necessarily be limited to, a professional assessment of the severely damaged state of the elevator, and the implementation of measures to reconstruct or replace all mechanical

equipment and/or otherwise restore it to its proper condition, all in compliance with applicable statutes, regulations and standards, and all associated work thereto (the "Emergency Capital Project"); and

WHEREAS, the District's architect, CPL Architects, Engineers, Landscape Architect and Surveyor, D.P.C. (the "Architect"), has determined that the severe failure of the elevator at the Facility poses a health and safety risk to District employees and students and other users of the Facility, and recommends that the District pursue the Emergency Capital Project, with the approval of the Facilities Planning Unit of the State Education Department ("Facilities Planning"), to facilitate the immediate reconstruction/replacement of the mechanical equipment and/or otherwise restore the elevator to its proper condition, thereby allowing the Facility to be rapidly returned to its full intended function and ensuring the health and safety of District employees and students and other users of the Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Architect has specifically recommended that the District implement the Emergency Capital Project in general accord with certain more detailed information that has been presented to the Board of Education (the "Board") by the Architect in connection with the Emergency Capital Project; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with State Education Department ("SED") guidance and policy, the District and its Board of Education is the appropriate agency to be the lead agency to undertake Project review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"); and

WHEREAS, Section 617.5 of the SEQRA Regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617) provides that certain activities are Type II actions that are not subject to review under SEQRA and that such activities include "emergency actions that are immediately necessary on a limited and temporary basis for the protection or preservation of life, health, property or natural resources, provided that such actions are directly related to the emergency and are performed to cause the least change or disturbance, practicable under the circumstances, to the environment," "routine activities of educational institutions," "maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility;" and "replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site..unless such action meets or exceeds any [Type I] thresholds in section 617.4"; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Emergency Capital Project constitutes such emergency actions, routine activities of educational institutions; maintenance or repair activities; and/or in-kind, same-site replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction activities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it is the final determination that the District/Board is the lead agency for the review of the proposed action, that the proposed Emergency Capital Project is a Type II action, that is not subject to review under SEQRA, and the proposed action will not result in a significant adverse impact on the environment.

RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately.

Mrs. Weller participated in the Strategic Planning Committee meeting with Marla Iverson. Mrs. Iverson provided the committee with copies of the survey comments made by over three hundred participants. The packets of information contained both good and bad comments. The packets were collected following the meeting.

Superintendent Edwards added that the reason for collecting the packets was because some comments could be taken wrong if not read in context.

Mrs. Weller attended the Honors Convocation. She commented that this event is very well run and enjoyable to see the emotion of parents as they place the honor cords on each of the students.

Mrs. Weller also attended the National Junior Honor Society Induction.

D. Ex-Officio Student Board Member Report

Miss Phoebe Allen, student Board Member shared that she attended the Honors Convocation. It was nice to see her peers recognized and encouraging to see her friends achieve success.

Miss Allen attended the Stars of Tomorrow where performers perform for two minutes. There were forty-seven schools in attendance and each of the student participants was judged with some awarded for outstanding achievements.

Miss Allen attended Senior Citizen Day and reported that it was fun to interact with them. They wrote advice to students on cards as well as what they enjoyed most at the event.

Miss Allen shared that the Marching Band participated in their first parade at the Lilac Festival. She invited the Board to attend their performance on the football field on Thursday at 8:00 pm.

Mrs. Weller added that the Stars of Tomorrow is a great event. It is great to see the achievements of the students.

Mrs. Ashbery added that ACS placed in the Top 10 outstanding schools.

E. Assistant Superintendent for Instruction Report

Mrs. Manfreda reviewed with the Board the Annual Plans included in the Board's packet.

The Comprehensive Counseling Plan is reviewed annually. Mrs. Val Pettit attended a conference and has worked on revising the plan to align with updated guidance from the New York State Education Department. This document has been updated in its entirety.

The Special Education Plan has been updated by Mr. Brad Lehman. Any revisions made to the plan reflect additional student placements and updated budget information.

The Professional Development Plan had no changes made. The Board was provided with additional information regarding the New Teacher Induction and Mentoring Program which is part of the Professional Development Plan. Updates are anticipated to be developed in the coming school year.

The Code of Conduct had very minor changes made that are highlighted in the document.

The Athletic and Extracurricular Handbook had several changes that are highlighted. Athletic Director, Mrs. Lauren Kinard met with coaches, club advisors and held family sessions regarding attendance policy requirements. The document has been split into two sections. The athletic portion is in one and the extracurricular in the other.

The Instructional Technology Committee has updated the Instructional Technology Plan to reflect requirements from NYSED. This new plan will span three school years and has been accepted by NYSED.

The Professional Development Plan, the Code of Conduct and the Athletic and Extracurricular Handbook will be posted on the District's website for a 30-day public comment period, beginning May 1, 2026.

Superintendent of Schools, Mickey Edwards, shared that an ATA Retirement Dinner invitation scheduled on June 17th is available at each Board member's place.
