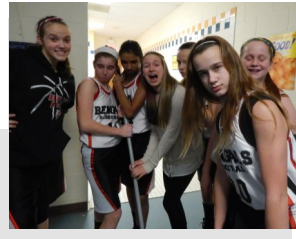

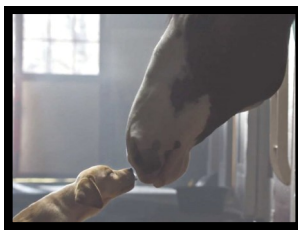

Will Technology Make Benjamin Students Smarter?

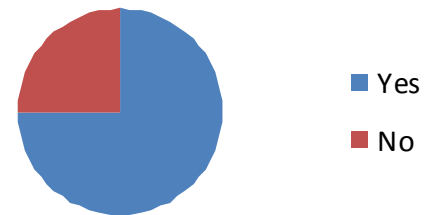

Some students might know that Benjamin Middle School will be receiving new Acer windows tablets for the students to help them learn better, but some studies show that technology does not make humans smarter.

An article in "USA Today" reports about a school in the Los Angeles Unified School District that began carrying out a \$50 million plan to equip 30,000 students in 47 schools from kindergarten through 12th grade with an iPad. Giving kids iPads sounds like installing candy machines on every desk, or worse, Xboxes. The educators disagreed when they spent \$678 per iPad and found out that student grades were dropping by an average of 21% (<http://www.usatoday.com/story/news/nation/2013/10/05/la-students-get-ipads-crack-firewall-play-games/2928351/>).

Another school district says that kids score better on larger screens than smaller ones. This might affect the grades or test scores of some of the students at Benjamin Middle School. Technology can make kids smarter if they use it correctly and educationally, but we'll have to see next year if students grades will increase or decrease.

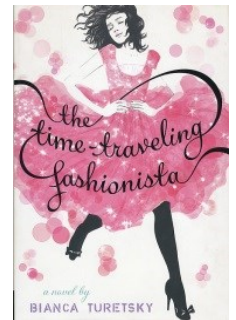


Book Review

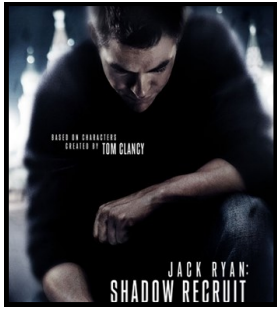

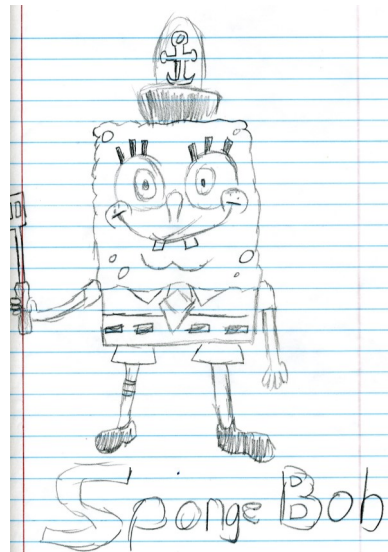


Jack Ryan Shadow Recruit

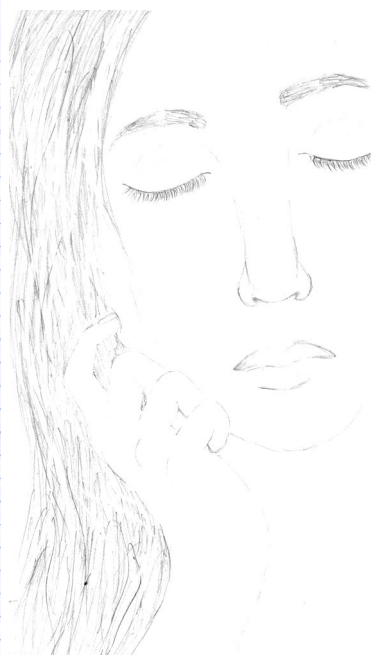

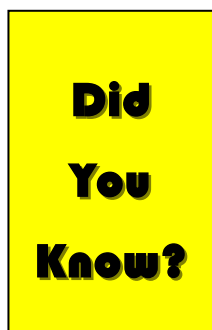

How many people are in your family? 4 people altogether. I have two boys.

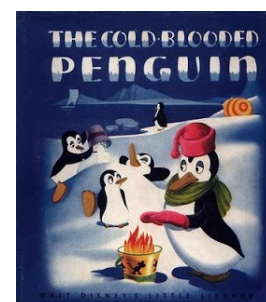
What's your favorite animal? Penguins

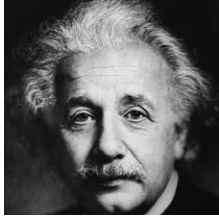
What's the craziest thing you have ever done? I went white water river rafting.

Born in Ulm, Württemberg, Germany in 1879, Albert Einstein developed the special and general theories of relativity. In 1921, he won the Nobel Prize for physics for his explanation of the photoelectric effect. Einstein is generally considered the most influential physicist of the 20th century. He died on April 18, 1955, in Princeton, New Jersey.

Philip Seymour Hoffman, By Meg Gee

Born in 1967 in Rochester, New York, actor and director Philip Seymour Hoffman was known for films such as *The Ides of March*, *Mission Impossible III* and the upcoming *Catching Fire*. He was also successful in theater, winning three Tony Award nominations for *True West*, *Long Day's Journey into Night* and *Death of a Salesman*. Hoffman died in New York City on February 2, 2014, at age 46.



Ernest Borgnine, By Meg Gee

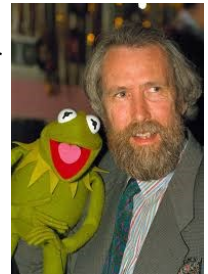


As a young actor, Ernest Borgnine debuted on Broadway in the 1949 play *Harvey*, which led to many appearances in early television shows. In 1951, he headed to Hollywood, where he made his feature debut in *The Whistle at Eaton Falls*. Two years later, he landed a role in *From Here to Eternity*, but he soon found himself typecast as an onscreen tough guy. He also played the role of Mermaid Man in the TV show *SpongeBob SquarePants*. In 1955, he was relieved to land the leading role of a sympathetic everyman in *Marty*. His prolific career acting in both movies and television spanned over six decades.

Jim Henson, By Eric Briggs

Jim Henson was born on September 24, 1936 in Greenville, Mississippi. From a young age, he was drawn to the arts. Because of his grandmother, a lover of painting, he got the ideas of simple designs that in later life inspired the Muppets. He loved TV. This is where he discovered his childhood hero, Burr Tillstrom. He was a boy scout and one talent night he was performing with his childhood friend Kermit Scott. This is the time when he learned he wanted to perform.

Jim Henson actually started his TV appearances when he was in high school on the morning show for kids. When attending the University of Maryland, working at NBC, he got a 5 minute show. He got his big break! The show was known as *Sam and Friends* and won a local Emmy. After a while, he stopped the show to start Muppet, Inc. In between the transition, he did a series of famous commercials for Wilkins coffee. And he also did a series of appearances on the Jimmy Dean show, with Rolf the dog, that you might know.

Walt Disney was born on December 5th, 1901, in Hermosa, Illinois. Walt Disney founded Walt Disney productions, which became one of the best-known motion-picture production companies in the world.
