Principal Reports	20 Min	M. Nehls	On October 7, Michele met with Mindy Hart from the Archdiocese to review the three key rubrics for our school: Catholicity, Academics, and Operational Vitality. During the meeting, several goals were identified for the coming months, with plans to review progress later in the year. • Academics: The focus will be on Professional Development Effectiveness and achieving 80% proficiency through MTSS. • Operational Vitality: Efforts will center on strategic planning with the school board, as well as implementing an enrollment and marketing plan.
			Catholicity: The team will work on enhancing service initiatives and developing a plan to

			fully embed Catholic Social Teaching into the religion curriculum. Additionally, a vocation plan will be established by the end of the school year. Michele is also collaborating with Jessie Nelson, Director of Special Education at the public school, to explore how St. Joe's can become independent in Special Education services beginning in the 2026–2027 school year. This transition would eliminate the need for students to travel between schools throughout the day or week.


church/rectory boilers and carpet replacement. The school boiler will also be reviewed for future needs.
