

Worked for a small development firm called DiGiorgio Development who had properties in the Anza-Borrego Desert. They flew me to their offices that year to deliver office equipment. That plane was a small one and we hit a lot of air pockets and I'm thinking I'm going to die delivering office equipment?? I will never forget when I heard the news that year memory typewriters and IBM mag cards. I was also in charge of two monthly events and the annual economic forecast conference. I worked there until Sept. 1992. I Got my first basic computer in 1990.

YEAR 1984

Got married on May 12, 1984 at the Lutheran Church in Point Loma, CA. First son, Brent Roberts born, February 1986. Second son, Scott Roberts, born, Sept. 1986. Sadly, I divorced in March 1994.

YEAR 1993

After living for 15 years in San Diego, I moved to Santa Barbara, CA to reside near my mother, Joyce, as she had stage 4 ovarian cancer. I wanted her grandchildren to know her, and I wanted to give her some bonding time with her grandchildren. Mom passed away in December 1997.

YEARS 1995 - 2005

I bought my own home in Lompoc, CA in 1995. Raised my children as a single parent from 1995-2005 (they were ages 7 and 4 when I divorced) We lived in Santa Barbara County for 25 years. 
CANDOR HISTORICAL SOCIETY
