

Legacy Tribute honoring the

Undefeated 1967 Mont Pleasant Football Team

- Played football at Mont Pleasant HS for Athletic Hall of Fame members Larry Mulvaney & Tony Parisi; ran track for Hall of Famer Ray Vacca
- Scored a touchdown when MP upset undefeated Linton 14-13 (Election Day-1962) in one of the most exciting games in the history of the cross-town football rivalry (Linton was led by Pat Riley & Mike Meola)
- Three-year starter; scored eight touchdowns as a junior
- ♦ Scored five touchdown vs. Kingston in 1963
- Led MP to the 1963 Class "A" League football title, scoring 16 touchdowns (including TD runs of 15, 16, 24, 30, 46, 59, 59 & 76 yards, TD receptions of 51 & 52 yards, kickoff returns for TDs of 86 & 91 yards and a TD on a 62-yard interception return)
- 1963 County scoring champion (96 points a record);
 Thom McAn Bronze Shoe Award winner; Union Star
 Player of the Year; First Team Five-County All-Star
- All-American running back in 1963 (Coach and Athlete Magazine)
- ♦ 1963 Section II 220-yard champion
- Scored eight touchdowns during his career at Boston College; injured for most of his sophomore year
- ♦ Leading BC scorer in 1966
- ECAC Division I All-East Weekly Team selection (November, 1968)
- Averaged 3.8 yards per carry & 17.2 yards per reception during his career
- Played professional football for the Quincy Giants, Boston (New England) Patriots farm team; Most Valuable Offensive Player (1969)
- Mont Pleasant Sports Hall of Fame member
- ♦ 2015 Capital Region Football Hall of Fame inductee

- Played golf at Mont Pleasant HS for Athletic Hall of Famer Sig Makofski; also played basketball for Hall of Famer Ray Vacca
- Second leading scorer, behind Hall of Famer Lou Jordan, on the 1954-55 MP basketball team
- Key member of the 1954 MP golf team that won the New York State Championship
- Won the Schenectady County Amateur Golf Championship at age 16
- Finished 8th in the Hearst National Junior Tournament in Baltimore, MD
- Won the 1960 Eastern New York Golf Championship at Shaker Ridge
- ♦ Golf professional at age 21
- Qualified for three U.S. Opens (1963-1965); missed the cut by two strokes (1963) & one stroke (1964)
- Played in one PGA Championship (West Palm Beach, FL)
- Competed on the PGA Tour (1966-67); made several cuts on the PGA Tour; led qualifying at Oklahoma City
- Held course records at Mt. Anthony (63), Schuyler Meadows (63) & Mohawk Golf Club (64); also held the record at Walhalla
- Two-time Northeastern New York PGA champion (1970 & 1979)
- ♦ Won numerous Northeastern New York tournaments
- ♦ Well-liked head pro at Walhalla & Mohawk Golf Club
- Inducted into the Northeastern New York PGA Hall of Fame in 2016



- Graduated from Linton HS in 1979
- Played basketball and was a track & field athlete (shot put & discus) at Linton
- 3-time National Champion (middleweight) U.S. Taekwondo Union
- ◆ 14-time National Champion (middleweight) AAU
- Participated in trials for the first U.S. Olympic Taekwondo Team in 1988 (first alternate)
- 1992 Pan-Am Taekwondo Championships gold medalist (middleweight)
- 2001 World Taekwondo Champion (Arnold Schwarzenegger Classic World Championships)
- 2003 & 2004 U.S. Martial Arts Hall of Fame inductee; New York Female Instructor of the Year (2003) & Master (2004)
- Fourth-degree black belt Kukkiwon, Korea
- ♦ Seventh-degree black belt AAU Taekwondo
- Won gold medals in U.S Cup Championships (represented the U.S. vs. Korea, Canada & Puerto Rico)
- Owner of Mechelle's Way Taekwondo (MW Taekwondo); respected instructor; also teaches a selfdefense course for women
