VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE ELECTION

Election Day: November 3, 2026

What is a VATRE?

A **Voter-Approval Tax Rate Election** is an election that allows voters to decide whether the school district can increase its Maintenance & Operations (M&O) tax rate above the amount allowed by state law without an election.

Unlike a bond election, a **VATRE** does not pay for new buildings or construction projects. Instead, it provides annual, recurring funding that can be used for the district's day-to-day operations, such as:

➤ **Staff Compensation**

➤ **Student Programs**

➤ **Safety & Security**

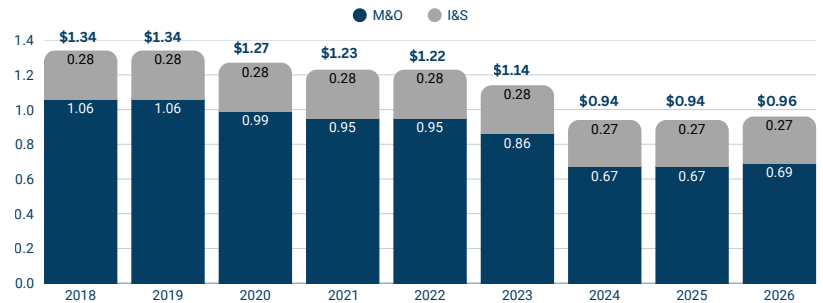
Homeowners aged 65 and older who qualify for a property tax freeze and have not made improvements that increase the taxable value of their residence, will not see an increase in the dollar amount of school district taxes they owe.

"Ratifying the ad valorem tax rate of \$0.9668 per \$100 valuation in the Bryan Independent School District for the current year, a rate that will result in an increase of 2.10 percent in maintenance and operations tax revenue for the District for the current year as compared to the preceding year, which is an additional \$5,595,641."

BRYAN ISD HISTORICAL TAX RATE



Bryan ISD's Maintenance & Operations (M&O) tax rate has decreased by approximately 36% since 2018, from \$1.06 to \$0.6769 in 2025.
