MISS PHYLLIS READ, Guidance Counselor, is usually busy with students inquiring about Maplewood JVS. She is always happy to help with any problems they have.





MR. JAMES CHASE teaches Geometry and 8th grade Science. He is also very active with the Mogadore Education Association.







MISS GRACE FLEMING teaches the Physical Education classes for grades 7 through 10. She is also the Girls' Athletic Director.





The second game of the season was against Field. This big "rivalry" was decided by turnovers. Mogadore had five big turnovers while the Falcons had four.

Our first league game was very disappointing. Penalties killed the Cats in this game. But the major disappointment was that the Cats couldn't get the running game to go along with the pass. Turnovers hurt the Cats in the Rootstown game.

Our defense had its best game of the season against the Garfield G-Men. The defense allowed only 40 yds. rushing and 25 yds. passing.

The next game was against Waterloo. Despite very poor field position the entire game, the Cats got 147 yds. rushing.


In playing against Windham, three big plays were the difference in the game. The Cats moved into the end zone and fumbled at the wrong time.

Playing against the undefeated leader of the PCL, Crestwood, the Cats gave the Devils all they wanted. The Devils earned a hard fought victory in the second half.

The turning point in the season took place against Streetsboro. After a shaky first half, the Cats dominated the game.

The Cats defeat of Southeast put them in a tie for third place with Southeast at 4-3. The highest point total of the season came as a result of five fumbles caused by the hard hitting defense.

Black River hosted the Cats in a game played in freezing snow. The Cats gave the Pirates their roughest game of the year. All in all this season was one to be proud of.



































Unfortunately, the judges didn't agree with the Juniors' opinion and awarded the float a mere third place. This action, however, led the Juniors to higher aspirations for next year.
