## The Fort Frye Community

The Fort Frye Local School District spans 165 square miles, located in the north-central part of Washington County and the Center Township area of Morgan County, Ohio. It serves the educational needs of the villages of Beverly, Lowell, Lower Salem, and the surrounding rural communities. As part of the Appalachian region, many of our students are the first in their families to pursue college education. The effects of the ongoing global economic challenges are reflected in our district's 50% rate of students qualifying for free and reduced lunch. Our local economy is supported by industries such as agriculture, construction, and tourism. Despite these challenges, our students demonstrate strong commitment to education, with a district-wide attendance rate of 94.8% and an impressive graduation rate of 97.1%. In the 2021-2022 school year, Fort Frye Middle School was established to serve grades 6-8, while Fort Frye High School now operates as a separate institution for grades 9-12.


## Grading Scale Accumulative GPA Ranking Calculation
