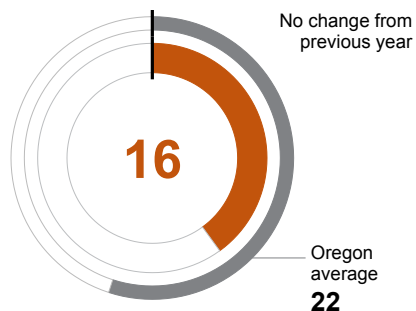

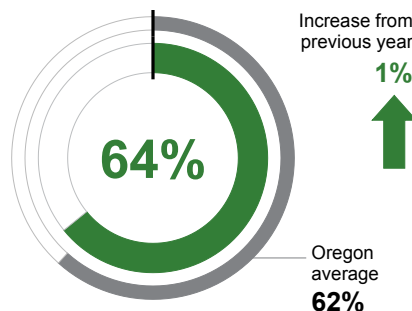
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

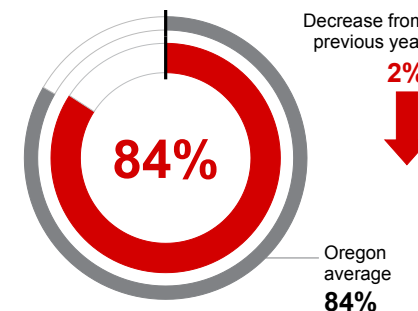

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

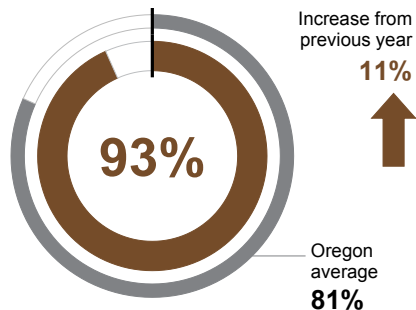
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

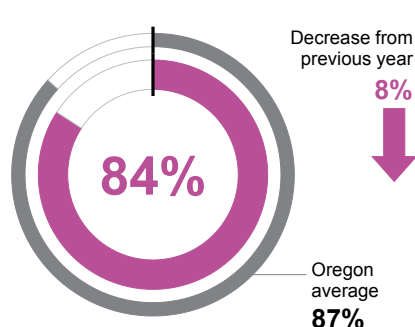
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.



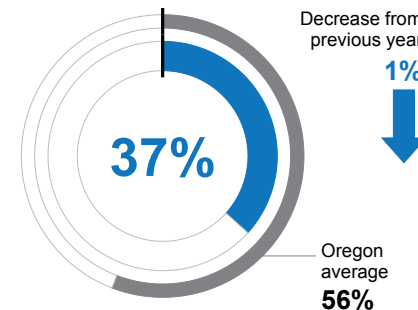
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Mohawk High School has a close partnership with Lane Community College, University of Oregon, Western Oregon University, and numerous agencies for the support of our (CTE) Career Technical Education and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Manufacturing) programs. Students at Mohawk have many opportunities to take courses virtually in addition to the classroom. All students have the opportunity to graduate with college credit and/or advanced CTE credit. Courses include: CTE Business, Anatomy and Physiology, Trade Skills Fundamentals, Writing 121, Writing and Literature, and more. Mohawk also actively participates in the Lane Early College program, dramatically increasing the course offerings for students.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Mohawk High School provides three complete CTE programs of study. Students who graduate from Mohawk High School can earn program certifications in: Construction, Agriculture, and Health Occupations. Our 13.5 acre farm is a learning lab for CTE programs, especially in the areas of Agriculture and Construction. We look forward to expanding our Farm-to-Cafeteria program this year. Our close partnerships with Lane County Industry also provides internship and pre-apprenticeship experiences for students.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Mohawk High School is a small rural school district, but we offer numerous athletic and academic extracurricular activities for our students. List of activities include: Football, Volleyball, XC running, Basketball, Wrestling, Golf, Softball, Baseball, Track, FFA, Speech and Debate, GSA, Drama, and Gaming. Most of our students are active in one or more of the activities we offer.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Our rural community is rich in history and pride in its local schools. This pride is reflected throughout campus, celebrating the contributions of alumni and community members. Parents and the community contribute greatly to the success of our Activities, Career and Technical Education, STEM and all extracurricular clubs. We have an active FFA program, and Booster Club that attracts numerous members of the community and parents. The school is the center of the community and almost all community activities take place in one or more of the facilities we offer.
