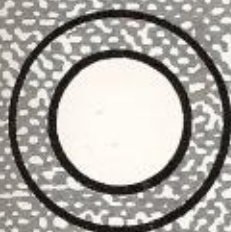

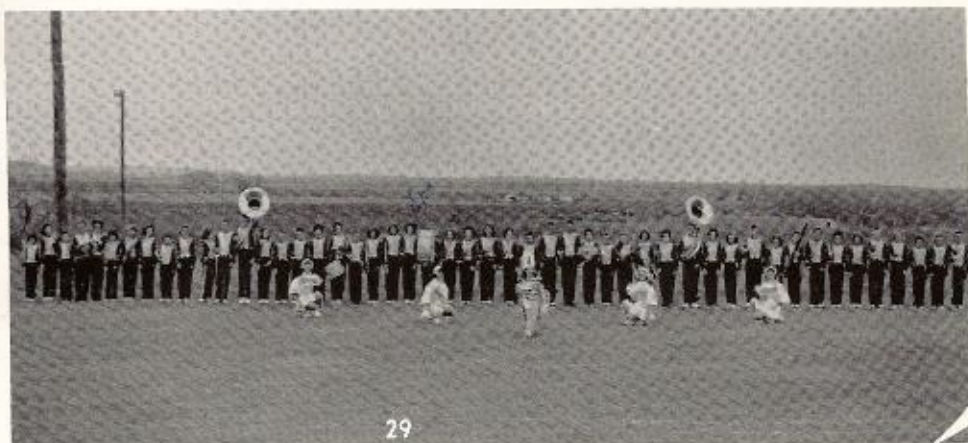

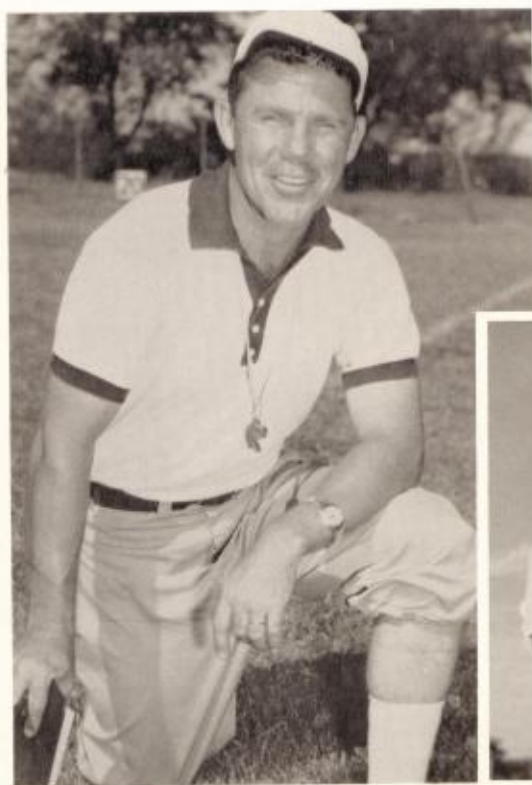

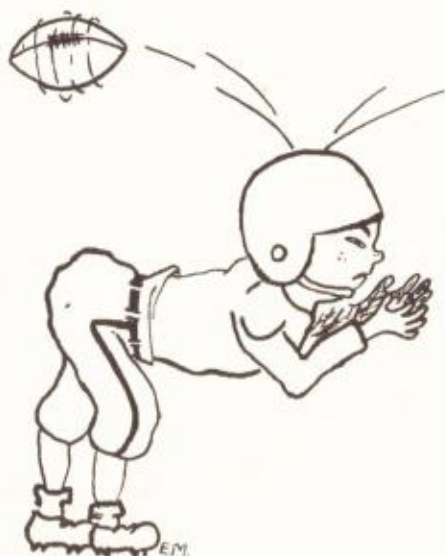


Bulldogs placed six players on all-district team

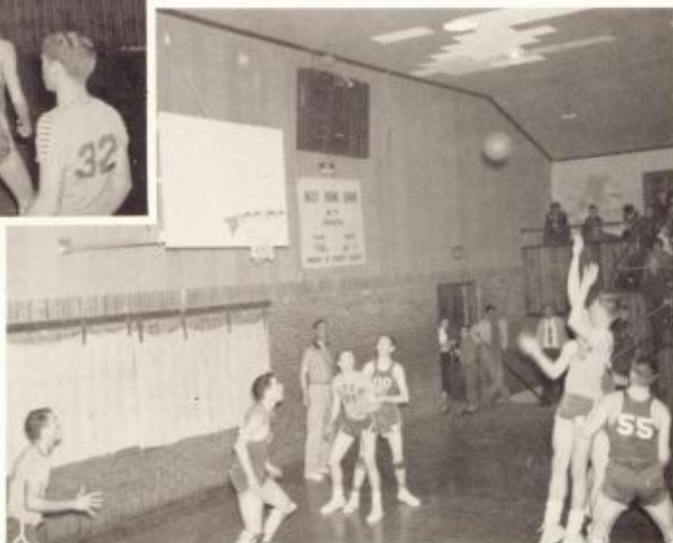

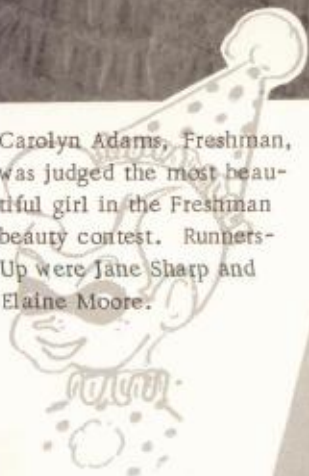

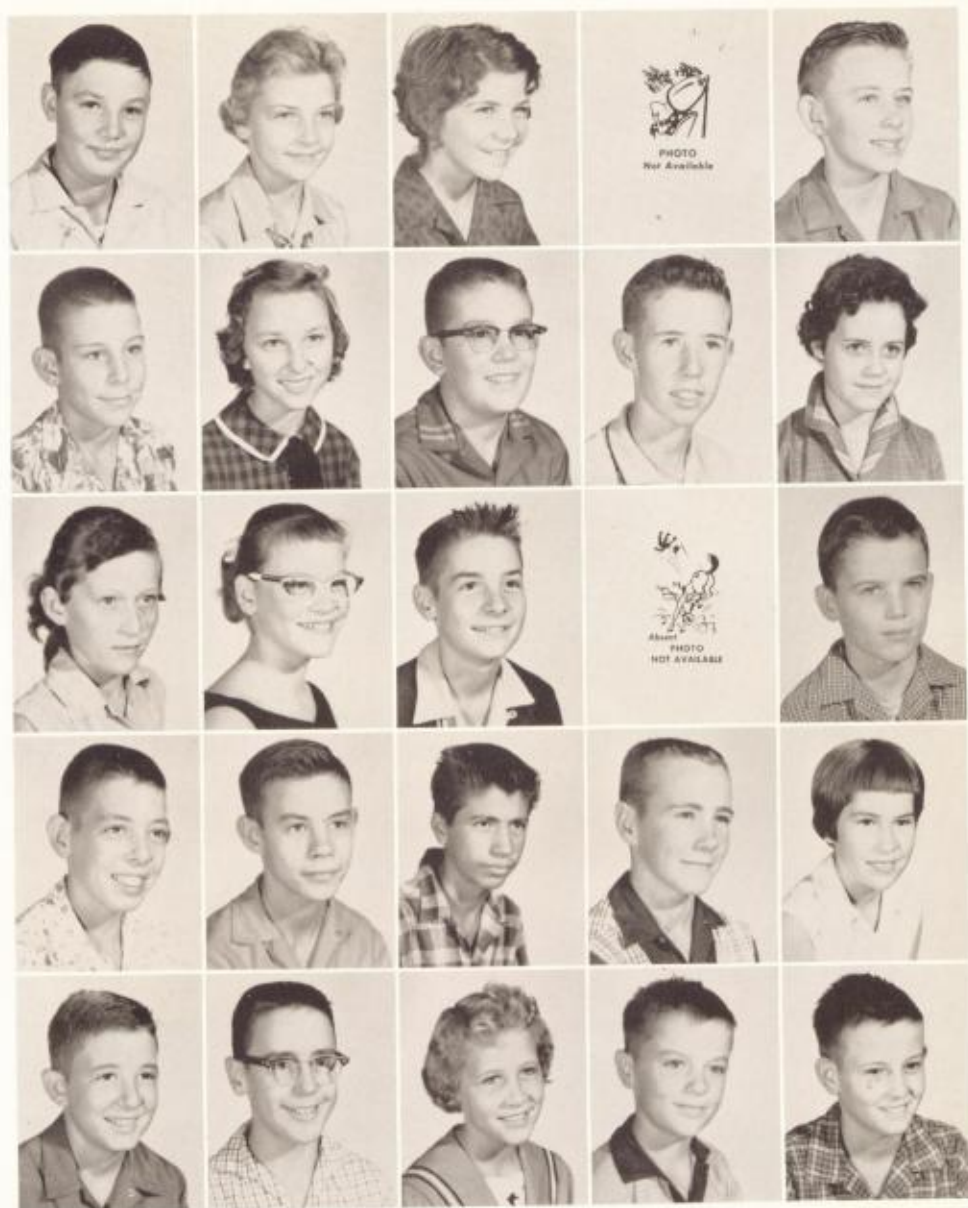
