Training Umpire Pay

For Baseball:

- \$40.00 per game for first weekend or 5 games minimum in the field.
- \$45.00 per game for second weekend in the field. \$50.00 for plates.
- \$55.00 per game for 3rd weekend field / \$60.00 plates.
- 4th weekend full pay. \$60.00

For Softball:

- \$35.00 per game for first date in the field.
- \$40.00 per game for second weekend in the field, \$45.00 per game for plates.
- \$45.00 per game for 3rd weekend field / \$50.00 (full pay) for plates.
