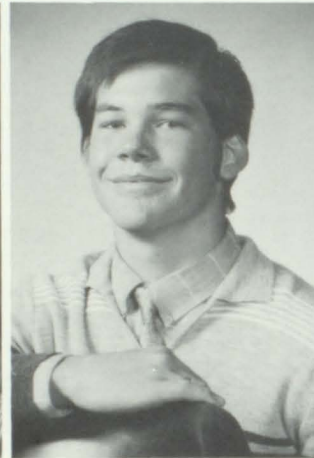

At times the work got to be too much and seniors had to kick back and relax, but their futures seemed to be on the minds of both the students

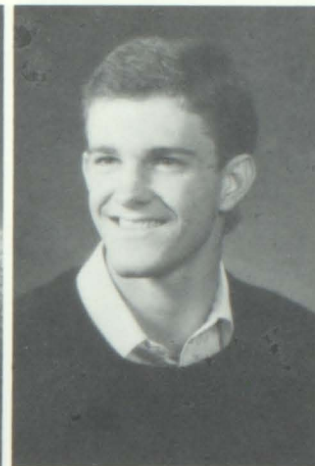
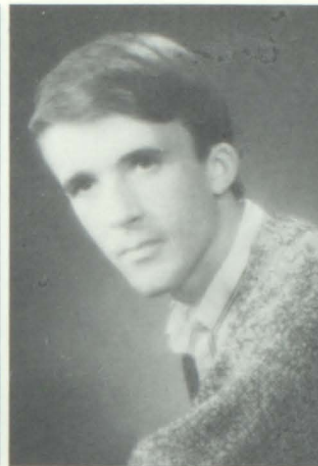
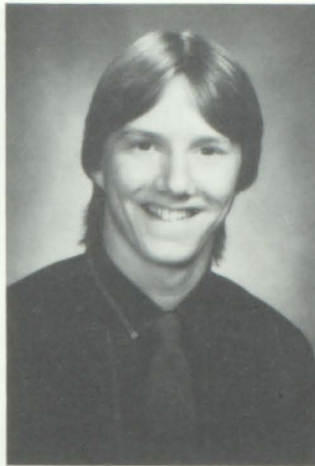
and their parents. Keeping grades up and working hard was again the definite answer. "You know you're a senior when the word leisure vanishes from

your vocabulary."

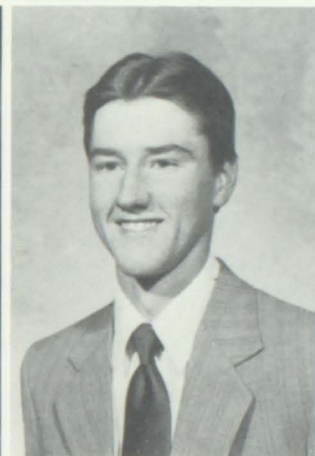
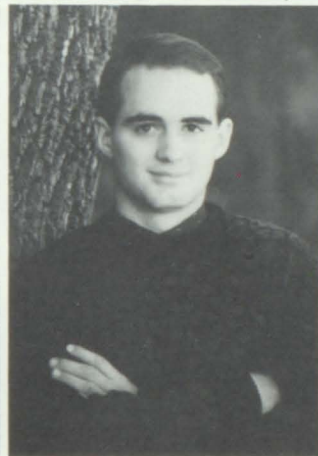
The year may have seemed chaotic, hectic and rushed, rushed, rushed, but "a high school diploma is worth it."

"It's always a rush to get homework done, a rush to get to practice, and a rush to get home so you can go to bed and start all over again."

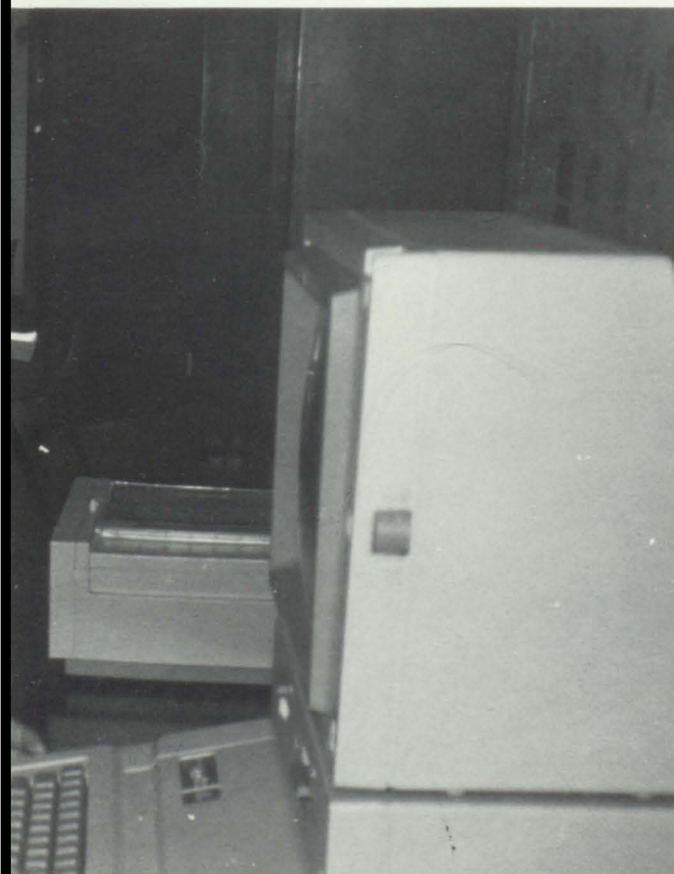

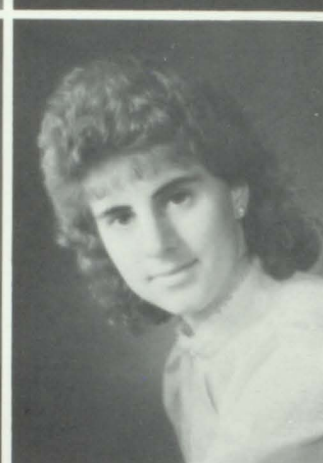
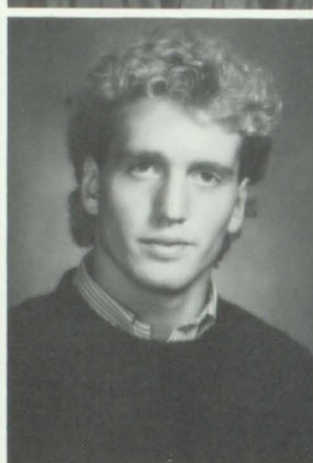
Getting a few Zs and cramming for a physics test, Dan Henderson and Troy Schon use their lunch period for something other than eating.

Graduation was a mixture both of a joyous and a sorrowful period of time. Seniors walked away with a diploma as a foundation to

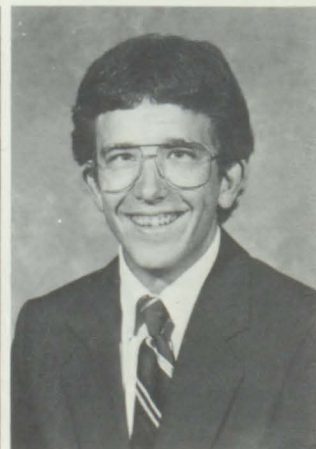
build their future on. But they were also left with only memories of the friends and the good times they cherished so much.

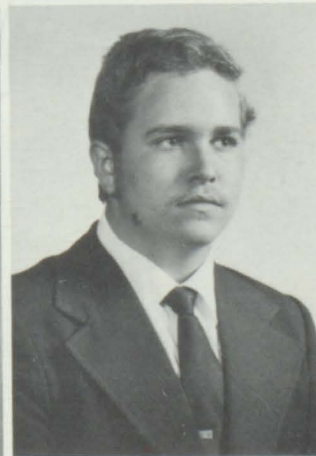


Taking a less than serious approach, Stacey Schwahn and Tammy Borer assist Linda Anderson in preparing for her mock wedding.
