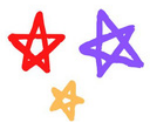

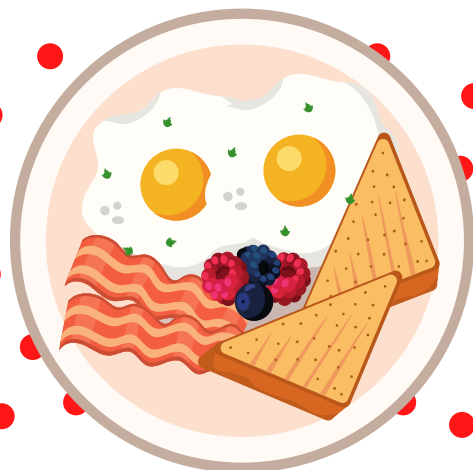

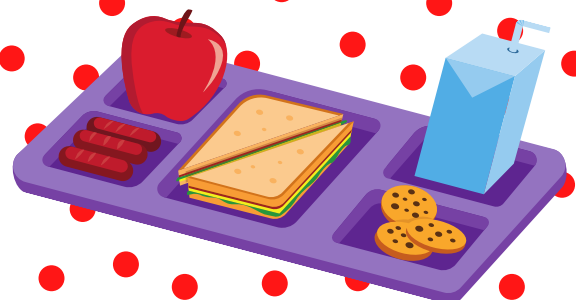

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

****Student Attendance will again be a point of emphasis this year at both the Elementary & Secondary. ****
Please note the handbook excerpt below:

When a student receives 5 absences or the hourly equivalent during the school year 1st Quarter, the Principal may will send written notification and make contact with the students parents of the student's total absences to the student's parent or guardian. During second through fourth quarters, when a student's receives 10 absences absences are equal or greater than 10% of the school days in session to date or the the hourly equivalent, the Principal may will send written notification and will make contact with the parents. of the student's total absences to the student's parent or guardian and shall schedule a meeting with relevant stakeholders to discuss and address any barriers to the student's attendance, unless the Principal determines that such a meeting would not be productive in facilitating the student's regular attendance.

When a student receives 5 absences or the hourly equivalent 1st Quarter, the Principal will send written notification and make contact with the student's parents or guardian. During second through fourth quarters, when a student's absences are equal or greater than 10% of total school days in session to date or the hourly equivalent, the Principal will send written notification and will make contact with the parents.

When a student is absent more than 15 days per year or the hourly equivalent, the Attendance Officer may file a report with the county attorney of the county in which the student resides. For example, if the student accumulates 18 days of excused absences due to documented illness, the Principal may file a report with the appropriate county attorney.

If it is determined that a student is on track to be identified as chronically absent (miss 10% of the school year), the student may risk (at the principal's discretion) participation in a variety of extracurricular activities, including field trips, field day, prom, homecoming dance or other special events.

CELL PHONE POLICY REMINDER:

Students Grades 5th-12th:

Student cell phones will be stored in separate caddies inside the classroom, during each class period.

Phones will remain in their caddies during lunch.



ACTIVITY FEE

Students in grade 7-12 who participate in any extracurricular activity will be required to pay a \$25 activity fee.

From the student handbook:

The Student Activity Fee is established to support the wide range of co-curricular and extracurricular opportunities available to students at Pleasanton Public Schools. These include, but are not limited to, athletics, fine arts, academic clubs, student organizations, and school-sponsored events. Fees help cover costs associated with transportation, officials, entry fees, equipment, and other essential activity expenses.



PASS (Pleasanton After-School Support Session) Program:

Any student who has missing assignments to make up will be required to attend the PASS Program after school on the last day of each week (with the exception of those days preceding holiday breaks and times determined by the administration) until all missing assignments have been completed. This will be an after school study hall monitored by the teacher(s) of the class(es) the student has the missing work in for students to make up or redo assignments, quizzes, and tests.

If a student is assigned to PASS but he or she has an excused absence or is absent due to an activity, he or she will have to turn in the missing assignment no later than the next day the student is in school or will have to serve PASS on that day. Additionally, if the teacher of the class the student is missing work in is absent, the student will have to turn in his or her work or serve PASS with that teacher when he or she is back at school. If a student fails to attend or skips PASS they may miss extra curricular activities and be assigned other consequences to make up their time.

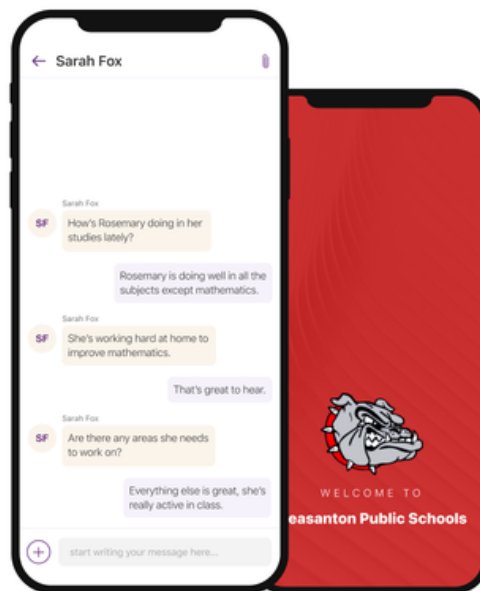

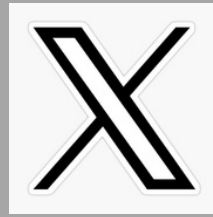
