Angela McKenzie, 639 W. Linden Dr., addressed the Council regarding fireworks and the effects they have on the elderly, people with PTSD and animals asking Council for more order and control during the week fireworks are allowed to be discharged.

Kailan Weidner, 13025 SW 47th Street, addressed the Council regarding police use of force policies requesting they be updated stating the current ones are dated 2003. He stated with all that's happening in the nation, research shows that less restrictive force policies benefits citizens as well as police officers and requested the City revisit its policies.

City Manager Rooney introduced *Police Chief Groseclose* who swore in Reserve Police Officers, Officer Erika Jaquez and Officer Ben Trujillo.

a. City Council Reports

Mayor Schweinberg asked the Councilmembers if they had anything to report in their respective Wards:

Councilman Sholund stated he had received emails regarding facemask requirements stating not so much questions, but opinions.

Councilman McKenzie stated he had a conversation with Lighthouse Baptist Church regarding drainage issues and the possibility of a new parking lot stating he would be discussing it with the City Manager or Assistant City Manager.

Councilman Jones stated it was an honor to be present for the swearing in of new Police Officers and wished them well. He stated there had been a little bit of a dog problem stating the City Manager and *Community Development Director Helsel* helped resolve the problem.

Vice Mayor Grider stated it had been quiet in his ward. He also stated he was thankful to live in a city being smart and wise regarding the pandemic, but also allowing citizens personal freedom.

Councilman Teeples stated he enjoyed the training earlier by Bill Tackett and David Weatherford from OMAG. He also thanked LifeChurch for picking up trash in the City parks after July 4th even though they did not have a firework stand, stating this was community commitment. He requested at the next Work Session, fireworks sales and discharge be added to the agenda.

Councilman Ray stated he received calls praising clean up after July 4th stating he received a lot of great pictures and reports. He also stated he loved the freedom of this City.

Mayor Schweinberg stated the OMAG training was good and praised *City Manager Rooney* for all his work and efforts he puts into the City, especially here recently. He congratulated the Police Officers sworn in this evening stating it was great to see, especially at a time like this in our nation. He stated he receives emails and phone calls regarding fireworks every year from people both for and against them stating it is evaluated yearly. He stated there are far more people who contact him who are for fireworks than against, stating about 100 to 1.

H. DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Discussion, Consideration and Possible Action regarding Resolution No. 21-002, A Resolution Authorizing Participation in the OMAG Recognition Program.

City Manager Rooney stated the Resolution states the City has met the requirements of the OMAG Recognition Program stating the City would receive an award of approximately \$8,300 from OMAG which is based on a percentage of the City's liability premium.

2. Discussion, Consideration and Possible Action regarding Resolution No. 21-003, a Resolution of the City of Mustang, Oklahoma, Approving the Attached Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Municipal Court Jurisdiction Concerning Juveniles, Authorizing the City of Mustang to Enter into Said Agreement and Directing the Mayor and City Staff to Execute the Same; Authorizing and Directing the Finance Director to Establish a Restricted Account as Required by Such Interlocal Agreement and Oklahoma Law.

City Attorney Miller stated the City renews annually the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Municipal Court Jurisdiction concerning Juveniles with the Canadian County District Court stating it allows the City to assume jurisdiction of certain specified juvenile misdemeanor offenders and sets up a restricted fund.

3. Discussion, Consideration and Possible Action to Set Hearing Date on Ordinance No. 1207, an Ordinance of the City of Mustang, Oklahoma, Vacating and Closing a portion of Snyder Street between Block Sixteen (16) and Block Seventeen (17) in Mustang O.T. (Old Town), an Addition to the City of Mustang, Oklahoma, as more particularly described in the Ordinance; Declaring Repealer; Providing for Severability; and Declaring an Emergency

Community Development Director Helsel stated the applicant, Dr. Kevin Green, owner of the property at 1201 S. Snyder Drive, submitted an application to vacate a 60 foot street right of way at the end of S. Snyder Drive. She stated a public hearing notice for the vacation will be sent to all property owners within 300 feet and all utility franchisees within the City. **Helsel** stated the public hearing must be held at least 30 days after the first reading of the ordinance and recommends the Public Hearing be placed on the September 1, 2020 City Council agenda. She then read the Ordinance aloud as required for the First Reading.

- *4. Discussion, Consideration and Possible Action regarding Change Order #3 for Project labeled Mustang Animal Welfare Center.

Police Chief Groseclose provided the changes requested to the Mustang Animal Welfare Center contract stating the additional \$3,298 would be taken out of the \$50,000 contingency.

- *5. Discussion, Consideration, and Possible Action regarding Renewal of Contract for Maintenance and Operations of Public Streets and Mowing and Maintenance of Public Parks and Facilities with Silver Star Construction Company.

City Manager Rooney stated the City went into this Contract with Silver Star Construction Company in 2012 stating the Contract was for a minimum of 4 years and 11 months with the option by the City and Contractor for additional one year terms up to a maximum of five annual extensions. He stated this would be the third extension stating the Contract reflects a 1.5 Consumer Price Index increase based off the Southwest CPI published by the Department of Labor.

6. Discussion, Consideration, and Possible Action regarding the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of Mustang and IAFF Local 4383 for FY 2020-21.

City Manager Rooney stated the City had been in negotiations with the IAFF starting in February, 2020, but due to the COVID19 pandemic, negotiations were pushed to June in order to have a better understanding of the City's financial position due to the pandemic as well as to be able to meet in person. He provided the changes to the current Agreement stating it was a one year Agreement as requested by the City. He stated the financial impact would be approximately \$15,000. **Rooney** introduced the IAFF negotiation team and praised them for their hard work and understanding.

MOTION was made by **Vice Mayor Grider**, seconded by **Councilman McKenzie**, to Approve the Collective Bargaining Agreement.
