The Community: Oak Hill High School serves the towns of Litchfield, Sabattus, and Wales. The three towns have a combined population of 10,100 and are located between the cities of Lewiston and Gardiner. The area is primarily rural and agricultural. Employment opportunities are largely based in Lewiston/Auburn, Augusta, Portland, and Bath/Brunswick.

The School: Approximately 100 courses from 7 departments are offered to meet the needs of our student population. Oak Hill Alternative Education, with an enrollment of 30, provides students with an option of pursuing a diploma through an alternative pathway. Oak Hill is a sending school to Lewiston Regional Technical Center, where juniors and seniors can receive either one or two years of career and technical training in a variety of areas. Approximately 20% of all juniors and seniors are enrolled at LRTC.

Graduation Requirements: 24 course credits required for graduation and 10 hours of community service.

Scheduling: Oak Hill operates on an eight period 80 minute block schedule rotating every other day. There are two semesters that are 18 weeks each. Seniors are required to take a minimum of 5 classes/credits and underclassmen are required to take a minimum of 6 classes/credits each year.

Grading system: The RSU #4 "4 Point Scale" is used to score student proficiency on all formative and summative assessments.

- Students must earn a 3.0 to receive credit in English, math, science and social studies courses and must earn a 2.5 to receive credit in all other subject areas.
- Credit is awarded for passed courses at the end of each semester. Grades are not averaged between semesters for any continuing subject.
- In order to simplify our grading, our GPA system aligns with grades students are earning in the classroom. Grades and GPAs are reported on a 4.0 scale and overall student GPAs are a calculation of the earned course score from each semester.
- Beginning in the 2022-23 school year, a weighted grade system was adopted for Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses - these courses are weighted with a factor of 1.10
- Class rank is not reported, however percentiles may be reported if requested.

Advanced Placement Course Offerings (varies by year):

Students have the option of enrolling in AP4Me courses through the University of Maine at Presque Isle for AP courses not offered at Oak Hill.
