Sanitation Updates

Labeling of Extra Trash Cans:

One of the many benefits to living in Cammack is the twice per week trash pickup. Republic will continue to offer this service, but with one small change. Starting in August, please do not label another can “trash”. Example, do not use your recycling bin for extra trash and label it “trash”. **All trash needs to be placed in the TRASH BIN (blue or black top) only.** Residents can still use other bins for extra recycling or yard waste, but it must be labeled appropriately. This change only applies to TRASH pickup. If you would like an additional trash bin, there is a new request form on the City’s website:

cammackvillage.org > Resident Information > Sanitation > Sanitation Request Form

Bulk Pickup: To get on the bulk pickup list, call City Hall BEFORE placing items on the curb. City Hall will give you the next pickup date available for you to then place items on the curb. More information on bulk pickup can be found on the City’s website.

Crime report: I am here with great news! Comparing January to June 2025 vs. 2026, we have no crimes reported this year! By this time last year, Cammack had numerous car burglaries. My gratitude to our officers who constantly patrol the streets of Cammack to deter criminals.

Officer Updates: We recently wished Officer Parker the best as he took another job to better fit his family’s schedule, but have already filled his spot with Officer Joshua Gardner. Officer Gardner brings more than 20 years of experience in law enforcement, with extensive expertise in criminal investigations, community-oriented policing, patrol operations, instructor development, and public safety. Previously at the County Sheriff’s Office, he worked as both a Deputy Sheriff and Field Training Officer, mentoring new deputies while conducting patrol operations, investigating criminal incidents, collecting evidence, and fostering strong relationships within the community. Pulaski County Property Assessments

Pulaski County recently mailed the property assessments to residents. The deadline to initiate an appeal of real/personal property value to the Pulaski County Board of Equalization is Monday August 17, 2026. Arkansas statutes provide that any appeal to a board of equalization must be initiated by the third Monday in August for the appropriate tax year. Appeals by phone or email will be accepted from mid-July to the end of business on that third Monday in August. Appeals by mail must be postmarked by the third Monday. If appealing 5 or more parcels, you must schedule them by email.
