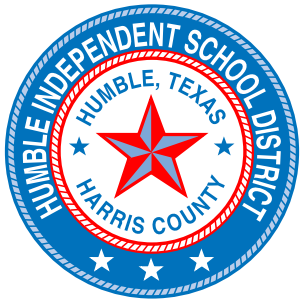

Welcome from Our School Board President

Teachers, students, parents, and staff are all getting ready for the 2026-2027 school year.

Being married to a teacher and having a daughter entering her senior year makes me acutely aware of everything involved in transitioning out of summer vacation. As we prepare for another school year, it's worth taking stock of where Humble ISD has been and where we're headed. I'd like to highlight three important areas where we're continuing to move forward.

School Safety

Since the tragic events in Uvalde in 2022, improving campus security has been a statewide concern. Humble ISD is no exception. For me, that commitment is also deeply personal.

After my service in the U.S. Air Force, I began a second career as a commercial airline pilot with United Airlines. On one of my first flights, I remember sitting in the cockpit before departure. A veteran pilot with decades of experience looked over at me, made eye contact, and asked, "You doing okay?" I told him I was. He nodded and said something I've never forgotten: "Remember, if we're not safe, we're nothing."

Those words continue to guide my approach to leadership and service. They are also a reminder that providing a safe environment is the foundation for everything we hope to accomplish in our schools.

With that philosophy in mind, we've implemented several recent initiatives to further strengthen school safety:

Evolve Security System: We have installed the Evolve security system in our high schools and are installing them in our middle schools. This system helps prevent unauthorized weapons from entering our campuses.

Enhanced Campus Signage: To deter active shooters, we added signs declaring our determination to defend our students.

Marshal Program: To provide an additional layer of campus security, we have initiated a pilot Marshal program. This program utilizes volunteer staff members and teachers who are trained to respond to an active shooter.

Judging by the number of employees attending orientation sessions, there is strong interest in the program. Strong school safety is built through multiple layers of preparation and protection. These recent initiatives reflect our continued commitment to providing students and staff with the safest learning environment possible.

Academic Achievement

Beginning in 2017, Humble ISD experienced a decline in academic performance that affected students across every demographic group. The academic decline was driven by two factors: insufficient attention to declining STAAR performance and a reduced emphasis on teaching fundamental skills.

We are turning that trend around.

Under Superintendent Dr. Roger Brown's leadership, efforts have intensified to ensure teachers focus on the fundamental skills outlined in the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). A key part of this effort has been giving our teachers the time and resources they need to focus on instruction by reducing distractions and strengthening classroom support. An important part of this effort has been adopting the teacher-endorsed, TEA-approved Bluebonnet

Math and Houghton Mifflin Harcourt (HMH) Reading and Language Arts curricula. Both are fully aligned with TEKS.

Simply put, we're getting back to basics.

Early indications suggest these changes are already having a positive impact on student academic proficiency

Junior ROTC

Many of you know that I have a military background. I graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy and subsequently served as an F-15 pilot and T-38 instructor in the U.S. Air Force. For that reason, upon taking being elected to the School Board in 2023, I took a strong interest in highlighting the Junior ROTC program led by its leadership team of veterans, known as the Cadre.

I am particularly proud of the Veterans Day Workout With a Vet event, which began in 2024. It gives students, parents, and staff the opportunity to interact with our cadets as well as local military personnel.

Also, the JROTCs have recently created the Commander's Cup event where our five high schools compete against one another in different training skill events.

I encourage all students to consider joining this community. It develops teamwork, goal setting, problem-solving, character, and leadership while fostering lasting friendships and a strong sense of belonging.

Our eager group of amazingly talented Cadre love working with our students.

I would also note that joining Junior ROTC does not imply or require any military commitment after high school.

Looking Ahead

As we begin another school year, we can all look forward to safer campuses, stronger classrooms, and a Junior ROTC program that continues to grow in visibility and appreciation.

As a longtime airline pilot, I can confidently say all systems are go, our navigation is set, and we're clearly headed in the right direction.

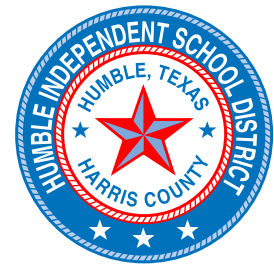
Marques Holmes, Member

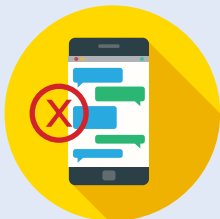

5 THINGS TO KNOW FOR THE FIRST WEEK OF SCHOOL



1 Personal Devices Stay Put Away

Students cannot use personal devices during the school day under state law. Parents contact the front office for urgent messages.



2 Bus Routes Are Still Adjusting

Bus schedules may run a little early or late as routes settle into routine. We recommend checking your route information daily during the first couple of weeks.



3 Help Keep Everyone Safe

School zones will be busy. Please follow staff directions, drive cautiously, and use designated crosswalks to keep all students safe.



4 Plan for Extra Traffic

The first week always brings heavier traffic. Drop-off and pick-up lines will take longer than usual, especially on day one—please allow extra time and be patient.



5 Attendance Matters

When students stay in school until 10 a.m. (Elementary) and 10:40 a.m. (Middle and High School), it ensures the school receives FULL FUNDING for the day!

FREE/REDUCED LUNCH INFO

The National School Lunch Program, administered by Humble ISD Child Nutrition Services, provides free and reduced-price meals to students who meet eligibility guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced-price meals. For the 2026-2027 school year, families approved for reduced-price meals will not be required to pay the usual \$0.40 per meal, as this cost will be covered by the state.

- Once you are registered, your initial screen will prompt you to add students to your SchoolCafé account. This process helps us identify those students within your household so that we can quickly and accurately identify them for applying.
- Once your children are added to your account, navigate to Eligibility Benefits and click Apply.

FREE/REDUCED LUNCH FACTS

- Households must **reapply annually** after July 1st, in order to be eligible for free or reduced priced meals.
- Students who receive free/reduced price meals during the current school year qualify for those benefits the **First 30 School Days** of the following year in August.
- Any student who does not have a new application processed by **September 23** will automatically be changed to full pay starting on September 24.

SAFETY MATTERS

iHELP: A Safety Resource for Humble ISD

Students, staff, and parents in Humble ISD can use iHELP, a mobile app and web tool, to anonymously report safety, social, or emotional concerns and get help quickly.

Monitored 24/7, iHELP connects students to caring adults and provides emotional support, especially for those who may hesitate to ask for help in person. Users can attach photos, videos, or audio and engage in two-way conversations with a real person.

The ability to report anonymously often encourages students to share more than they would face-to-face, helping build trust and positive relationships on campus.

Evolv Detection Systems Humble ISD Enhances Safety

Humble ISD continues to enhance safety measures to support safe and secure environments for students, staff, and visitors.

In 2026-2027, all Humble ISD middle schools will be equipped with the Evolv Weapons Detection System. The system was first introduced at Turner Stadium in Oct. 2024, expanded to all high schools in Spring 2025, and installed at the Board, Business and Technology Center in Spring 2026. Unlike traditional metal detectors, Evolv screens for weapons with minimal disruption, helping daily routines continue smoothly. Evolv meets all government safety standards and uses low-frequency radio waves that are safe for everyone, including pregnant individuals and infants.



Centegix Safety Platform Enhances Emergency Response

In the 2025-2026 school year, every Humble ISD teacher and staff member received a Centegix badge. This was a part of Humble ISD's Department of Emergency Management and Safety's launch of the Centegix Safety Platform across all campuses and departments.

The system includes a simple, wearable panic button that lets any staff member report an emergency instantly. Pressing the button discreetly alerts responders from anywhere on campus or district property.

With real-time alerts, dynamic digital maps, and precise location tracking, Centegix ensures a rapid, targeted response from on-site emergency teams. This platform is part of Humble ISD's continued commitment to a safe, supportive environment for all students and staff.



Humble ISD Police Department Spotlight

The Humble ISD Police Department hosts an annual community event through the National Night Out initiative. National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie.

The Humble ISD Police National Night Out event includes activities such as police department and vehicle tours, face painting, bingo, live music and more for the entire family.

This is an incredible opportunity for Humble ISD Police Officers to further connect with the community that they protect every single day.

Technology Services works behind the scenes so students continue to have technology they need to learn, create and succeed

One year ago, Humble ISD faced a challenge. A new state law prohibited students from bringing personal communication devices to school - including devices that some students had been using in their classes.

To address this challenge, the Humble ISD School Board approved a significant investment in new devices. Specifically, \$2 million was allocated to replace and update Career and Technical Education (CTE) devices in more than 50 classrooms. An additional \$1 million was utilized to fund more than 2,000 new Chromebooks and more than 70 carts.

Every campus now maintains at least 85 devices per 100 students. Because students do not require devices in every class—such as PE or athletics—this investment ensured the district met student needs in a fiscally-responsible way. Twenty-seven campuses have already achieved a one-to-one ratio through additional campus or Title I funding.

Providing devices was only part of the challenge. Humble ISD also is making significant investments in the technology infrastructure that supports student learning. Recent improvements include:



- Upgraded wireless networks using next-generation Wi-Fi 7 technology.
- Improved internet reliability through diverse network pathways and enhanced failover capabilities.
- Fiber network upgrades at campuses across the district.
- Increased network security and monitoring.

Although students can no longer use personal communication devices during the school day, Humble ISD has taken proactive steps to ensure students still have access to the technology necessary for academic success.

Why were there no major network outages in 2025-2026?

Humble ISD added resilience to the network, allowing Technology Services to reroute traffic through alternative fiber lines if one is cut. Outages can be caused by falling tree branches, road construction, traffic accidents and more. The district does not have control over these factors. Utility and telecommunications providers can take from one hour to several days to restore service. However, having resilience meant there were no major network outages during the past school year. When computers were down, it was due to electricity outages and not a major network outage.

What's needed for the future?

Federal funding during COVID and Bond 2022 Proposition B infused the district with technology. Laptops for staff, Chromebooks for students, and interactive display screens for classrooms were purchased. However, as devices age, funding will be needed for replacements. Devices must be kept up to date for security software to be effective.

The curriculum covers topics such as leadership, ethics, civics, history, and health and wellness. There is no requirement to enlist in the military following high school to participate in a JROTC program.

More than 485,000 students nationally were enrolled in 3,475 JROTC units in 2025.



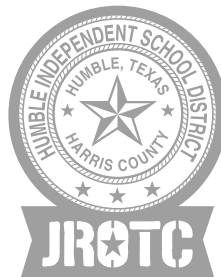

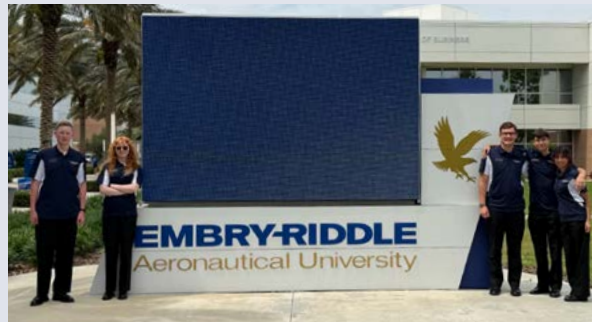

A small processing fee (ranging from \$1-\$2) will be attached to each ticket purchase. The processing fee is subject to change as that rate is set by Hometown Ticketing.

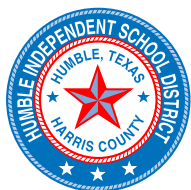

In the 2025-2026 school year, Humble ISD rose to the top in the State of Texas across numerous UIL Academic and Athletic Contests, TMEA Selections and State VASE Competitions, securing gold medals and State Titles.



Kingwood Girls Soccer

Kingwood High School girls soccer won the third State Championship in program history after defeating Forney 2-1 (4-2 in penalty kicks) in the Class 6A Division II State Championship match in April. This was the program's first title since 1999. The Lady Mustangs finished the season undefeated with a record of 27-0-2. Kingwood High School senior Tyler Weaver was named the State Championship Game MVP. Kingwood is coached by Adam Bell.

Summer Creek Girls Basketball

Summer Creek High School girls basketball won the program's second-straight Girls Basketball State Championship with a 55-45 victory over Flower Mound in the Class 6A Division I State Championship game in March. They became the first program since DeSoto in 2021 to win back-to-back titles in the UIL's largest classification. Junior Erin Newsom was named State Championship Game MVP. Summer Creek is coached by Kiara Marshall.



Humble Wrestling

Humble High School junior Sean Perez defeated Rockwall Heath's Cody Savage 12-5 to win the Class 6A 190-Pound State Championship during the 2026 UIL Wrestling State Tournament. Perez finished the season with a perfect record of 52-0 and is the first-ever boy to win a UIL Wrestling State Title in Humble ISD history. Humble is coached by Christopher Kimes.



VASE State Champ

Kingwood High School freshman Avery Fitzgerald received the High School State Visual Art Scholastic Event (State VASE) Gold Seal and State Championship honor with her fiber art piece, "Woody." Her teacher is Megan Tchokoev. At the state VASE competition, 165 student artworks are chosen as Gold Seal and State Champions. That is less than 1% of the 35,000+ VASE entries for the 2025-2026 academic year.

TMEA

Fourteen Humble ISD band, choir and orchestra students performed as members of the Texas Music Educators Association All-State Band, Choir and Orchestra, the highest individual honor a Texas high school musician can achieve. Being named to a TMEA All-State performing ensemble is a remarkable accomplishment. Students are selected through an extensive audition process that begins with more than 70,000 musicians statewide. After advancing through all-district, all-region and all-area auditions, only the top students earn the opportunity to perform as members of the TMEA All-State Band, Choir, or Orchestra.

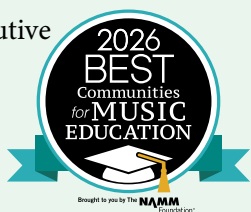

The orchestra, open to students ages 16-19, toured Europe this summer, including stops in Amsterdam, Berlin and Edinburgh, while serving as cultural ambassadors through music.



Kingwood High School's Annie Newton named Texas Young Master, awarded \$10,000 grant

Kingwood High School percussionist Annie Newton has been named a 2026 Butler Texas Young Master by the Texas Cultural Trust, a statewide honor recognizing student artists.

The Butler Texas Young Masters award recognizes students for their exceptional artistic talent in music, theatre, dance, visual arts, literary arts and other art disciplines. She was one of six percussionists selected internationally.

Students are selected based on artistic quality, capability and the impact of the additional studies for the student's development. Each student receives a \$10,000 grant to further their studies in their chosen field.

Hosted annually by Theatre Under The Stars (TUTS), the Tommy Tune Awards celebrate excellence in high school musical theatre across the greater Houston area, recognizing achievement in performance, production and arts education.

Popp received the honor for her role in Kingwood High School's production of The Sound of Music, directed by Camee Faulk. The award is among the program's most prestigious individual recognitions and highlights exceptional vocal talent among student performers.



New Ross Sterling Middle School Takes Shape

Following a groundbreaking celebration this spring, construction is officially underway on the new Ross Sterling Middle School, ushering in an exciting new chapter for the Bearcats. The replacement campus, scheduled to open for the 2027–2028 school year, will provide students with a modern learning environment designed to support collaboration, innovation, and academic success.

The new three-story, 213,734-square-foot campus is being built on a larger site within the Turner Complex, just southeast of the current school. Designed by Kirksey, the architectural firm behind Kingwood Middle School, the campus will feature abundant natural daylight, spacious classrooms, and flexible learning spaces that support today's instructional practices.

For Principal Joshua Dawson, the new campus represents far more than a new building. "I am looking at this as if it's a rebirth—a Renaissance—for our students. It's going to be something new for us. I think it's a new beginning for Ross Sterling."

The groundbreaking ceremony also highlighted the lasting impact Ross Sterling has had on students. Tony Dang, a former Ross Sterling student and the Humble High School Class of 2026 salutatorian, reflected on the significance of the project.

"This moment means a great deal to me because it represents more than just the start of a new building. It represents growth, opportunity and the future being created for students who will walk these halls at Ross Sterling for years to come."

The current building was built in 1972. As construction continues, the new campus symbolizes a bright future—one that honors the school's proud legacy while creating new opportunities for students for decades to come. Satterfield & Pontikes Construction Company is serving as the general contractor on the project.

Mosaic

The Mosaic Program serves students ages 18-22 who received special education services and qualify for educational services after high school to transition to adult life. Previously housed in portable buildings, the Mosaic program now has a permanent home off of Timber Forest Dr. behind the Community Learning Center, thanks to funding approved by voters in Bond 2022.

The new 56,600-square-foot Mosaic building is 2-stories and opened in March 2026. The second floor is office space for special education professionals who serve students at schools throughout the district. The first floor houses the Mosaic program and includes mock apartments, an outdoor learning environment with a garden, several types of classrooms, and a new production lab - all designed to focus on developing and enhancing employability and independent living skills.

New Foster Elementary School Opens August 2026: Bulldogs Return Home

This August, Foster Elementary will open the doors to its brand-new campus, marking the start of an exciting new chapter for generations of Bulldogs.

A major project funded through Humble ISD's Bond 2022 program, the new Foster Elementary campus represents both a celebration of the school's rich history and an investment in its future. Originally opened on January 18, 1971, the school served the community for more than five decades before the original building was demolished in Fall 2024. Construction on the new facility began in April 2025, and this August, Bulldogs will return home to a modern campus designed for 21st century learning.



During the 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 school years, Foster Elementary students and staff were relocated across four elementary campuses while their campus was being rebuilt.

"As we prepare to begin the new school year, I am overwhelmed with gratitude and excitement for what it means to finally bring the Foster family back together under one roof," said Principal Brandy Heckman. "While Bulldogs remained united in spirit, there is something deeply meaningful about being able to share everyday moments together again."

The new Foster Elementary is a two-story, 121,600 square-foot facility designed to inspire learning and collaboration. Among its standout features are abundant natural daylighting, dedicated STEM and technology labs, and a unique 600 square-foot second-floor garden terrace with planters for vegetation.

"Our new building is absolutely beautiful and filled with incredible opportunities for students," Heckman said. "But beyond the physical space

itself, what excites me most is the renewed sense of pride, camaraderie, and connection this building restores to our school community."

Heckman also expressed appreciation for the host campuses - Deerwood, Hidden Hollow, Shadow Forest and Willow Creek elementaries - that supported Foster Elementary students and staff through the transition.

"Displacement across multiple campuses was not easy, but it reminded me of the strength of our district, the resilience of our people, and the importance of community," she said.

As Bulldogs return to their new campus this fall, the building stands as more than just a school - it represents perseverance, partnership and the excitement of finally coming home.

What type of certifications are Humble ISD students attaining?

The majority of certifications earned by Humble ISD students are Tier I and Tier II credentials, which the Texas Education Agency recognizes as having the highest value for students entering high-demand, high-wage careers directly after graduation. These certifications provide benefits that extend beyond immediate workforce entry. Many students use their credentials to strengthen college applications, secure apprenticeships, or pursue advanced training opportunities that can significantly influence their future career paths. As more students earn industry-recognized certifications, our community benefits from a larger pool of

skilled, work-ready graduates who can meet the workforce needs of local businesses and industries.

What is Humble ISD doing to ensure we give our students the best competitive advantage in an ever-changing career landscape through IBCs?

Each year, CTE Coordinators lead career cluster meetings with teachers from across the district to evaluate Industry-Based Certifications and ensure they are aligned with current labor market demands and workforce opportunities. These discussions empower our teachers, who are closest to the students and industry expectations, to help determine which certifications will provide the greatest value for our students.

By continuously refining our programs, strengthening industry alignment, and using student performance data to guide decision-making, we are positioning Humble ISD to continue increasing the number of Industry-Based Certifications earned each year while maintaining a focus on quality and student success.

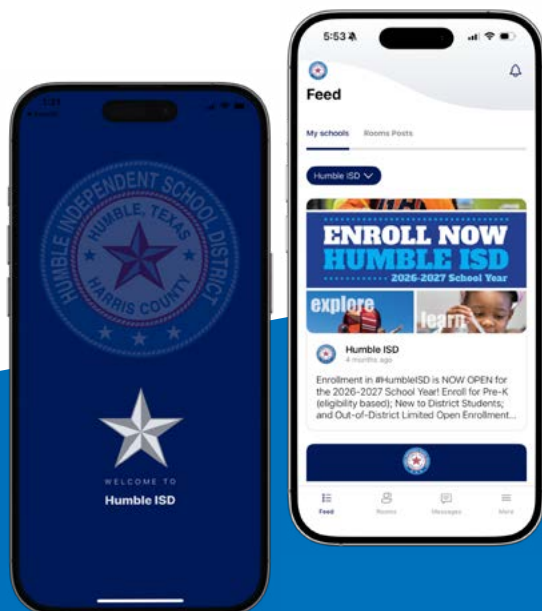

All immunization records must be validated with the healthcare provider's signature/stamp.

Incoming 7th grade students are required to receive Tdap and MCV4

Immunization Exemptions:

For students who require medical exemptions, a written statement by a physician should be submitted to the school nurse annually. If the exemption is for reasons of conscience, which includes religious beliefs, visit <https://www.dshs.texas.gov/immunizations/school/exemptions> for instructions. Exemptions for reasons of conscience must be submitted to the school nurse on the original exemption form once completed and must be renewed every 2 years from the date it was notarized.

Required Bus Transportation Registration for the 2026-2027 School Year

Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, parents and guardians of students who are eligible for bus transportation must register their child using the Zūm Transportation Registration Tool before the first day of school. Parents will need their child's student ID number and date of birth to complete the registration.

Once registration is complete, parents will receive a confirmation that their child is registered for eligible bus service for the 2026-2027 school year. Bus route assignments will be available in early August.
