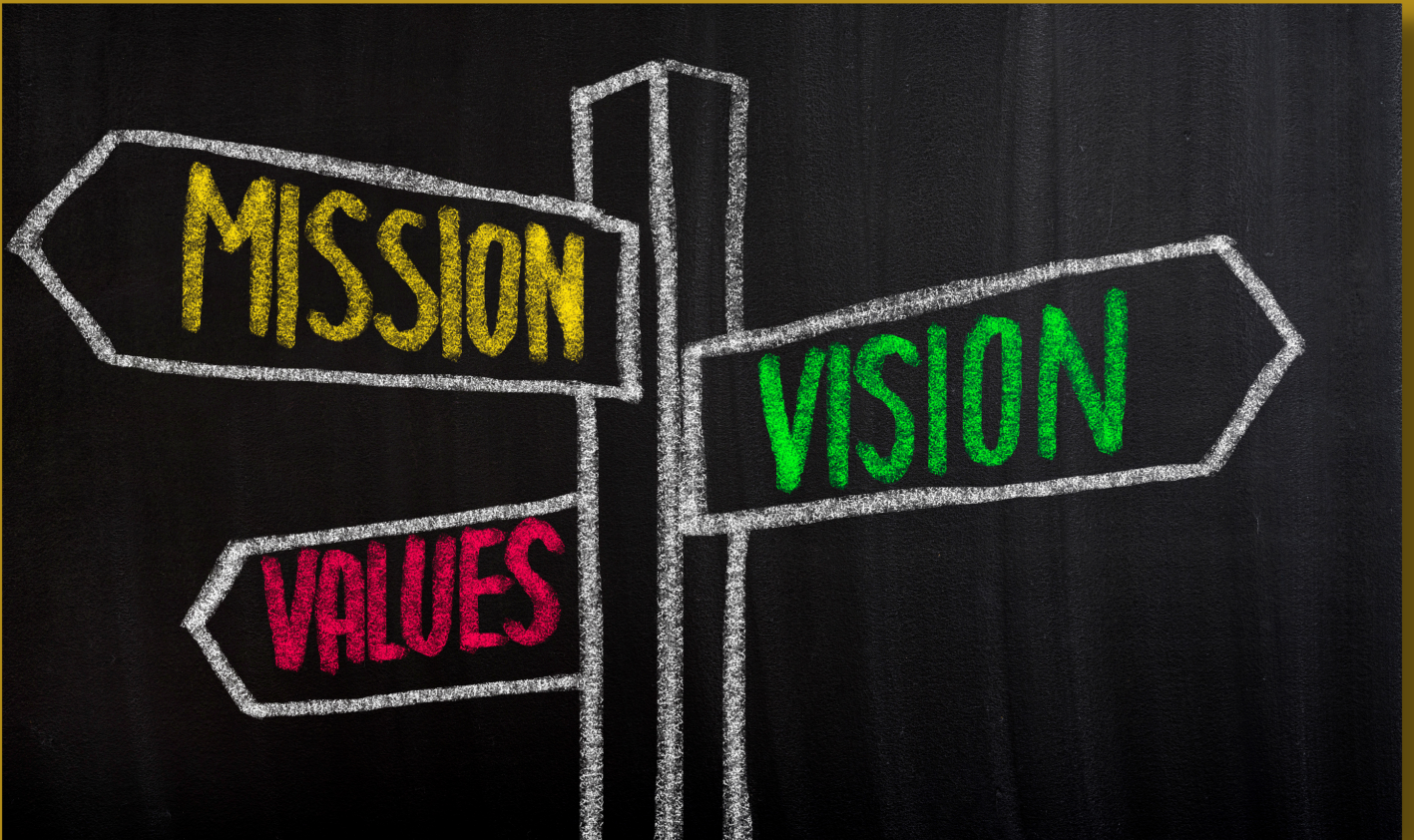


Vision
